RELEVANT LEGISLATION:

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

MOTION: That Council give first reading to Bylaw 20-848 to close 1.05 hectares ± within Road Plan 2761 PX lying west of NW-9-69-21-W5 as shown on Schedule ‘A’ hereto.

MOTION: That Council schedule a Public Hearing on July 27, 2020 for Bylaw No. 20-848 to close 1.05 hectares ± of Road Plan 2761 PX lying west of NW-9-69-21-W5 as shown on Schedule ‘A’ hereto.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

Greenview received a road closure request from Arne and Merle Johnson on February 20, 2020, to close a portion of Road Plan 2761 PX as shown on the attached survey plan labeled Schedule ‘A’, being an area consisting of 1.05 hectares ± (2.59 acres). The area would subsequently be consolidated with the existing title to their agricultural quarter NW-9-69-21-W5 (Certificate of Title 112 369 890+5, cont. 62.67 hectares). The fair market value of the 1.05 hectares ± was calculated by Accurate Assessment at \$2,520.00 and an Offer to Sell would be prepared for signature by Arne and Merle Johnson, the agreement also requiring reimbursement to Greenview of the survey and transfer costs.

In accordance with legislation notification of the proposed road closure was circulated to internal and external referral agencies and no negative concerns or comments were received. Administration feels that the closure does not, or will not in the future, cause undue hardship for the road network in this location with access available to the quarter from Range Road 214. Administration is recommending that Council sell the land to Arne and Merle Johnson as set out above, give First Reading to Bylaw No. 20-848 and establish a Public Hearing date of July 27, 2020 to allow the public to comment in accordance with legislative requirements.

BENEFITS OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The public hearing would be advertised once Council gives approval to recommendation.

DISADVANTAGES OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. There are no perceived disadvantages to the recommended motion.

Alternative #1: Council has the option to deny First Reading until after the Public Hearing has been held.

Greenview would be responsible for the cost to advertise the public hearing, and all costs associated with the survey and transfer will be paid by the landowners.

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF GREENVIEW No. 16

A Bylaw of the Municipal District of Greenview No. 16, in the Province of Alberta, for the purpose of closing to public travel, and creating title to a portion(s) of a public roadway in accordance with Section 22 of the *Municipal Government Act*, Chapter M26.1, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, as amended.

WHEREAS the lands hereafter described are no longer required for public travel; and

WHEREAS application has been made to Council to have the roadway closed; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipal District of Greenview No. 16 deems it expedient to provide a bylaw for the purpose of closing to public travel certain roads, or portions thereof, situated in the said municipality, and therefore disposing of same; and

WHEREAS, notice of the intention of Council to pass a bylaw has been given in accordance with Section 606 of the *Municipal Government Act*; and

WHEREAS, Council was not petitioned for an opportunity to be heard by any person claiming to be prejudicially affected by the bylaw.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Municipal District of Greenview No. 16 in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, does hereby close to public travel for the purpose of creating title to the following described original government road allowance, subject to rights of access granted by other legislation:

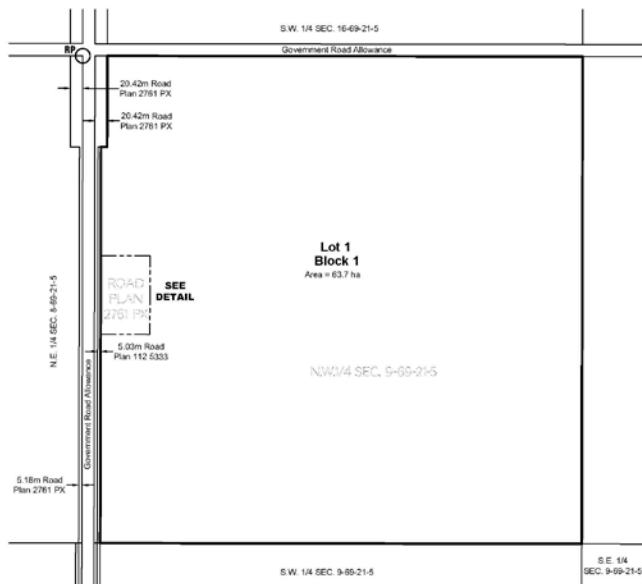
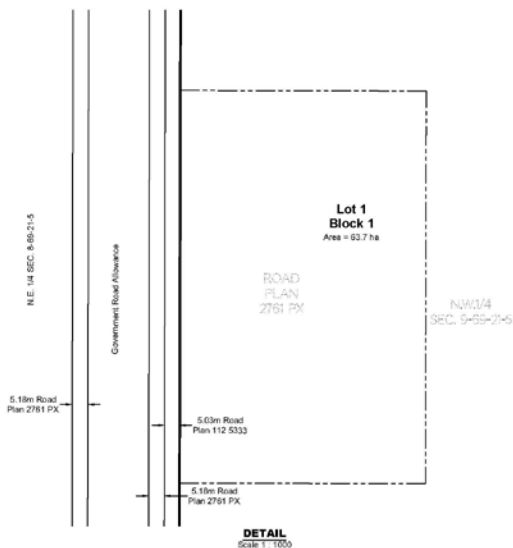

MOTION: That Council approve the sale and consolidation of 1.05 hectare ± within Road Plan 2761 PX lying west of NW-9-69-21-W5 as shown on Schedule ‘A’ hereto, to Arne Sigfred Johnson and Merle Alice Johnson, for a total price of \$2,520.00 plus GST, plus all associated survey and transfer costs, subject to Ministerial approval and third reading of Bylaw 20-848.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

Greenview received a road closure request from Arne and Merle Johnson on February 20, 2020, to close a portion of Road Plan 2761 PX as shown on the attached survey plan labeled Schedule ‘A’, being an area consisting of 1.05 hectares ± (2.59 acres). The area would subsequently be consolidated with the existing title to their agricultural quarter NW-9-69-21-W5 (Certificate of Title 112 369 890+5, cont. 62.67 hectares). The fair market value of the 1.05 hectares ± was calculated by Accurate Assessment at \$2,520.00 and an Offer to Sell would be prepared for signature by Arne and Merle Johnson, the agreement also requiring reimbursement to Greenview of the survey and transfer costs.

In accordance with legislation notification of the proposed road closure was circulated to internal and external referral agencies and no negative concerns or comments were received. Administration feels that the closure does not, or will not in the future, cause undue hardship for the road network in this location with access available to the quarter from Range Road 214. Administration is recommending that Council sell the land to Arne and Merle Johnson as set out above, give First Reading to Bylaw No. 20-848 and establish a Public Hearing date of July 27, 2020 to allow the public to comment in accordance with legislative requirements.

MOTION: That Council approve up to \$10,000 for seed money to initiate and be a member of the advisory committee that will engage Community Energy Association to conduct further studies for placement of Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure within Northwest Alberta, with funds to come from the Economic Development budget.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

In the fall of 2019 Administration began researching Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure within Greenview. Since then a relationship has developed with Community Energy Association (CEA) through Energy Futures workshops.

Energy Futures hosted several events that Greenview Economic Development staff has attended to continue researching the potential Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure initiative. Substantial support of the development of a Northwest Alberta Electric Vehicle Charging Station project that parallels the “Peaks to Prairies” Electric Vehicle Charging project in Southern Alberta. CEA has mapped out a potential draft project that includes 15 charging station locations within Northwest Alberta. Key locations are Barrhead, Drayton Valley, Edson, Entwistle Junction, Fox Creek, Grande Cache, Grande Prairie, Hinton, Jasper, Nordegg, Rocky Mountain House, Saskatchewan River Crossing, Valleyview (Crooked Creek) Westlock and Whitecourt. Further location studies will be required to insure these are prime locations for charging stations.

The creation of an advisory committee is necessary at this time for an agreement with CEA to further conduct studies on these 15 locations. In order to do this, CEA is asking for \$30,000 to conduct location studies and also apply for further funding in multiple different areas for the infrastructure and financial needs.

Administration sees value of Greenview being an early and active member on this advisory committee to ensure the interests of all of Greenview and each draft location that could fall within Greenview.

CEA has experience as the project Manager of “Peaks to Prairies” initiative. This project was able to acquire \$2.2 Million in grants to help fund this Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure project in Southern Alberta and hopes to do the same for this project.

The Town of Edson has taken the initiative to send correspondence, already received by Greenview Council; expressing interest in collaborating and creating an advisory committee. To date Edson has received support from 5 other municipalities.

BENEFITS OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The benefit of Council accepting the recommended motion is that Greenview would take a leadership role in the creation of the Northwest Alberta Electric Vehicle Charging Station board and would be assisting in the creation of this first of kind, collaborative project in Northwest Alberta.
2. The benefit of Council accepting the recommended motion is, this initiative aligns with Greenview’s Council strategic goals of supporting the economic development and tourism opportunities throughout Greenview.
3. The benefit of Council accepting the recommended motion is that Greenview would assist in lowering the carbon footprint within Northwestern Alberta.

DISADVANTAGES OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The potential sites for the location study results to indicate Greenview has limited locations for charging infrastructure.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:

Alternative #1: Council can approve participation at a lower level, however will not have precedence on the advisory committee.

Alternative #2: Council has the alternative to approve, amend or take no action to the recommended motions.

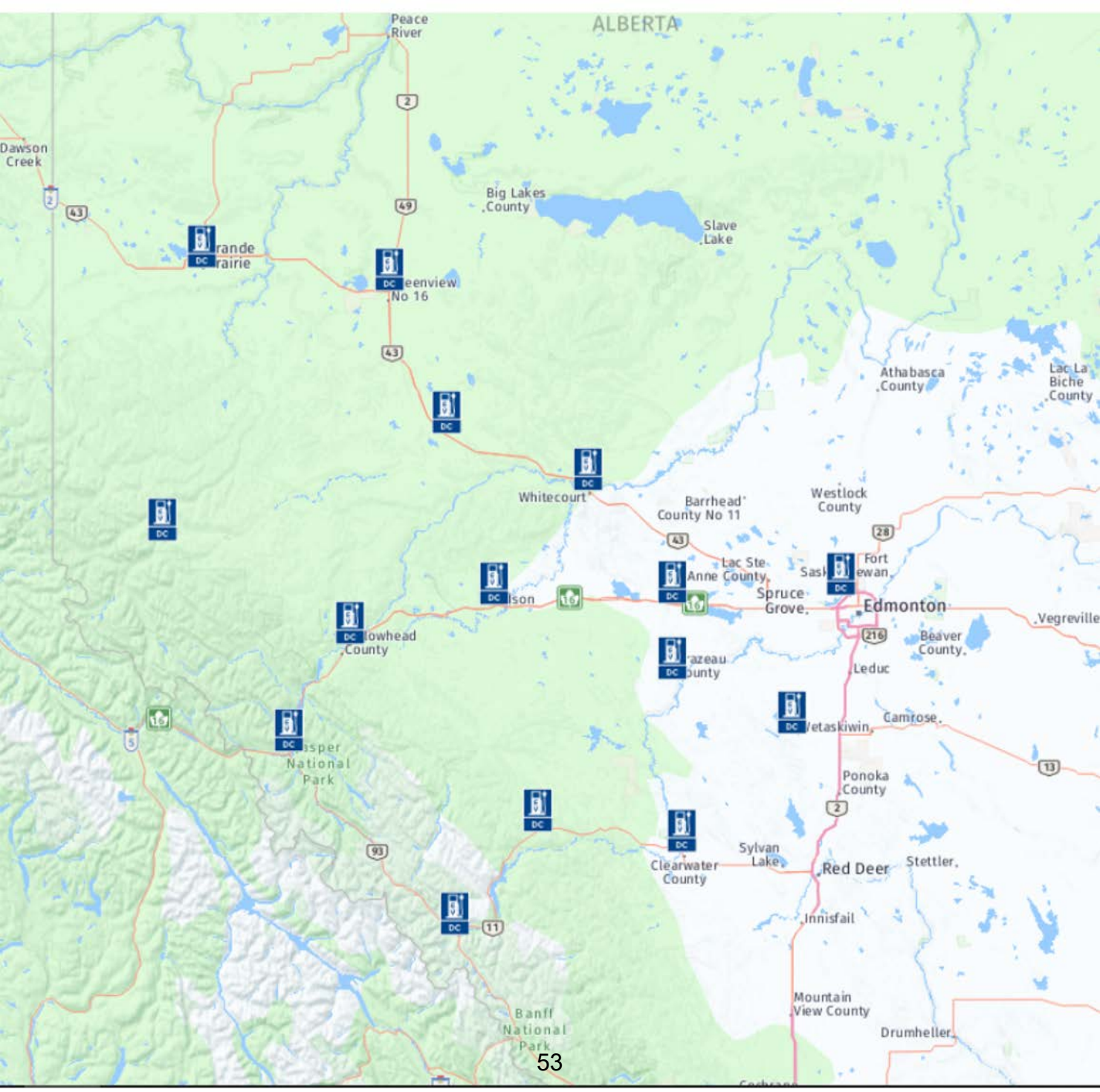

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

As per Motion 19.05.359, Administration has obtained a lease through Alberta Parks for Shuttler Flats Provincial Recreation Area (PRA). This site, located approximately 45 minutes Southwest of Grovedale, has traditionally been operated as a reservation only, group-use campsite.

The site currently features the following infrastructure:

- One fully enclosed shelter with fireplace;
- One half-shelter with woodstove;
- One double outhouse;
- Two parking lots;
- Walk in tent sites;
- Picnic tables;
- Garbage bin;
- A gate at entrance.
- A common fire area.

Administration believes that the current infrastructure of the site is established for group-usage. There is no individual campsites within the park, which would likely encourage conflict between users. Prior to the site operating effectively as a general campground, capital investment into the site would be required. Any improvement to the site will require approval by Alberta Parks. The planned divestment of the site will result in more leeway in regards to improvements in the future.

A community engagement session was held with the residents of Nose creek in August of 2019. Greenview's plan to take on Shuttler Flats PRA was discussed at this time and the residents provided a lot of feedback. An opposition to the site being open to the public in an unregulated manner was very clearly voiced.

Due to the current infrastructure, and stakeholder feedback, administration recommends that the site continue to be operated as a group use site.

BENEFITS OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The benefit of Council accepting the recommended action is that users of the site can continue utilizing the site in the manner they are accustomed to.
2. The benefit of Council accepting the recommended action is that there will be no financial implication outside of the approved operating costs of the site.
3. The benefit of Council accepting the recommended action is that it will help minimize vandalism to the site.

DISADVANTAGES OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The disadvantage of the recommended action of establishing the site as group usage is that users cannot sporadically decide to utilize Shuttler Flats PRA.
2. The disadvantage of the recommended action is that use of the site will be limited to one group of people at a time.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:

Alternative #1: That Council direct Administration to operate Shuttler Flats Provincial Recreation Area as a general campground, open to the public on a first come, first serve basis. This alternative is not recommended, as the current infrastructure of the site is not intended to serve this type of usage. Additionally, this alternative is not recommended as the residents of Nose Creek have voiced opposition to the site being open without restrictions.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATION:

The recommended motion would fall within the currently approved operating budget for Shuttler Flats PRA.

There are no new staffing implications to the recommended motion.

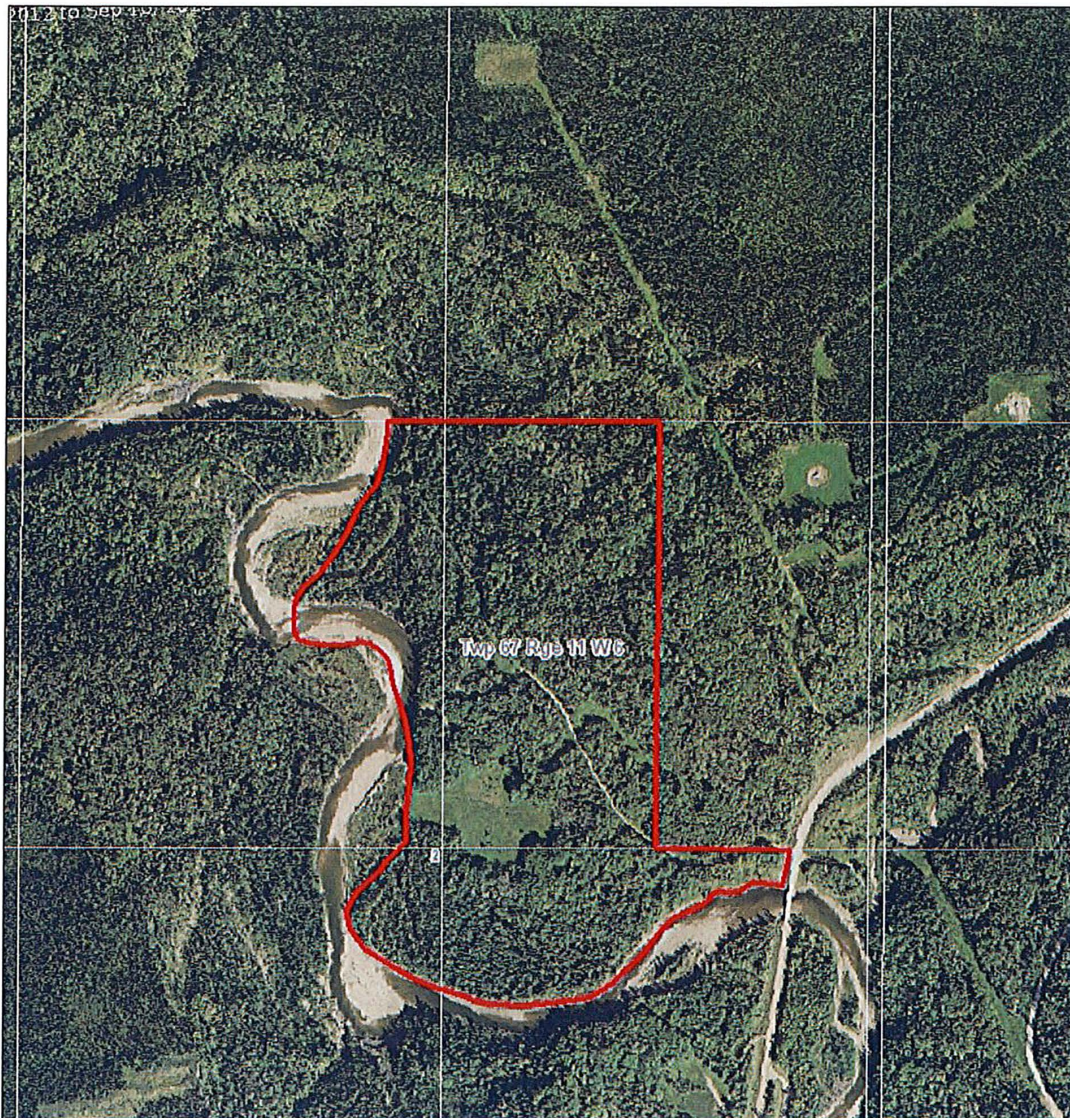

The College, Trades and Apprenticeships College Program Scholarship Policy was created in February of 2020 and superseded CO 18 (Sponsoring for a Veterinary Bursary) and CO 19 (Sponsoring for a Computer Technology Bursary). The Scholarship provides an opportunity for students enrolled in two (2) year college, trades and apprenticeship programs to apply for a \$1,500.00 scholarship. The Scholarships policy defines an eligible student as one who meets the scholarship criteria established in the general principles for selection:

General Principles for selection include the following:

- a. The student is a resident of Greenview;
- b. The student has demonstrated financial need;
- c. The student demonstrates community involvement, volunteering or extra-curricular activities;
- d. Consideration may be given to scholarship recipients from the previous year.

Selection criteria for College Scholarships Applications also include:

- e. The student has participated in a work experience or other work placement program (i.e. RAP, CTS programs, etc.) in High School;
- f. Apprenticeship applicants must be enrolled in a registered apprenticeship program.
- g. Grades are only used as a tie-breaker criteria, but was not utilized with this year's applications.

Selection Criteria for University Applications also include:

- h. The applicants G.P.A. or course average in the last two semesters may be a factor for Council's consideration of the application. A minimum average of 60% will be considered.

Administration reviewed the applications to determine the student's financial need, community involvement, work experience or other work placement program, apprenticeship program, G.P.A. or course average, residency and applicable application status from the previous year. Administration evaluated the student as having a minimum course average of 60% as the indicator. Financial need was based on student loans and whether the student was self-financing.

Some applicants provided additional reference letters and additional anecdotes regarding why they needed or wanted this scholarship.

A scoring matrix was prepared to evaluate the student's applications. The names were removed to provide anonymity and to safeguard the personal information enclosed in the student applications. In accordance with the weight agreed to by Council, for the College scholarships, 40% was based on financial need, 30% on community involvement, and 30% based on work experience programs. For the University Scholarships, 40% based on financial need, 30% on community involvement and 30% on grades.

Administration has prepared a College, Trades and Apprenticeships Scholarship Recommendation Listing based on the applicants that met all the criteria. The 2020 scholarship requests that qualified as per the specifications in this policy presently total \$7,500.00. However, Council has the alternative to revise or add to the listing up to the amount of funds allotted in the Budget (\$15,000.00). If all the College, Trades and Apprenticeships College applicants receive scholarships, the total would be \$13,500.00. Alternatively, Council may consider moving the additional \$7,500.00 to the University, 4 Year College Scholarship for the 2020 calendar year as there were more applications received in this category. It was difficult choosing the top 10 for the \$25,000.00 University, 4 Year College Scholarship, two of the applicants scored the same matrix total of 3.4, the application with recommendation letters was the one selected to break the tie. The additional \$7,500.00 would provide 3 of the 4 qualifying applicants with scholarships, however there would be one remaining. Council does have the option to access additional funds from the allotted budget as an additional \$10,000.00 is included in the budget over an above the amounts specified for the two policies (\$15,000.00 and \$25,000.00). The allotted 2020 Budget amount is \$50,000.00.

BENEFITS OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The benefit of Council accepting the recommended motion is that Council will disperse the 2020 Scholarships fund to the applicants that met the established Scholarship criteria.

DISADVANTAGES OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. There are no perceived disadvantages to the recommended motion.

Alternative #1: Council has the alternative to add to the listing up to the amount allotted in the budget.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

The Tax Recovery process is the last resort mechanism Municipalities use to collect outstanding property taxes and is a strictly legislated process. When property taxes remain unpaid for more than one year, a Tax Notification Caveat is placed on the Land Title and notification is sent to the land owner and other interested parties as shown on the title advising them of the Caveat. If the property tax arrears remain unpaid on March 31st of the following year, the Municipality may sell the property by Public Auction. The municipality has one year from April 1st to place the parcel for sale by public auction.

Council is required to set a reserve bit that is as close as reasonably possible to the market value of the parcel. Administration requested an “Opinion of Value”, from Accurate Assessment Group Ltd. & Power’s & Associates. Copies of the “Opinion of Value” are attached for Council’s information.

After Council has made the decision to proceed with selling the property by Public Auction, a notice is sent to the property owner(s) advising them of the Public Auction date and the amount of outstanding property taxes that must be paid prior to the start of the auction, to stop the sale of their property by Public Auction. If the outstanding arrears are not paid, the Public Auction proceeds.

If any property is sold by Public Auction, the municipality is permitted to charge an administration fee of 5% of the sale price to the tax roll. This amount plus the tax arrears and advertising costs are collected from the sale price. The remaining balance may be paid to the previous land owner if the Municipality is satisfied there are no debts secured by an encumbrance on the Title. If the Municipality is not satisfied that there are no other debts that are secured by an encumbrance on Title, the municipality must notify the previous owner that an application may be made under section 428(1) to recover all or part of the money.

BENEFITS OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

- 1. A benefit of the recommended action is that the required advertising deadline will be met and the Public Auction will go ahead as planned.
- 2. Another benefit of the recommended action is that Administration will have received Council’s direction on how to proceed regarding the value to be placed on the properties.

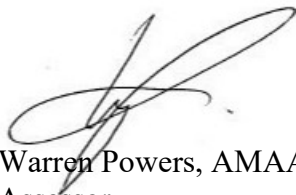

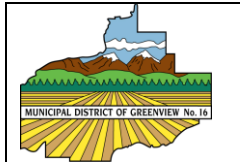

PURPOSE:

To establish guidelines on how tax forfeited lands will be sold or made available for taxation again.

POLICY:

The M.D. has established a method in which Council can introduce tax forfeited land to the marketplace.

1. No parcel will be removed from the Tax Sale List unless all taxes, penalties and costs incurred by the M.D. in the Tax Recovery Process are paid prior to the sale.
2. In accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Government Act, Chapter M-26.1, the M.D. may become the owner of any land that is offered, but not sold, at the Tax Recovery Sale.
3. If the M.D. exercises its option to become the owner of the land, the M.D. will not sell the property until one year after the date of the Tax Recovery Auction unless the prospective buyer meets the reserve bid price set at the original sale.
4. If, in the opinion of Council, the sale of tax forfeited land will cause hardship to an existing occupant, the Council may lease all or a portion of the parcel to the occupant so long as the revenue generated exceeds what would be generated by taxation, so as to make partial payment on arrears.
5. The amount of lease fees will be set by Council, and the occupant is not permitted to assign or sub-let his/her interest in the parcel.
6. Council will adopt a reserve price for all lands which are to be offered for sale at the Tax Recovery Auction. This reserve price will be advertised in a local newspaper. The reserve bid adopted by Council for the Tax Recovery Auction will also apply to properties unsold at the Tax Recovery Auction, whether they are to be sold by private sale or by public tender.
7. Council will determine the method in which the reserve price, letter of opinion, or opinion of value will be set and whether it is to be performed by an appraiser, realtor, or assessor.

8. In the event a parcel is sold and there remains excess revenue after taxes, an administration charge will be applied. The administration charge will include, but is not limited to, the following:
- a) Costs of advertising, both in the local papers and the Alberta Gazette;
 - b) Costs to prepare a reserve bid;
 - c) Costs paid to the Registrar of Land Titles for tax arrears notifications and preparation of a Tax Arrears List; and
 - d) An administration fee of 5% of the amount paid for the parcel.

9. In all respects, Council will conduct Tax Recovery Auctions in accordance with Division 8, Recovery of Taxes Related to Land, of the Municipal Government Act, Chapter M-26.1.

10. Tax Recovery property sold will adhere to the following terms:

Public Auction:

- For agricultural land - 10% down at public auction; balance at finalization.
- For subdivided lots - 10% down at public auction; balance at finalization.

Public Tenders: - 10% of bid to accompany tender.

The MD will consider time sale not to exceed one year at 8% interest on outstanding balance with 12% charged on arrears.

Direct Sales: - 10% of bid to accompany tender.

The MD will consider time sale not to exceed one year at 8% interest on outstanding balance with 12% charged on arrears.

LAND TITLE FEES: The M.D. will collect Land Title Office fees over and above the purchase price from purchasers at final payment, at a rate charged for Land Title fees, plus one dollar (\$1) for each \$1,000 market value or portion thereof.

11. If a Tax Recovery property remains unsold after one year from the Tax Recover sale, Council may allow for further appraisals or offers to be considered in accordance with the M.G.A.

- (b) that the municipality may become the owner of the parcel after the public auction if the parcel is not sold at the public auction.

(3) The notice must be sent to the address shown on the records of the Land Titles Office for each person referred to in subsection (1).

418(1) Each municipality must offer for sale at a public auction any parcel of land shown on its tax arrears list if the tax arrears are not paid.

(3) Subsection (1) does not apply to a parcel in respect of which the municipality has started an action under section 411(2) to recover the tax arrears before the date of the public auction.

(4) The municipality may enter into an agreement with the owner of a parcel of land shown on its tax arrears list providing for the payment of the tax arrears over a period not exceeding 3 years, and in that event the parcel need not be offered for sale under subsection (1) until

(a) the agreement has expired, or

(b) the owner of the parcel breaches the agreement,

whichever occurs first.

(3.3) For the purposes of this Division, “previous owner” includes the Crown in right of Alberta if the municipality has been notified by the Minister responsible for the *Unclaimed Personal Property and Vested Property Act* that the land has vested in the Crown, and any money remaining after payment of the tax arrears and costs set out in subsection (2) must be paid to the Minister responsible for the *Unclaimed Personal Property and Vested Property Act*.

(4) Money paid to a municipality under a lease, licence or permit granted under section 425(2) must be placed in the account referred to in subsection (1) and distributed in accordance with this section and section 428.

MOTION: That Council proceeds with the 3rd Annual Sporting Clay Shoot on Thursday, September 10, 2020, with the focus being a stakeholder event, with funds to come from the 2020 Operating Budget.

MOTION: That Council set the registration fee for the 3rd Annual Sporting Clay shoot to \$80.00 per person.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

Greenview historically hosted an annual public relations event in the form of a golf tournament from 2000 to 2017. In 2018 Greenview changed gears, hosting the 1st Annual Sporting Clay Shoot, which received positive reviews from all who participated. The friendly competition was a chance for Greenview Council and administration to have meaningful conversations and connect with industrial ratepayers and neighbours, focusing on raising funds for a local charity of Councils' choice.

The 2018 tournament raised approximately \$20,000 for Lila's Angels and had 70 participants registered, while the 2019 tournament raised \$36,000 for local food banks within Greenview, with 78 registrants. Both years have been successful in both the fundraising and the networking opportunities the event has provided.

With the COVID-19 pandemic and the current economic climate, administration is proposing to host the 3rd Annual 2020 Sporting Clay Shoot a little differently than in the past two years. Administration recommends a shift in the focus of the event from fundraising to networking and socializing, thereby giving our participants an enjoyable afternoon, with no expectations of additional funds to be spent.

For the past two years, Greenview provided a subsidized registration fee of \$80 per participant or \$40 for supper only. Actual registration costs were closer to \$160.00 per participant. Council has the option to keep registration fees the same or set a new registration amount for 2020. (Exact numbers will be made available at the Council Meeting).

Registration fees for the 2020 shoot may be used to provide cost recovery for the event, or Council may choose to donate to a charity of their choice.

In keeping with current outdoor gathering restrictions, registrants will be capped at 80, including Staff and Council, and have no more than 20 extra individuals on-site with volunteers and range staff. Administration will closely monitor the rules and regulations laid out by the Province and work with Shot Shell staff to adhere to all guidelines. Administration remains cognizant that circumstances and restrictions may change between now and September, and are prepared to modify and adapt plans as needed.

3. The benefit of Council hosting the event with reduced registration, may open the door for new participants who may not have participated otherwise.

Alternative #1: Council may choose to go ahead with the event in the same format as previous years, focusing on fundraising for a local charity. This is not recommended due to the hardships many businesses are currently facing.

Alternative #3: Council may choose to cancel the 3rd Annual Sport Clay Shoot for 2020.

MOTION: That Council approve Policy 6320 Greenview Rental Equipment as presented.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

This policy will replace Policy AG 09. The changes to this policy are:

- Updated to current policy standards and numbering
- Addition of a non-refundable \$20.00 deposit to rentals over \$20.00 to dissuade users from no-showing without providing at least 24 hours notice of cancellation. These deposits will be applied to the overall cost of rental once the equipment has been picked up as scheduled.
- Updated language.

PRC recommended the following changes May 12, 2020:

- Valleyview, Fox Creek and Sturgeon Lake Cree Nation be added to Provision 2.
- The \$20.00 deposit be changed to a 20% deposit in provision 4. This allows a deposit to be taken on all rental equipment, not just the pieces over \$20.00.
- Clarify the pre-rental and post-rental inspection in provision 5.
- Identify that equipment must be returned to the yard that it was rented from to Provision 7.
- Administration also adjusted to the wording of Provision 12 for additional clarity.

Council recommended the following revisions at the May 25, 2020 Council meeting:

- Addition of Rental Steward to the policy in the place of administration and the manager of Ag Services to allow for greater applicability to satellite rental yard sites.
- The time be removed and state a pre-arranged time determined by the Rental Steward.

 - a) Rental equipment will be released to a renter following the completion of a Rental Agreement form, which is attached hereto as part of this policy.
2. Rental fees plus applicable Goods and Service Tax will be collected for the number of days rented, upon the equipment's return. A minimum one days rent will be collected, whether the equipment was used or not.
3. Damage charges may be assessed after the equipment passes an inspection of working order and cleanliness. Damage obviously caused by the renter will be charged back to the renter.
4. Equipment returned unclean will be cleaned and a cleaning fee will be charged.
5. If the equipment is not returned on the day specified by the rental agreement, and other persons are waiting for the equipment, the renter will be contacted. If the lessee fails to return the equipment, the C.A.O. or designate will retrieve the equipment. This will result in the renter forfeiting rental privileges until such time as full recovery of costs, plus rental charges for the total number days that the equipment was held, are recovered.
6. The renter is responsible to ensure the equipment is transported safely and M.D. Staff has the right to refuse the release of any piece of equipment, if in their opinion it cannot be transported in a safe manner.

 - a. Rental equipment will be released to a renter following the completion of a **Greenview** Rental Agreement form, ~~which is attached hereto as part of this policy.~~
3. Rental fees plus applicable Goods and Service Tax will be collected for the number of days rented, upon the equipment's return. A minimum one days rent will be collected, whether the equipment was used or not.
 - a. Rental fees are to be established by Council by resolution from time to time, and set forth in the Schedules of Fees.
4. ~~A 20% deposit will be required at the time of booking for equipment with a rental cost over \$20.00 per day.~~ If a renter fails to pick up the piece of equipment on the scheduled day, without providing 24 hours notice of a cancellation, the renter will forfeit the deposit. The deposit fee may be waived at the Rental Steward's discretion due to weather or other circumstances out of the renter's control, including unscheduled maintenance or repair of equipment.

5. Prior to releasing the piece of equipment from the rental yard, the Rental Steward or designate will perform a pre-rental inspection of working order, damages and cleanliness with the renter. Upon return of the piece of equipment, a post-rental inspection will be conducted by the Rental Steward or designate. Damage or alterations obviously caused by the renter upon return of the equipment will be charged back to the renter.
6. Equipment returned unclean will be cleaned and a cleaning fee will be charged in accordance with the Schedules of Fees.
7. Rental equipment must be returned to the rental yard that it was rented from, at the pre-arranged time determined by the Rental Steward. Extensions may be granted at the discretion of the Rental Steward. Rental equipment may be returned to a different rental yard at the discretion of the Rental Steward.
8. If the equipment is not returned on the day specified by the rental agreement, and other renters are waiting for the equipment, the renter will be contacted. If the renter fails to return the equipment, the CAO, or designate will retrieve the equipment. This will result in the renter forfeiting rental privileges until such time as full recovery of costs, plus rental charges for the total number days that the equipment was held, are recovered.
9. If the renter fails to pay rental fees or deposits, they will forfeit rental privileges until the balance of their account is paid.
10. The renter is responsible to ensure the equipment is transported safely and Greenview staff have the right to refuse the release of any piece of equipment, if in their opinion, it cannot be transported in a safe manner.
11. Greenview may provide transportation for delivery of the equipment with rates set forth in the Schedules of Fees.
12. Greenview has the option to deliver and/ or pick up the equipment, based on operational limitations.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

Councillor Duane Didow has directed Administration to bring the following motion forward;

"The MD of Greenview enter into a Draft agreement with the Government of Canada (draft template attached and does not need a signature at this time). To allow both parties to conduct additional review, but provide assurance that negotiations are underway."

Representatives from the Grande Cache Correctional Institution have included the following information in their proposed agreement:

"Community engagement and support are important components of CSC's mandate to rehabilitate offenders. Grande Cache Institution (GCI) is located less than 2 kilometers from the town of Grande Cache. Currently, there is no sidewalk/path for visitors or staff to travel between the town site and the institution, resulting in people having to walk or cycle on a narrow & busy road (Hoppe Avenue). Many visitors and GCI staff choose to walk or cycle the route; however, the busy road does not make it suitable to walk to the institution from the town and vice versa. This is a safety concern for pedestrians and cyclists, especially in the winter months when road conditions are icy, and the lanes become narrower. Constructing a pathway to GCI from the town will encourage offender visitors to attend the site more often, increase environmentally sustainable commuting, increase community morale and allowing CSC to further their mission by encouraging & assisting offenders to become law abiding citizens.

It is CSC's responsibility to understand and manage risk for its employees and visitors to our facilities and in turn assess, identify, develop, and implement ways to maintain safe and secure operations. The construction

of a sidewalk/pathway from the town of Grande Cache to GCI benefits to both the Municipal District of Greenview and the Institution by contributing to safety and to a healthier workforce at the site, which in turn provides a significant positive influence on the safety & security of GCI.

The construction of a sidewalk/pathway from the community of Grande Cache contributes to a Productive relationship with the Hamlet of Grande Cache & The Municipality, by significantly improving the safety of pedestrians and cyclists travelling to and from GCI.

1.1 Project Summary -The Project will construct a paved walking/cycling path, approximately 1.7km in length, between the Town of Grande Cache and CSC's Grande Cache Institution."

Administration recognizes the potential merit of this project to ratepayers and as such has been attempting to flesh out the details for Councils consideration since late 2019 when first approached. At this time Administration inquired from Correctional Service Canada (CSC) what was needed to prepare and were informed to wait.

In May of 2020 CSC staff once again inquired about Greenviews interest in the project. Administration made three attempts to acquire information from CSC to prepare information for Councils consideration. On two attempts messages were left with no response and the third attempt resulted in CSC staff indicating that they were busy and would be in touch which did not occur until a string of emails in June.

From late 2019 to spring 2020 the General Manager of Infrastructure and Planning has been scheduling infrastructure projects in accordance with budget deliberations, anticipated available construction days and available staff resources. As a result the following has been considered in regards to this project.

- This project was not outlined in the 2020 project schedule as a result of the aforementioned process and has come forward with very strict timelines.
- This project would need to be tendered if it is to be completed in the construction season which may pose difficulties considering the timelines involved.
- Administration has not had enough time to survey the pathway, or compile any pre-construction data to pass on to Council.
- A sidewalk from the edge of Phase 5/6 down to the Institution has not been considered by Administration prior to this enquiry.
- There is no funding allocated in the 2020 Budget for this project.
- Administration does not have a tally of costs that would be incurred by Greenview for this project. No estimates have been provided or yet sought by Greenview.
- When considering the anticipated approved construction schedule, staff resources are limited for additional projects.

BENEFITS OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. Greenview would receive partial funding for this project as opposed to have to incur the entire costs if this project was to be completed later.

2. Increased pedestrian safety.

DISADVANTAGES OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. Greenview would be adding a project to the 2020 Capital Plan that is not budgeted.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:

Alternative #1: Council may chose not to enter into this agreement and not proceed with this joint project.

This Contribution Agreement ("Agreement") is made in triplicate.

BETWEEN: Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada
(as represented by Prairies Regional Deputy
Commissioner, Correctional Service Canada)
(hereinafter referred to as "CSC")

OF THE FIRST PART

AND: Alberta Municipal District of Greenview No. 16, as
represented by Denise Thompson Chief Administrative
Officer (hereinafter referred to as "The Municipality")

OF THE SECOND PART

WHEREAS the Treasury Board approved the Terms and Conditions of CSC's National Infrastructure Contribution Program (hereinafter referred to as NICP) authorizing CSC to enter into agreements to provide contributions to qualified provinces, territories, municipalities, and non-profit organizations.

NOW THEREFORE, this Agreement witnesseth as follows:

1. **TITLE**: "Grande Cache Sidewalk / Path" (hereinafter referred to as the Project)

2. **THE PROJECT**:

2.1 Background

Community engagement and support are important components of CSC's mandate to rehabilitate offenders. Grande Cache Institution (GCI) is located less than 2 kilometers from the town of Grande Cache. Currently, there is no sidewalk/path for visitors or staff to travel between the town site and the institution, resulting in people having to walk or cycle on a narrow & busy road (Hoppe Avenue). 2.2 Project Summary

The Project will construct a paved walking/cycling path, approximately 1.7km in length, between the Town of Grande Cache and CSC's Grande Cache Institution.

3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE RECIPIENT

The Recipient agrees to:

- 3.1 Use monies contributed by CSC in support of the Project, and the Recipient further agrees that in no case will CSC be liable for funding in excess of the amounts stated in this Agreement.
- 3.2 Upon reasonable notice by CSC, to provide CSC with access to the Recipient's staff, records and premises for purposes related to monitoring, reviewing or auditing the activities undertaken in relation to this Agreement, and related to the evaluation of the effectiveness or efficiency of the Project. CSC reserves the right to audit or cause to have audited the accounts and records of the Recipient to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The scope, coverage and timing of such audit shall be as determined by CSC and may be carried out by employees or agents of CSC.
- 3.3 Unless otherwise directed by CSC, the Recipient shall acknowledge the contribution received from CSC in any published paper, report, promotional activity, public presentation and electronic material related to the Project in the following manner:
 - 3.3.1 "The **Grande Cache Sidewalk / Path** project has been made possible through a financial contribution from the Correctional Service of Canada".

4. CONTRIBUTION BY CSC:

- 4.1 Subject to this Agreement and in accordance with the Treasury Board Policy on Transfer Payments, CSC agrees to make contribution payments to the Recipient for an amount not to exceed Five Hundred & Sixty Thousand dollars (\$560,000) \$60,000 assessment/design + \$500,000 construction, to carry out the Project **between June 15, 2020, and March 31, 2022.**

If reimbursements are made on claims by the Recipient

- 4.2 Payments under this Agreement will be made upon receipt and verification of invoices submitted by the Recipient clearly showing payment made to various contractors and consultants. Inspections will be made by CSC project leaders to verify that the work is completed. The final payment will be made when CSC deems the project completed.

5. FUNDING:

- 5.1 In accordance with Section 40 of *the Financial Administration Act* (R.S.C. 1985, C.F. – 11), payment of a contribution in any fiscal year (01 April – 31 March) is subject to there being an appropriation by the Parliament of Canada for the fiscal year which any commitment would come due for payment.

6. FUNDING CHANGES:

- 6.1 CSC may reduce or terminate funding under this Agreement in response to the Government's annual Budget, a parliamentary or governmental spending restraint decision, or a re-structuring or re-ordering of the federal mandate and responsibilities that impacts on the Project under which this Agreement is made.

- 6.2 If the funding for a Project is reduced as a result of a decision or occurrence mentioned in 6.1, the amount remaining unpaid under this Agreement may be reduced, as of the date the reduction takes effect, by a percentage equal to the percentage of the reduction.
- 6.3 If a Project or its funding is terminated as a result of a decision mentioned in 6.1, funding under this Agreement will be terminated as of the date the funding termination comes into effect.
- 6.4 If a Project is demonstrating, through its quarterly updated cash flow requirements, that it will not be able to spend all of its approved funding, CSC shall have the right to adjust the funding amount accordingly.
- 6.5 In the event of a funding reduction or termination, CSC shall give notice in writing to the Recipient of the relevant decision and its impact on the Agreement, as early as possible. Unless the decision or occurrence, causing the reduction or termination indicates a specific date for such action (less than 60 calendar days), CSC shall give notice to the Recipient sixty (60) calendar days before the action to reduce or terminate funding becomes effective.
- 6.6 In the case of a decision to reduce funding, CSC shall, in the notice in 6.4, offer to the Recipient a reasonable opportunity to work with the Department to negotiate a modification to the Recipient's obligation under this Agreement in light of this reduction. Where appropriate and subject to Section 6.2 above, CSC shall offer to the Recipient a reasonable opportunity to negotiate a way to implement the reduction with respect to any remaining payments.

7. SURPLUS AND OVERPAYMENTS

- 7.1 The Recipient shall refund to the Receiver General of Canada via CSC, 30 days after the submission of the final Report, any overpayment, payment made for expenses which are not eligible under this Agreement, unexpended or unaccounted balances. The Recipient acknowledges that such are debts to the Crown. Interest shall be charged on overdue repayments in accordance with the *Interest and Administrative Charges Regulations*.
- 7.2 The Recipient shall, for the purposes outlined in the Project and for the duration of this Agreement, declare to CSC any and all accrual or anticipated sources of funding from any level of government or private sources, in addition to the funding received under this Agreement.

8. REFUND:

- 8.1 The Recipient shall repay to CSC any and all disallowed expenditures and overpayments made under this Agreement. In the event that any such excess arising from this Agreement is not promptly refunded, CSC may deduct the identified amount from any further amounts due to the Recipient.
- 8.2 The Recipient shall refund to CSC:
 - 8.2.1 within thirty (30) calendar days of the termination or expiry of this Agreement, any funds remitted to the Recipient and not spent prior to the termination or expiry of this Agreement;
 - 8.2.2 immediately upon a written request by CSC, any funds remitted to the Recipient for which, in the opinion of CSC, no satisfactory evidence has been provided by the Recipients that the money has been spent in accordance with this Agreement;
 - 8.2.3 immediately upon request, amounts paid in error; and

- 8.2.4 immediately upon request, the equivalent amount of funds received by the Recipient from other sources to cover expenditures for which the Recipient received under this Agreement.
- 8.3 CSC may withhold from any payment due under this Contribution Agreement or any subsequent agreement between CSC and the Recipient:
 - 8.3.1 any funds that the Recipient is required to refund to the Receiver General for Canada pursuant to subsection 8.1 and 8.2; and
 - 8.3.2 any funds to be received by the Recipient under the terms of a previous Agreement between CSC and the Recipient that had not been spent when the previous Agreement ended or was terminated, and that had not been refunded to CSC, or for which, in the opinion of CSC, no satisfactory evidence has been provided by the Recipient that the money has been spent in accordance with that Agreement.

9. BUDGET AND FINANCIAL REPORTS:

- 9.1 The Recipient shall submit, for CSC's approval, an updated cash flow report showing actual expenditures and adjusted budget, forecasts for subsequent reporting periods within that fiscal year, or for later fiscal years. These reports are due each quarter of the fiscal year of this Agreement.
- 9.2 The Recipient shall, within 30 calendar days of the termination or expiry of this Agreement, submit to CSC a final financial statement/invoice, and an electronic copy of the final report (including the evaluation report, if applicable).
- 9.3 CSC shall not be obliged to pay any bills or other costs submitted more than 30 calendar days after the termination or expiry of this Agreement.

10. RECORDS AND AUDIT:

- 10.1 The Recipient shall:
 - 10.1.1 keep accounts and records of all financial transactions in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles;
 - 10.1.2 keep all records intact for six (6) years after the termination or expiry of this Contribution Agreement, unless otherwise notified in writing by CSC that such records are no longer needed; and
 - 10.1.3 immediately reimburse the Receiver General for Canada any overpayments or disallowed expenditures, as determined by the audit.

11. DURATION:

- 11.1 This Agreement will **commence June 15, 2020, and will end on March 31, 2022**, unless terminated earlier pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement.

12. INDEMNIFICATION AND LIABILITY:

- 12.1 The Recipient shall indemnify and save harmless CSC from and against all claims, losses, damages, costs, expenses, actions and other proceedings, made, sustained, brought, prosecuted, threatened to be brought or prosecuted, in any manner based upon, occasioned by or attributable to any injury to or death of a person or damage to or loss of property arising from any willful or negligent act, omission or delay on the part of the Recipient, the Recipient's servants or agents in performing the Project or as a result of the Project.

12.1.1 CSC shall not be held liable for any injury, including death, or for any loss or damage to property of the Recipient or for any obligation of the Recipient or anyone else, incurred or suffered by the Recipient or its agents, employees, contractors or voluntary workers in carrying out the Project, including where the Recipient has entered into loans, capital leases, or other long term obligations in relation with this Agreement.

12.1.2 The Recipient agrees not to represent itself as an agent or a partner of CSC at any time or in any situation.

12.1.3 The Recipient agrees to be solely responsible for any and all deductions and payments required to be made from or to employees and anyone else, including those for the Canada or Quebec Pension Plans, Employment Insurance, the Worker's Compensation Board, and the Canada Customs and Revenue Agency (Income Tax).

13. RECIPIENT'S STATUS:

13.1 This is an agreement for the purposes of contributing to a Project, neither Recipient nor any of Recipient's personnel is engaged by this agreement as an employee, servant or agent of CSC.

14. TERMINATION:

14.1 It is understood and agreed that either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon giving the other party thirty (30) (90 if term is more than a year) days written notice.

14.2 It is understood and agreed that CSC may terminate this Agreement forthwith in the event of default of any provisions of the agreement by the Recipient.

15. AMENDMENT OR TEMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT:

15.1 This Agreement shall only be amended or terminated in writing, by mutual consent of CSC and the Recipient.

16. GENERAL:

16.1 No member of the Senate or the House of Commons shall be admitted to any share or part of the agreement, or to any benefit arising from it, that is not otherwise available to the general public.

16.2 No current or former public servant or public office holder to whom the Conflict of Interest Act, the Conflict of Interest and Post-Employment Code for Public Office Holders or the Values and Ethics Code for the Public Service applies shall derive direct benefit from the funding agreement unless the provision or receipt of such benefits is in compliance with such legislation and codes.

16.3 It is declared by the Recipient that the Recipient and any person lobbying on behalf of the Recipient to obtain funding are in compliance with the *Lobbying Act*.

16.4 The Recipient declares that it is committed to the promotion of and respect for a law abiding society, the rule of law and the values and principles underlying the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms* and the *Canadian Bill of Rights* and declares that it is not participating in, or condoning, any

activity that could be construed as contrary to the laws of Canada or its provinces or territories.

- 16.5 Any and all disputes under this Agreement shall be resolved between the Parties to this Agreement or their designates and shall not be referred to a third party for resolution.

17. CONFIDENTIALITY:

- 17.1 CSC and the Recipient shall both protect any confidential information according to applicable federal, provincial or territorial legislation and such information shall not be disclosed without the written consent of the individual to whom the information relates, unless as required by law.
- 17.2 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, it is agreed by the Recipient that their name, the amount awarded and the general nature of the activities supported may be made publicly available by the Government of Canada.

18. OFFICIAL LANGUAGES:

- 18.1 It is understood that the Recipient will ensure they respect the spirit and intent of the *Official Languages Act* where significant demand warrants by:
- 18.1.1 making any announcements to the public concerning the Project in both official languages;
- 18.1.2 actively offering services to the public in both official languages;
- 18.1.3 making available in both official languages any documents for the general public relating to the Project; and
- 18.1.4 encouraging members of both official language communities to participate in the Project.

19. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:

- 19.1 This Agreement sets forth the entire Agreement and understanding between CSC and the Recipient and supersedes and cancels all previous negotiations, Agreements, applications, commitments, and writings with respect to the Project.

20. OBLIGATIONS SURVIVING TERMINATION:

- 20.1 All obligations of the Recipient shall expressly, or by their nature, survive termination or expiry of this Agreement until, and unless, they are fulfilled, or by their nature expire.
