We were also excited to host our annual Ratepayer BBQs once again! These popular events provide both Council and Administration a valuable opportunity to connect and engage with Greenview residents, hear your feedback, and share updates on local initiatives.

As summer unfolds, we hope you find time to enjoy the beauty of the great outdoors, spend quality moments with family and friends, and take in everything that Greenview has to offer.



Council Highlights



June 10, 2025 Greenview Council Approves Tax Recovery Auction

The tax recovery process is a strictly legislated last resort mechanism municipalities use to collect outstanding property taxes. When property taxes remain unpaid for more than one year, a Tax Notification caveat is registered on the Land Title and notification is sent to the landowner and other interested parties advising them of the caveat. If the property tax arrears remain unpaid on March 31 of the following year, the Municipality may sell the property by public auction. The Municipality has one year from April 1 to place the property for sale by public auction.

After approving the reserve bid terms and conditions, Council set the Tax Recovery Public Auction date for **Thursday, September 11, 2025, at 9:00 A.M. Mountain Standard Time,** to be held in Council Chambers of the Valleyview Administration building, located at 4806 – 36 Avenue, for the sale of the listed properties at https://mdgreenview.ab.ca/council-highlights-june-10-2025/.

April 22, 2025 Greenview 2025 Tax Rate Bylaw Approved

Council passed the final Operating and Capital budgets on March 25, 2025. In addition to collecting property taxes for municipal purposes, Greenview is also required to collect property taxes for Seniors Foundation requisitions and on behalf of the province for designated industrial properties and education. Council moved to approve the 2025 Tax Rate Bylaw with no changes to the tax rates for Rural Residential, Grande Cache residential, or Non-Residential property taxes.



Project Management

WD19004 - Distribution Pumphouse Upgrades

The 2025 Distribution Pumphouse Upgrade project includes significant improvements to both the water treatment plant and the distribution system in Grande Cache. Key upgrades include the installation of new sodium hypochlorite injection points and a secondary membrane blower, enabling operators to maintain a more consistent chlorine residual throughout the system. Additional enhancements at the Distribution Pumphouse, such as installing new water mains and valves, pump control upgrades,



and power system improvements, are designed to increase pump efficiency, support backup power operations, and improve overall water distribution capacity. These upgrades will enhance system reliability, reduce maintenance issues, and ensure continued safe, high-quality drinking water for the community.

PD24003 - Tower Park Estates

The upgrades at Tower Park Estates aim to improve stormwater management and local access. The project will include the construction of a stormwater retention pond designed to reduce surface runoff and enhance flood protection for the surrounding neighborhood. In addition, a newly paved access road and parking lot will be developed to improve connectivity and support future community use.

SW20001 - Grande Cache Transfer Station

Preparations are underway to develop a new transfer station at the Grande Cache landfill, which will modernize local waste management services and improve operational efficiency. This facility will provide a centralized location for waste collection and transfer, helping to streamline hauling operations and reduce travel time to regional landfills. Designed with safety and environmental considerations in mind, the transfer station will include designated drop-off areas and improved site access.

RD25005 - Grande Cache Phased Rehabilitation

Greenview is moving forward with a phased underground infrastructure rehabilitation project to support future development and long-term growth in Grande Cache along Shand Avenue. This initiative will replace aging water, sewer, and storm systems to improve service reliability and increase capacity. The project will help unlock development opportunities by upgrading essential underground utilities, reducing the risk of infrastructure failures, and enhancing overall community resilience. Work will be completed in phases to minimize disruptions.

Greenview is excited to announce that procurement and bid opportunities will transition to bids &tenders beginning the week of July 2, 2025, with a complete transition expected to occur by the end of August 2025. Notices will continue to be available for viewing on Alberta Purchasing Connection, but a free bid&tenders account will be required to view, download, and respond to procurement and bid opportunities.

Construction & Engineering

There are 3 bridges files within Greenview to be completed in the 2025 construction season. All three bridges have different specifications regarding replacement, timelines and requirements for a detour, no detour.

- ▶ Bridge File 77259 has been awarded to In-Line Contracting Ltd
- ▶ Bridge File 78147 has been awarded to Wild West Gravel Ltd. Dirtworks Ltd.
- ▶ Bridge File 79118 has been awarded to CTR Contracting Ltd.

Asphalt maintenance will occur between Little Smoky, Valleyview, New Fish Creek, and DeBolt between May 16th and June 1st; please be aware of the construction within your area. Knelsen Sand & Gravel Ltd. was awarded the contract.


Asphalt maintenance contract work in Grande Cache is tentatively scheduled between mid-June and July 1st. Please be aware of the construction occurring in your area.

The regrade project on Township Road 692 (Grovedale area) was approved within the 2025 construction budget. The contractor awarded is Green Acre Ventures Ltd.

The Forestry Trunk Road KM 0-5 asphalt will be milled and overlayed during the 2025 construction season and has been awarded to Knelsen Sand & Gravel Ltd.

Range Road 225 ditch re-establishment will start after the road bans are removed and will take approximately 25 days, weather permitting.

SB-90 liquid asphalt applications are scheduled for June and July on Range Road 230 (near Valleyview) and Range Road 64 (near Grovedale). This product is an asphalt-based product that will harden the gravel surface. However, it is manageable and pliable to ensure maintenance can be completed. This product will enhance the road surface to be similar to an asphalt surface for a fraction of the cost.



Operations

Roadside Ditch Cleanup Incentive Program

Greenview had 28 successful applicants for the Roadside Ditch Cleanup Incentive Program this year, and we thank all the non-profit organizations for completing their designated areas.

Each year, Greenview Council designates a portion of its budget for the cleanup of designated roadside areas and provides a payment of \$1,000.00 for every 5-kilometer section of road completed by participating groups.

Thank you for participating in Greenview's Annual Roadside Ditch Cleanup and helping keep our roadsides clean!

Did You Know?

On February 11, 2025, Council approved amendments to **Greenview Policy 4020 Snowplowing of Rural Residential Driveways**. Highlights include:

- ▶ Eligible residents seeking driveway snow removal services must apply for or renew the "Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement" on an annual basis, with the deadline being the last Friday in October. Applications submitted after this deadline may be subject to a processing delay of up to 30 days before services commence.
- ▶ Applicants are responsible for affixing an annual renewal sticker, which will be issued upon application or renewal, to the bottom left corner of their existing snowplow sign in order to maintain service.
- ▶ Seniors and individuals with disabilities are exempt from all associated service fees; however, they are still required to complete the "Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement" and provide the following documentation to qualify:
 - Seniors must present government-issued photo identification verifying eligibility for the program.
 - Individuals with disabilities must submit documentation confirming eligibility, such as a physician's note or a valid accessible parking placard.

- ▶ Only the applicant's primary residence is eligible, and only one driveway per applicant will be serviced.
- ► The property must be at least five (5) acres in size.
- ► The driveway must connect to a Greenview municipal roadway.
- ▶ Seniors and individuals with disabilities who were issued snowplow signs under the policy as of August 2023 will remain eligible, and Seniors and individuals with disabilities residing in Cooperatives and Enterprises also remain eligible, notwithstanding the criteria listed below.

Snowplowing services will not be provided to:

- a) Parcels under five (5) acres.
- b) Non-residential properties.
- c) Institutional properties.
- d) High-density subdivisions.
- e) Gated communities.

Application forms are available at the Administration Building in Valleyview and the Public Service Buildings in DeBolt, Grovedale, and Grande Cache. Upon signing the agreement, applicants will receive a snowplow sign and an annual renewal sticker.

Operations Updates:

- ▶ Road maintenance work is ongoing in all areas of Greenview throughout the summer and fall months. Please watch for crews repairing and installing culverts, line painting, pothole patching, mowing, grading, etc.
- ▶ Roadside ditch mowing began in June and will continue into mid-October.
- Roadside brushing began in May and will continue until the end of October.
- ▶ Greenview's gravel program typically begins on the Forestry Trunk Road in May and in rural residential areas in July. Please watch for equipment and trucks working.

2025 Budget At A Glance

The 2025 Operating and Capital Budgets were adopted by Council at the Regular Council Meeting on March 25, 2025.

Budget highlights are as follows:

Greenview Council remains focused on the continued development of critical infrastructure, maintaining and enhancing essential community programs and services, along with the continued support of regional partnerships and collaborations.

The operating budget of \$237.9 million includes \$108.5 million for general operations, \$24.9 million for amortization, \$62.5 million in transfers to reserves and capital, and \$41.9 million in requisitions, including the Provincial Education and Seniors Foundations requisitions, both of which are mandated by the Province. As part of the operating budget, \$12.4 million has been allocated to municipal partners and non-profit organizations through Greenview's Community Services Grants programs and community partnerships, which includes support for the operations of libraries, museums, and community halls across the municipality as well as the stewardship of the community cemeteries.


Council approved \$100.5 million for capital projects, including \$50.1 million in projects carried over from the previous year. The capital budget was approached with careful deliberation without sacrificing any planned infrastructure projects and remains fully funded from debentures, transfers from the operating budget, restricted reserves, and grant funding.

Key Capital Budget Highlights

In 2025, the MD expects to complete \$100.5 million in capital projects. Major projects include:

- ▶ New Operations Shop in Grande Cache \$6.8 million
- ▶ Ridgevalley Lagoon Expansion \$12.5 million
- ▶ Grande Cache Landfill Closure \$5.7 million
- ▶ Grande Cache Distribution Pumphouse Upgrades \$3.0 million
- ▶ Grande Cache Community Facility \$8.7 million
- ► Wet Rescue Replacement Grovedale \$1.6 million

Grande Cache Wastewater Treatment Plant - Mid-Year Update

The Grande Cache Wastewater Treatment Plant project continues to move forward on schedule, with completion anticipated in fall 2025. This year, the focus has been on advancing structural work, installing major mechanical and electrical systems, and preparing key treatment components for testing and commissioning.

Milestones have been achieved across all areas of the site, including main facility buildings, treatment equipment, pumps and piping, and supporting infrastructure. Testing has begun on some systems, and critical connections are nearing completion. Cleanup and backfilling have also improved overall site conditions and accessibility.

The project remains on track and within budget, bringing Greenview closer to a modernized facility that will support future growth, protect the environment, and ensure reliable wastewater treatment for the Grande Cache community.

Lagoon Desludging - Keeping Our Wastewater System Working Efficiently?

This summer, Greenview will conduct lagoon desludging operations at the Little Smoky and Grovedale wastewater lagoons. This important maintenance work helps ensure these systems operate safely, efficiently, and with enough capacity to serve the community.

What Is Desludging?

Over time, solids naturally build up at the bottom of wastewater lagoons. This sludge reduces the lagoon's ability to hold and treat incoming wastewater if not removed. Desludging involves safely removing these settled solids, restoring capacity and performance.

Why It Matters?

- ▶ Maintains Treatment Efficiency Removing sludge allows the lagoon to treat wastewater more effectively.
- ▶ Restores Capacity Ensures there's enough space to manage current and future flows.
- ▶ Prevents Odours & Issues Helps minimize odour concerns and reduces the risk of system backups.
- ▶ Protects the Environment Keeps our wastewater treatment compliant and environmentally responsible.

Desludging is part of Greenview's lagoon maintenance program and supports the long-term sustainability of rural wastewater systems. Residents may notice activity near the lagoon sites during this work, but there is no expected impact on local services.

Grande Cache Residential Recycle Collection Fee Removed

As per the amended Bylaw 25-990, Greenview Council has approved the removal of the \$10.25/ month Recycle Collection Fee for the Grande Cache residential blue bin program. This change comes as a result of Alberta's new Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) program, which shifts recycling costs away from taxpayers and onto the producers of packaging and paper products.

Under this framework, Greenview is working with Circular Materials, a non-profit organization coordinating residential recycling collection on behalf of producers across Alberta. As part of this transition, producers are now responsible for the cost of collecting and managing recyclable materials. This shift allows Council to eliminate the monthly utility fee for Grande Cache residents.

This change not only brings immediate cost savings to local households, but it also supports more consistent recycling programs across the province.

What This Means for You:

The \$10.25/month Recycle Collection Fee has been removed from your utility bill.
Recycling collection will continue as usual.
No action is required. Simply continue recycling the way you normally do.





The Parent & Tot Program structures in-water interaction between parent/caregiver and child to stress the importance of play in developing water-positive attitudes and skills. Age 4 months to 3 years. \$55.00.

The Preschool Program works to ensure children become comfortable in the water and have fun developing a foundation of water skills. Age 3-6 years. \$55.00.

The Swimmer Program uses in-water practice for swimmers of any ability to develop swimming strokes and skills. Age 5-12 years. \$65.00.

Bronze Medallion is a prerequisite for assistant lifeguard training in Bronze Cross.

3 - Bronze Cross (24 hours)

The Lifesaving Society's Bronze Cross begins the transition from lifesaving to lifeguarding and prepares candidates for responsibilities as an assistant lifeguard. Candidates strengthen and expand their lifesaving skills and begin applying active surveillance principles and techniques in aquatic facilities. Bronze Cross emphasizes the importance of teamwork and communication in preventing and responding to aquatic emergencies. Bronze Cross is a prerequisite for advanced training in the Society's National Lifeguard and leadership certification programs.

Pre-requisite: Bronze Medallion (need not be current); Current AB Workplace Approved Standard (Intermediate) First Aid with CPR C.

4.A - National Lifeguard (40 hours)

The Lifesaving Society's National Lifeguard Certification builds on the fundamental skills, knowledge, fitness, judgment, and values taught in the prerequisite Lifesaving Society lifesaving certifications. The National Life-guard program develops the basic lifeguarding skills, principles, and decision-making process to help life-guards evaluate and adapt to different aquatic facilities and emergencies.

Pre-requisite: Bronze Cross (need not be current); Current AB Workplace Approved Standard (Intermediate) First Aid with CPR C; minimum 15 years of age at the time of the exam.

4.B - Swim Instructor (32 hours)
