Did you know it's mandatory to have a clearly visible Rural Address Sign? These signs play a crucial role in helping emergency services locate your property quickly.

Over time, signs can become damaged due to harsh weather and other factors. If your sign was impacted this past winter, now is a great time to

check and replace it if needed.

Greenview emergency services span an area of over 32,000 square kilometres. When an emergency arises, every minute counts!

Rural addressing is a provincial standardized system that assigns an address to rural properties throughout a municipality to allow them to be quickly and easily identified by emergency response services (police, fire, ambulance), service providers, residents, and non-residents.

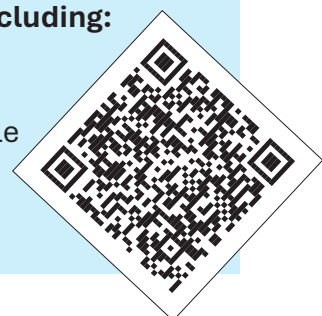
Voyent Alert! is a versatile communication service utilized by Greenview to keep residents informed

The system provides emergency notifications, along with updates on:

- Road closures and detours
- Water and sewer disruptions
- Garbage or recycling collection changes

Residents can choose how they receive alerts, including:

- Mobile app
- Voice calls to home or mobile phones
- Text (SMS)
- Email



Animal Control bylaw in Grande Cache

The original Grande Cache Animal Control Bylaw was repealed and replaced with Greenview Bylaw No. 25-991.

In that bylaw, it states that any animal, which is defined as a domestic or small household animal.

As per Sec. 4.9 of the new Bylaw: No owner shall permit their animal to run at large.

The fine for this is as follows: \$100.00 for the 1st offence, \$250.00 for the 2nd offence and \$500.00 for the 3rd and subsequent offences.

No owner shall keep, possess, or harbour more than 3 dogs or 4 cats at their residence.

Grande Cache does not currently have a pound location in the hamlet; therefore, when an animal is turned in or caught running at large, it will be transported to Grande Prairie for dogs and to Valleyview for cats. Officers have no place to 'hold' an animal while waiting for the owner to contact Enforcement Services. The animal will be transported forthwith.

Under Section 3.1, all dogs, 6 months and older, residing within the Hamlet of Grande Cache are required to be licensed.

It is a good idea to license dogs so that, if they escape from the owner's residence and are caught, they can be identified and returned to the owner. Cats cannot be registered. If cat owners allow their cats outside, it is a great idea to have a collar on the cat with identifying information for the cat and its owner, so that Peace Officers can return the cat to its rightful owner. If a dog cat cannot be identified, it will be transported to Grande Prairie or Valleyview upon being picked up, as there is no place in Grande Cache 'hold' animals.



RV Parking within the Hamlet of Grande Cache

With the May long weekend behind us, it is important for residents to know the following RV parking rules for the Hamlet of Grande Cache.



Section 4.16 of the Grande Cache Traffic Bylaw 836 states as follows:

A Recreational Vehicle may be parked on a residential street, public highway or easement for a period **not exceeding 72 consecutive hours**. Following this period, the Recreational Vehicle must be removed from the residential street, public highway or easement for a minimum of 48 consecutive hours before it may be parked again for an additional period of up to 72 consecutive hours.

a) Any person who contravenes this section is guilty of an offence and may be issued a violation ticket up to a maximum of \$250.00.

Please do not park or leave trailers on roadways for more than 72 hours. The trailer may be towed at the owner's expense if it is in contravention of this bylaw.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES



Making a Splash While Saving Water

Summer is the perfect time to cool off outdoors, and a few small habits can help families enjoy water activities while reducing unnecessary water use. You can help conserve water and protect Greenview's water systems throughout the summer months by:

- Using reusable water toys and refill buckets instead of letting hoses run continuously
- Watering lawns and gardens early in the morning or later in the evening to reduce evaporation
- Turning hoses and sprinklers off when not in use
- Washing vehicles on gravel or grass when possible and keeping soapy runoff out of storm drains
- Checking outdoor taps and hoses for leaks throughout the season

Simple changes can help conserve water while still making the most of summer fun.



Wood Disposal During Fire Restrictions

During periods of high fire risk or limited site capacity, Greenview transfer stations may temporarily restrict wood disposal at certain locations.

These temporary restrictions help reduce fire hazards and support safe operations at the transfer station for residents and staff.

Residents are encouraged to:

- Check Greenview's website or social media channels for updates before transporting large wood loads
- Separate clean and treated wood materials before arriving at the site
- Follow directions provided by transfer station attendants and posted signage. Site attendants may redirect or refuse certain materials when restrictions are in place due to high fire risk or limited site capacity.

Restriction timelines may vary depending on fire conditions, weather, and transfer station capacity.

We appreciate residents' patience and cooperation as we work to maintain safe and responsible waste management operations throughout Greenview.



Recycling Matters

Properly separating recyclable materials helps reduce the amount of waste sent to landfills and supports more sustainable waste management throughout Greenview.

Community recycling bins located throughout Greenview provide convenient options for recycling materials such as cardboard, paper, tin cans, plastics #1-7, glass jars, and packaging materials. Grande Cache residents also have access to bi-weekly curbside blue bin recycling collection through Alberta's Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) program. Additional recycling opportunities for materials such as electronics, batteries, and tires are available at Greenview transfer stations.

During the summer months and throughout the year, activities such as yard cleanups, home projects, and outdoor gatherings can create additional recyclable and compostable materials. Yard waste, food scraps, cardboard, beverage containers, electronics, batteries, tires, and packaging can often be diverted from landfill through proper sorting, recycling, or composting. Taking a few extra moments to separate materials helps give many items a second life instead of sending them to the landfill.

Quick Recycling Tips:



- Composting food scraps and yard waste when possible
- Recycle cardboard, paper, plastics, tin cans, glass, beverage containers, and packaging separately from garbage
- Properly dispose of batteries and electronics at approved collection locations

Outhouse & Holding Tank Do's and Don'ts

Summer camping, cabins, and outdoor events often mean increased use of outhouses, holding tanks, and portable toilet systems throughout Greenview. These systems are designed to handle only human waste and toilet paper. Other materials can create serious issues during pumping and wastewater treatment.

Do not place the following items in outhouses or holding tanks:

- Cans or bottles
- Garbage or food waste
- "Flushable" wipes
- Feminine hygiene products
- Diapers
- Plastics or chemicals

These materials can damage pumping equipment, cause blockages, and interfere with wastewater treatment and septage receiving systems.

If it is not human waste or toilet paper, keep it out of the outhouse.

Greenview Weed Squad - She Ain't Pretty She Just Looks That Way



Want to learn how to identify priority weeds in Greenview, why they matter, and what to do if you spot them?

Invasive and noxious weeds can reduce forage, impact agricultural productivity, harm native vegetation, and create long-term management challenges across Greenview.

Greenview has established various assistance programs that ratepayers can choose to access to help control or destroy these plants.



Protecting Grande Cache's Drinking Water at the Source



Did you know that Grande Cache's drinking water begins long before it reaches the tap?

The Hamlet's primary drinking water source is Victor Lake, which supplies raw water to the Grande Cache Water Treatment Plant. Victor Lake is also connected to Grande Cache Lake through a diversion canal system that helps support water movement and maintain water availability between the two lakes when conditions require it.

Over the past year, Greenview has been working with engineers, provincial agencies, local stakeholders, and watershed partners to update the Grande Cache Source Water Protection Plan (SWPP). The updated plan looks at both water quality and long-term water availability to help ensure a safe and sustainable drinking water supply for the community into the future.

The plan identifies potential risks within the watershed and outlines ways to help reduce impacts before they can affect the drinking water system. Some of the key topics reviewed included:

- Wildfire impacts
- Highway runoff and spill response
- Recreational use around the lakes
- Mining and industrial activity within the watershed
- Long-term drought and water availability
- Protection of shoreline and natural vegetation
- Monitoring of the canal and lake levels

The canal connecting Victor Lake and Grande Cache Lake continues to play an important role in the system. The canal helps regulate water movement between the lakes and supports overall system resilience during changing seasonal conditions. Recent inspections and stakeholder discussions also highlighted the importance of keeping the canal clear of obstructions and continuing to monitor water levels and infrastructure conditions.

The updated Source Water Protection Plan also recognizes the importance of community stewardship. Both Victor Lake and Grande Cache Lake are valued recreational areas, but they are also part of a sensitive watershed system. Small actions can make a big difference in protecting local water quality.

Residents and visitors can help protect Grande Cache's water sources by:

- Staying on designated trails and access points
- Avoiding dumping or littering near the shoreline
- Cleaning up animal waste and disposing of it properly
- Using the toilet facilities supplied by Greenview rather than the surrounding area
- Keeping fuels, oils, soaps, and chemicals away from water
- Respecting shoreline vegetation and natural buffers
- Following signage and recreation guidelines around the lakes

Greenview continues to work with provincial partners, local organizations, and watershed stakeholders to improve monitoring, emergency response planning, public education, and long-term protection strategies for the Victor Lake and Grande Cache Lake watershed system.

Protecting source water is a shared responsibility — and an important investment in the health, environment, and future of the Grande Cache community.

IS YOUR MAILING ADDRESS UP TO DATE?

Greenview uses information from the Alberta Land Titles Office to send property tax notices and other important mail about your property.

Many property owners still have an old mailing address on their land title. This often happens because the address listed was the one used when the property was purchased.

If your mailing address is not correct, you may not receive:

- Property tax notices
- Land development or planning notices
- Legal notices
- Service updates
- Other important information about your property

Keeping your address up to date helps you:

- Avoid late payment penalties on property taxes
- Make sure you receive notices on time
- Protect your right to appeal assessments or decisions
- Stay informed about changes that may affect your property or business

Where Does Greenview Get Mailing Addresses?

Greenview gets mailing addresses directly from Alberta Land Titles.

The mailing address listed on your land title is used for all official notices and legal documents. Municipal staff cannot change land title information for you.

Only the property owner can update this information through Alberta Land Titles.
Your Responsibility as a Property Owner
It is the property owner's responsibility to keep land title information correct.

You must contact Alberta Government Land Titles if you:

- Move or change your mailing address
- Change your name
- Purchase or transfer property

Didn't Receive Your Tax Notice?

Property tax notices are usually mailed in the spring.

If you have not received your notice by June 1, contact Greenview's Taxation & Assessment Department.

Not receiving a tax notice does not remove your responsibility to pay property taxes on time.

How to Update Your Information

To update your name or mailing address, contact the Alberta Government Land Titles Office.

You will need:

- The legal description of your property
- Your updated name and/or mailing address

Note: Municipal staff cannot update land title records on your behalf.

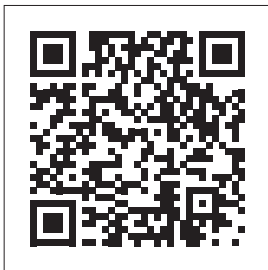
GREENVIEW AREA STRUCTURE PLAN – TOWNSHIP RD 690 (GROVEDALE)



Greenview has started working on a new Area Structure Plan (ASP) for two quarter sections of land located approximately 10 kilometres south of Grovedale at the intersection of Highway 40 and Township Road 690.

An ASP provides a long-term vision for a particular portion of land. It lays out types and locations of potential development, supports coordinated and sustainable economic growth, and plans how development will be serviced with utilities. Having an ASP in place ensures that development respects neighbouring property owners and is aligned with the MD's vision for growth. It also allows growth to be properly managed and occur in a sustainable way.

PROTECTING TREES FROM VOLE DAMAGE

Voles are small, mouse-like rodents that can cause serious damage to young trees, fruit trees, and ornamental shrubs. In Alberta, meadow and prairie voles are common in orchards, gardens, shelterbelts, and landscaped areas. Damage is most common during winter and early spring when food sources are limited, and voles feed on bark, roots, and lower stems.



One of the most damaging behaviours is girdling, where voles chew around the trunk and remove the bark and cambium layer that transports water and nutrients throughout the tree. Complete girdling often kills young trees, while partial damage can weaken growth and reduce productivity. Voles may also feed on roots below the soil surface, causing wilting, stunted growth, poor fruit production, and even tree failure.

Preventing damage begins with reducing vole habitat. Keeping grass and weeds trimmed, maintaining mulch at least six inches away from trunks, and limiting snow buildup around trees can make sites less attractive to voles. Plastic tree guards are one of the most effective protective measures and should extend below the soil surface and several feet above ground. White guards also help prevent sunscald and provide protection from rabbits and deer.

Natural predators such as owls, hawks, foxes, badgers, snakes, and domestic cats help control vole populations. In severe infestations, trapping or rodent control products may be required, while removing debris and dense vegetation can further discourage vole activity. With proper monitoring and preventative measures, homeowners and growers can significantly reduce the risk of vole damage and protect the health of their trees.

Mission Possible: Building an Organizational Plan training session was held on May 20, 2026, at the Grovedale Community Hall. We welcomed 14 attendees from various organizations across Greenview, the County of GP and surrounding areas.

The session focused on practical ideas, tools and templates to help organizations build a strong, usable organizational plan. Those in attendance requested more in-depth content regarding organizational planning. The top 4 ideas for future sessions were grant writing, fundraising, board governance and volunteer recruitment and retention.



2026 BUDGET AT A GLANCE OVERVIEW

The 2026 Operating and Capital Budgets were adopted by Council at the Regular Council Meeting on March 24, 2026.

Budget highlights are as follows:

Greenview Council remains focused on the continued development of critical infrastructure, the maintenance and enhancement of essential community programs and services, and the continued support of regional partnerships and collaborations.

The operating budget of \$237.1 million includes \$120.4 million for general operations, \$28.7 million for amortization and accretion, \$36.0 million in transfers to reserves and capital, and \$54.0 million in requisitions, including the Provincial Education, Seniors Foundations, and Designated Industrial Property requisitions, all of which are mandated by the Province.

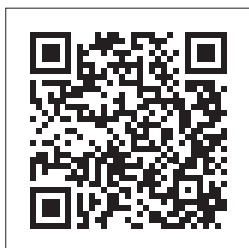
As part of the operating budget, \$22.4 million has been allocated to municipal partners and non-profit organizations through Greenview’s Community Services Grants programs and community partnerships, which include support for the operations of libraries, museums, and community halls across the municipality as well as the stewardship of the community cemeteries.

Council approved \$116.9 million in capital projects, including \$68.2 million carried over from the previous year. The capital budget was approached with careful deliberation, without sacrificing any planned infrastructure projects, and remains fully funded through debentures, transfers from the operating budget, restricted reserves, and grant funding.

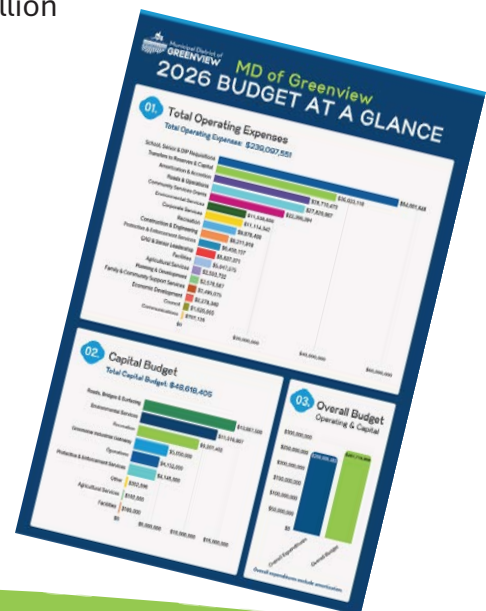

- **Grande Cache Distribution Pumphouse Upgrades - \$2.4 million**
- **Hamlet Curb & Gutter Resurfacing (Grande Cache, Little Smoky, DeBolt) - \$2.1 million**
- **Dry Rescue Replacement (Grovedale) - \$1.6 million**

Snowplowing Season: YES... we said the "S" word in July!



Planning ahead for winter may feel early, but it's never too soon to get ready. Greenview provides residential snowplowing services to eligible properties in accordance with Policy 4020: Snowplowing of Rural Residential Driveways (current version or as updated). Applicants are encouraged to review this policy.

Please note that this service is not available for:

- Parcels smaller than five acres
- Non-residential properties
- Properties located within hamlets
- Institutional properties
- High-density subdivisions or gated communities

To receive service, eligible applicants must complete an annual Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement. New applicants can visit

any Greenview office (Valleyview Administration Building, or the DeBolt, Grovedale, or Grande Cache Public Service Buildings) to register and receive a Snowplow Request Sign and registration sticker. Returning applicants must renew their agreement each year and obtain the annual registration sticker.

Seniors and individuals with disabilities are exempt from snowplowing fees; however, they must still complete the annual agreement and provide valid proof of age or disability (e.g., government-issued ID or disability placard).

Important Reminders:

- Applications and renewals must be completed by the last Friday of October each year.
- The annual registration sticker must be displayed on your issued sign to receive service.
- Driveways are cleared as time and operational priorities allow, using available equipment best suited for the area.

Getting prepared now helps ensure service when winter arrives!

Operations Updates:

- Road maintenance is underway across Greenview throughout the summer and fall months. Please watch for crews repairing and installing culverts, line painting, pothole patching, mowing, road grading, and more.
- Roadside ditch mowing typically begins in June and continues into mid-October.
- Roadside brushing begins in May and continues until the end of October.
- Greenview's gravel (regravelling) program typically starts in the rural residential areas in July. Please use caution around working equipment and trucks.

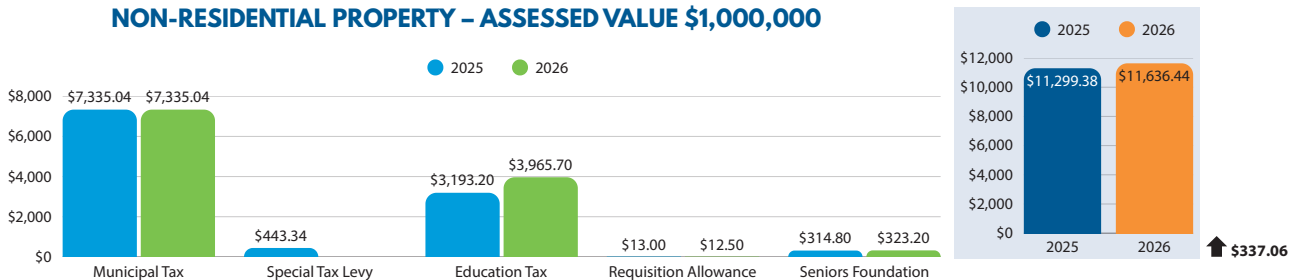

First aid is a valuable life skill that saves lives by providing people with the skills and judgment to respond to a variety of first aid emergencies. Comprehensive training covering all aspects of first aid and CPR. This course is for those who want an in-depth understanding of first aid, such as medical/legal aspects, spinal injuries, heat or cold injuries, bone and joint injuries, abdominal and chest injuries, burns, and medical emergencies.

BRONZE MEDALLION/BRONZE CROSS COMBO

WHEN: July 6-10, 2026

TIME: 8:30 - 4:30 pm

COST: \$190.00 + GST

PRE-REQUISITES: Bronze Star or 13 years old and basic first aid.

Bronze Medallion and Bronze Cross are prerequisites for the National Lifeguard award. The Bronze Medal award family gets you on the fast track towards developing the fitness, skills and knowledge to perform a water rescue and respond to a non-aquatic emergency. Bronze Medallion Award teaches an understanding of the lifesaving principles embodied in the four components of water rescue education: judgment, knowledge, skill and fitness.

Rescuers learn tows, carries, and defense and release methods in preparation for challenging rescues of increased risk involving conscious and unconscious victims of various types. Lifesavers

develop stroke efficiency and endurance in a timed swim.

Bronze Cross is designed for lifesavers who want the challenge of more advanced training, including an introduction to safe supervision in aquatic facilities.

Bronze Cross is the prerequisite for all advanced training programs, including National Lifeguard and Instructor certification.

PRE-REQUISITES: AB Workplace Approved Intermediate (Standard) First Aid with CPR Level C, Bronze Cross (need not be current), Age 15+

National Lifeguard certification is Canada's professional lifeguard standard. National Lifeguard training develops a sound understanding of lifeguarding principles, good judgment, and a mature and responsible attitude towards the lifeguard's role. National Lifeguard training emphasizes prevention and an effective rescue response in emergencies, including first aid. Candidates develop teamwork, leadership and communication skills. Fitness requirements include a timed object recovery, a 50 m sprint challenge, a 50 m rescue drill, and a 400 m endurance challenge.
