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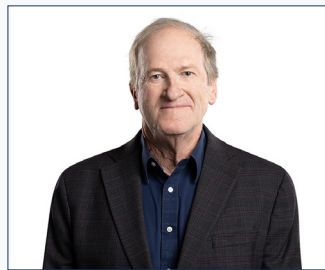

# PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT PLANS

We know property taxes can feel like they show up all at once - and usually at the worst time.

That's why Greenview offers property tax payment plans to help spread payments out over the year.

- Smaller monthly payments
- Easier budgeting
- One less thing to stress about

If breaking it up sounds better than paying it all at once, we've got you covered.

**Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP)** allows you to pay your annual taxes in twelve monthly installments beginning in January and concluding in December.

Monthly payments are based on previous year's annual levy divided by twelve and adjusted in May, when the tax notices are issued to ensure taxes are paid in full by year-end. Payments are automatically withdrawn from your account on the last business day of every month.

Once enrolled, TIPP continues each year automatically.

Tax Arrears Payment Plan (TAPP) assists property owners with outstanding taxes from previous years. Under this plan, the arrears, estimated taxes for the coming year and applicable penalties are distributed over a maximum of two-year term. Payments may be amended to reflect changes in assessments or levies to ensure taxes are covered over the term of the agreement.

Payments will automatically be taken from your account for the term of the agreement.

Once you are back in current standings, your enrollment in the TIPP will help maintain timely payments and prevent future penalties.

# NOTICE TO RATEPAYERS - 2026 SCHEDULE OF FEES

Greenview Council has adopted Bylaw 25-1009, the 2026 Schedule of Fees, which includes updates to select Environmental Services rates and the introduction of several new service-related fees.

**A summary of the approved changes is outlined below.**

## Updated Water Rates:

- **Hamlet Residential Rate** (over 15 m<sup>3</sup>/month): \$4.25 per m<sup>3</sup> (previously \$4.00 per m<sup>3</sup>)
- **Hamlet Commercial Rate:** \$4.25 per m<sup>3</sup> (previously \$4.00 per m<sup>3</sup>)
- **Potable Water Points – Commercial:** \$10.50 per m<sup>3</sup> (previously \$9.00 per m<sup>3</sup>)
- **Non-Potable Water Points:** \$3.00 per m<sup>3</sup> (previously \$2.00 per m<sup>3</sup>)
- **Lagoon Disposal – Commercial, Industrial, & Non-Greenview Resident:** \$14.00 per m<sup>3</sup> (previously \$12.00 per m<sup>3</sup>)
- **Lagoon Disposal – Residential & Verified Non-Profit:** \$14.00 per m<sup>3</sup> (previously \$3.00 per m<sup>3</sup>)

## New Fees:

### Stormwater Management Fee

- \$2.00 per month, billed on sewer utility accounts  
This new fee provides a dedicated and equitable funding source for maintaining Greenview's stormwater infrastructure, including the Grande Cache storm system and the municipal ditch and drainage network throughout the municipality. The fee supports flood prevention, environmental protection, and long-term asset management while reducing reliance on property tax funding for drainage maintenance.

## Service-Based Fees (Applied by Request Only)

The following fees apply only when services are requested and are not part of routine billing:

- **Administrative Fee (process of account/ service change):** \$35.00  
Applies to customer-requested account or service changes that require manual staff processing outside routine billing. Routine billing and basic account updates are not affected.
- **Hydrant Flow Test (by request):** \$500.00 per hydrant  
This service is available for private hydrants where property owners request flow testing to confirm hydrant performance for fire protection, insurance, or operational purposes.
- **Flow Test Information Request (Water):** \$100.00 per request  
Applies to requests for existing water system flow test data or documentation.
- **Private Hydrant Maintenance & Flushing** (plus material cost): \$180.00 per hydrant  
This service is offered upon request for private hydrants and includes inspection, flushing, and basic maintenance to verify hydrant functionality and operational standards. The service supports fire protection and public safety and allows property owners to confirm that private hydrants are operable and maintained.

These updates support the ongoing operation, maintenance, and long-term sustainability of Greenview's municipal infrastructure.

# GRANTS & POST-SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIPS

## Community Impact Grants

Not-for-profit organizations and Registered Societies looking to strengthen/grow services within Greenview and the greater Region may apply for an operating and/or capital grant from Greenview once per year. Council assesses each application with a focus on its impact and social well-being, based on the impact of the Greenview community.

**Community Impact Grant applications are accepted once annually by April 15.**

## Post-Secondary Scholarships

Greenview Council supports applicants pursuing post-secondary education in trades and apprenticeship fields, college, and university.

### ► Degree Program Scholarship:

Students enrolled in an integrated course of study leading to an academic degree are eligible for \$2,500 in funding, with \$25,000 in dedicated funding allocated annually.

### ► Trade-Diploma Program Scholarships:

Students enrolled in a program of study that leads to the granting of a diploma or certificate or involves a trade or apprenticeship program are eligible for \$1,500 in funding, with \$15,000 in dedicated funding allocated annually.

**The application deadline is June 30th annually.**

### ► Competition Sponsorship Program:

Greenview will financially assist non-profit organizations and school groups or individuals when they qualify to compete at provincial, national and/or international levels to recognize their significant achievement.

# CONSTRUCTION & ENGINEERING



## Traffic Counts

Administration has been busy collecting data internally since 2023. Throughout 2026 you will see traffic counters located strategically along the roadways to collect the data. This will allow Greenview to determine future road planning, asphalt and maintenance requirements. You can see these on power poles and traffic signs.

## Other works throughout Greenview

Other work you may notice this year includes line painting, asphalt repairs, crack sealing, spray patching, and curb and gutter repairs.

Line painting is done every year. While it may seem unnecessary, the paint used is a water based latex that is much more cost effective. The use of this type of paint has increased due to environmental regulations that limit the amount of solvent allowed in paints.

Asphalt repairs will also take place throughout Greenview. This work includes fixing dips in the road, areas where asphalt has failed, and locations where water or utility repairs have been completed.

### What is crack sealing?

Crack sealing is an asphalt maintenance method used for small cracks up to 17 millimetres wide. The cracks are cleaned, and a heated sealant is applied level with the road surface. This helps prevent water from entering the road and causing further damage.

### What is spray patching?

Spray patching is used for larger cracks, usually wider than 17 millimetres. The cracks are cleaned, coated with asphalt binder, and then filled with a mixture of asphalt and gravel. Contractors have up to 72 hours to sweep the road after the work is completed.

Curb and gutter areas in hamlets have been inspected and ranked by priority. Priority 1 indicates higher need, while Priority 2 is lower. Administration is currently working on locations in DeBolt and Grande Cache.

This maintenance work helps extend the life of existing infrastructure. It supports responsible use of public funds while maintaining safe and reliable roads for everyone who travels in Greenview.

## Road Bans. Did You Know...

## Watch for these signs

The Construction and Engineering Department will be placing construction signs at several locations this year. These signs will let drivers know where road work is taking place.

You may see construction signs at the following locations:

### **Valleyview Golf Course Road (Township Road 673A / Range Road 221A Overlay)**

This project covers about 3 kilometres of road, starting south of Secondary Highway 665. Work will include road repairs, drainage improvements, and replacing culverts where needed.

### **Forestry Trunk Road, Phase 7 (KM 142.3 to 148.2)**

This project includes about 6 kilometres of road work. Crews will be reshaping and realigning the road. Work will include excavation, placing

topsoil, adding gravel, preparing the road base, installing stabilization materials, replacing culverts, and controlling erosion.

### **Range Road 21 (Goodwin Road) and Old High Prairie Road – SB 90 Application**

Both locations are about 9 kilometres long. Work will include grading, adding gravel, mixing and spreading oil, and packing the road surface.

Drivers are asked to watch for signs and use caution in construction areas.

## KEEPING OUR TRANSFER SITES CLEAN & SAFE

Greenview's annual Transfer Site Litter Pick is a non-profit community initiative that focuses on caring for the environment and improving local transfer stations. Held once each year, the event gives volunteers a chance to make a clear and lasting difference by removing litter that has built up over time. It also provides an opportunity for participating groups to raise funds while supporting a worthwhile cause.

Litter can enter transfer sites in many ways. It may come from unloading activities, strong winds, weather conditions, or regular site use. If left behind, debris can harm wildlife, block drainage areas, damage site conditions, and affect the overall appearance of the site. The litter pick helps address these concerns by focusing on key areas such as roadsides, green spaces, ditches, and fence lines. All waste is collected and handled safely and responsibly.

Volunteer safety is a priority throughout the event. Participants receive clear instructions and are provided with the proper equipment before starting. High-visibility vests, gloves, and suitable footwear are required at all times. Volunteers are asked to watch for traffic, uneven ground, and other potential hazards. Any hazardous materials found during the clean-up are not handled by volunteers and are reported to the Greenview Supervisor for proper disposal.

In addition to the environmental benefits, the litter pick helps build awareness about the effects of litter and the importance of proper waste disposal. The event encourages responsible habits and pride in shared spaces. By working together, volunteers help create cleaner sites, healthier surroundings, and stronger connections between Greenview and local community groups.

This annual effort shows what can be achieved through teamwork and community involvement. The Transfer Site Litter Pick continues to support a cleaner environment and a more caring community for everyone.

# THE DANGERS OF BATTERIES IN LANDFILL OPERATIONS

Batteries present a significant and growing safety risk when they enter the landfill waste stream. Many common batteries — including lithium-ion, lithium metal, alkaline, and rechargeable batteries — are designed to store energy. When these batteries are disposed of improperly and handled as regular waste, the stored energy can be released in dangerous ways.

During landfill operations, waste is compacted, moved, and buried using a track loader and compactor. Batteries can be crushed, punctured, or damaged during these processes. When this occurs, batteries may overheat, spark, or ignite, leading to fires or explosions. Lithium-based batteries are particularly hazardous, as they can burn at extremely high temperatures and are difficult to extinguish once ignited.

Landfill fires caused by batteries pose serious risks to our workers and equipment. Fires can start unexpectedly, spread rapidly, and smoulder undetected beneath the waste surface for extended periods. These incidents can result in injuries, equipment damage, landfill closures, and the release of harmful black smoke into the air.

Beyond fire risk, damaged batteries can also

leak hazardous chemicals into the landfill, increasing the risk for dangerous environmental contamination. As battery use continues to rise with the growth of electronics, power tools, toys, and electric vehicles, the risk associated with improper battery disposal is increasing as well.

Preventing battery-related incidents starts with proper disposal. Batteries should never be placed in regular garbage and must be separated for recycling or disposal through approved hazardous waste programs. Greenview has special boxes at all public buildings to place batteries for recycling. At the landfill, there is a dedicated area for battery recycling.

By understanding the dangers batteries pose and taking proactive steps to manage them correctly, landfill operations can significantly reduce fire risk, protect the environment, and maintain safe and reliable waste management services.



## GRANDE CACHE TRANSFER STATION NOW OPEN

The Grande Cache Transfer Station is now open, introducing a cleaner and safer way to manage waste. Landfill waste will now be diverted into the transfer bins. Please follow on-site signage and our staff will be available to assist, guide, and answer questions during the transition period. The Grande Cache Transfer Station remains located 1.2 km north of Grande Cache off of Highway 40.

### Waste Separation:

To keep the site safe, clean, and efficient, all waste must be separated into proper categories.

### Transfer Bins – What Is Allowed:

Household waste only. This includes:

- Bagged kitchen & bathroom waste
- Regular weekly household refuse





## DID YOU KNOW? GRANDE CACHE'S DRINKING WATER STARTS AT VICTOR LAKE

Grande Cache is fortunate to be surrounded by clean, natural water sources that play a vital role in supporting our community's daily life. At the heart of our municipal drinking water system is Victor Lake, which serves as the Hamlet's primary source of raw water.

To help ensure a reliable and sustainable supply, Victor Lake is connected to Grande Cache Lake through a canal, creating an integrated system that helps maintain adequate water levels, particularly during periods of seasonal change, high demand, or dry conditions.

This thoughtful design reflects long-term planning to protect both water quality and availability for residents, now and into the future.

### How the System Works

Water is drawn from Victor Lake through the municipal raw water intake to the Grande Cache Water Treatment Plant, where it is treated

and tested to meet provincial drinking water standards before being distributed throughout the community.

Grande Cache Lake plays an important supporting role in this system. While it is primarily used for recreation, its connection to Victor Lake through the canal helps maintain overall system resilience and water level management.

### A Protected and Regulated Water Source

Grande Cache's water supply operates under a provincial water license issued by the Government of Alberta, which regulates the amount of water that can be withdrawn annually and how the system is monitored. Water levels and diversion volumes are regularly measured and reported to ensure the system remains sustainable and environmentally responsible. This oversight helps protect the long-term health of our lakes, downstream waterways, and the community's drinking water supply.

## Recreation and Respect for the Source

Both lakes are valued community spaces:

- Victor Lake allows swimming and fishing, but motorized watercraft are not permitted to help protect water quality at the source.
- Grande Cache Lake supports a wider range of recreational activities, including motorized watercraft.

Because Victor Lake is the community's drinking water source, small actions make a big difference. Residents and visitors are encouraged to help protect the lakes by:

- Keeping shorelines clean
- Properly disposing of waste
- Cleaning up after pets
- Avoiding fuel, soap, or chemicals near the water
- Respecting posted guidelines and natural vegetation

## Working Together to Protect Our Water

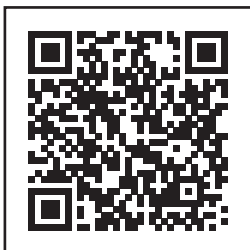

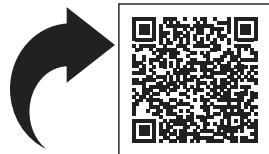

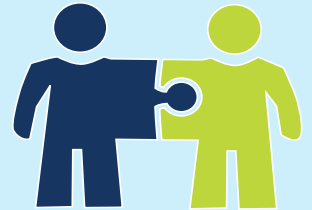

We encourage residents who live in one of the five Steering Committee Areas to apply if they have an interest in long term community planning, are willing to participate in meetings and workshops, and want to contribute to decisions that will shape Greenview's future.

The Steering Committee will operate throughout the MDP development process, with periodic workshops and review sessions over an anticipated 12 to 18 month term.

# OPERATIONS

## Greenview's 2026 Schedule of Fees Bylaw 25-1009 includes updated dust control rates:

- Residential (per 200 meters)
- \$400.00/200m (previously \$375.00/200m)
- Multi-Parcel Subdivisions (per 100 meters)
- \$225.00/100m (previously \$200.00/100m)

It may interest you to know that... The minimum cost to Greenview to apply calcium chloride to 200m of roadway is approximately \$1,500.00.

## Operations Updates:

- Road maintenance work is ongoing in all areas of Greenview throughout the summer months. Please watch for crews repairing and installing culverts, line painting, pothole patching, mowing, grading, and more.
- Roadside ditch mowing typically begins in June and continues into mid-October. Each year, crews proceed in different directions to have the program move through different rural residential areas in the annual timeline, finishing the year on the Forestry Trunk Road.
- Greenview's road regraveling program typically begins on the Forestry Trunk Road in May and in rural residential areas in July. Please use caution around working equipment and trucks.
- Similar to 2025, multiple rural roads have been identified to have a dust control product applied. This service focuses on major and minor collector roads, roads that are designated routes to Greenview sites while also considering traffic volumes and numbers of residences along the route, roads that are known to require excessive maintenance, are prone to washboard conditions, or generate excessive dust due to consistent and heavy use.

## 2026 Dust Control Application Deadline April 15, 2026



### Did You Know...

Greenview's rural residential dust control program runs from May into June each year and offers residents and property owners the opportunity to apply for dust control on rural roads in front of residences. Dust control involves the application of a dust control agent to gravel roads to minimize dust. The dust suppressant agent used within Greenview is Calcium Chloride.

Applications will be accepted up to and including April 15. Late applications may be accepted and are subject to a late dust control application fee as per the Greenview Schedule of Fees Bylaw. The acceptance of late applications is not guaranteed and is subject to product availability, operational priorities, and the scheduling of the dust control program.

# IS YOUR MAILING ADDRESS UP TO DATE?

Greenview uses information from the Alberta Land Titles Office to send property tax notices and other important mail about your property.

Many property owners still have an old mailing address on their land title. This often happens because the address listed was the one used when the property was purchased.

## If your mailing address is not correct, you may not receive:

- Property tax notices
- Land development or planning notices
- Legal notices
- Service updates
- Other important information about your property

## Keeping your address up to date helps you:

- Avoid late payment penalties on property taxes
- Make sure you receive notices on time
- Protect your right to appeal assessments or decisions
- Stay informed about changes that may affect your property or business

## Where Does Greenview Get Mailing Addresses?

Greenview gets mailing addresses directly from Alberta Land Titles.

The mailing address listed on your land title is used for all official notices and legal documents. Municipal staff cannot change land title information for you.

Only the property owner can update this information through Alberta Land Titles.

## Your Responsibility as a Property Owner

It is the property owner's responsibility to keep land title information correct.

You must contact Alberta Government Land Titles if you:

- Move or change your mailing address
- Change your name
- Purchase or transfer property

## Didn't Receive Your Tax Notice?

Property tax notices are usually mailed in the spring.

If you have not received your notice by June 1, contact Greenview's Taxation & Assessment Department.

Not receiving a tax notice does not remove your responsibility to pay property taxes on time.

## How to Update Your Information

To update your name or mailing address, contact the Alberta Government Land Titles Office.

## You will need:

- The legal description of your property
- Your updated name and/or mailing address

**Note:** Municipal staff cannot update land title records on your behalf.
