



Thorhild County declares "State of Agricultural Disaster"

THORHILD, AB – During the December 13, 2016 Thorhild County Council meeting, Council unanimously voted to declare a State of Agricultural Disaster within Thorhild County. Excessive moisture conditions this past summer and fall has resulted in agricultural hardship within Thorhild County boundaries.

"The agriculture industry is a vital economic driver in the County. By County Council declaring a State of Agricultural Disaster in Thorhild County, Council hopes to draw attention to the very difficult conditions facing all grain and livestock producers, and will request that provincial and federal government officials establish a disaster recovery program," says Reeve Wayne Croswell. "After the wet conditions this past fall, many farmers still have their crops in the fields."

"The Alberta Crop Report (as of November 29, 2016), Agriculture Financial Services Corporation reporting, and Thorhild County Agricultural Services have all determined that approximately 45 percent of crops are unharvested," says Clarence Dowhan, Thorhild County Agricultural Fieldman. "We consider crop reporting, our discussions with producers and visual inspections to determine whether a State of Agricultural Disaster should be declared."

Cereals are ranked "expected diminished crop yield" as 20 percent of crops are still in the field. Oil seed crops are 45 percent in swath and still standing which are approaching definite disaster thresholds. Hay crops are cut and baled over most of the County; however, much of it is still in the field. Weather conditions this past fall have had a definite effect on hay quality.

Ten to fifteen percent of the crops that have been harvested during excessive moisture conditions have added immensely to producer expenses for drying of the commodities, machinery costs due to operating in adverse conditions, and loss of commodities due to spoilage in the field and in storage.

Thorhild County is located 100 kilometers northeast of Edmonton.
