 Firstly, thank you to the MD for your continued support over the past number of years.

 We greatly appreciate it, and wished to take this opportunity to give you a very brief update on Evergreen Park while we made our Proposal to you

Evergreen Park 2021 Update YTD

- Although we had significant less events in 2021 again, and our Casino and Lounge were closed for ½ of the year, there were still many things that we were able to do to remain connected to the Community, and still generate some income.
- It is important to note that many areas of the Park still needed to be kept open and maintained in spite of the lower Events (ie- TARA Centre, etc,) We are also a designated EVAC Centre for the Region.
- There were a number of ways that we were able to creatively still be that presence for the Region, and serve the area:




Weddings during a Pandemic:










LEWIS HAWKES Renovation



The new Arena Upgrades will include:

- New LED Lighting (including Parking Lot Lighting)
- New tin exterior and interior
- New Washrooms
- Significant Seating upgrades and additions
- Horse Wash Bays
- Concession
- Lounge and Bar area
- Announcers booth
- Tractor Storage Shed
- New Front entrance
- Wheelchair accessible entrance

Prior to Covid we had applied for (and now received) a Matching CFEP Grant for an upgrade to the Lewis Hawkes Arena-

Matching Grant amount - \$437,000 (We have raised approx. - \$275,000 of the matching funds, and are actively working on raising the rest)

• Please note- as a significant part of the cost savings for this renovation project, we have been able to utilize our staff for the demolition portion of the project.

- Many Businesses and Organizations had agreed to help support our Matching grant Monies once we received the approval from the Alberta Government
- However shortly after we received the Grant news, COVID hit. A great number of those that said they would support our renovation Financially, we now unable to do so. Many of them were doing their best just to survive.
- We completely understood this of course, and have worked very hard to find others to help us with the Matching Funding
- To date we have raised over \$275,000 of the matching \$437,000 that we need. We are approx. \$162,000 short, and are asking you to please help us. (The County has given us \$150,000, and also continued to support us additionally since COVID hit)



- We are asking the MD to please contribute \$75,000 towards the matching Renovations costs for the Lewis Hawkes upgrades.
- We sincerely believe this renovation will enhance the experience of many Regional Groups and Associations at the Lewis Hawkes, similar to what we experienced with the Clarkson Hall Renovations

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

It was brought up at the organizational meeting if members at large could be appointed to their respective board for a period of four years rather than the one or two years that they are currently appointed for.

In order to do so, bylaws that govern each Council Committee would need to be amended or repealed and replaced.

Bylaw 97-224 Agricultural Service Board currently appoints 5 members at large for a period of a term of one year. A new bylaw or an amendment bylaw would need to be created.

Bylaw 14-722 Green View Family and Community Support Services creates the FCSS board and the Joint Family and Community Support Services Agreement governs it. Under which one member-at-large is appointed by resolution of each respective Councils for a terms of one year, and may be re-appointed upon the expiry of the term at the pleasure of the Councils. To alter the length of time members-at-large are appointed the Town of Valleyview would need to agree and a new agreement drawn up and signed by both parities.

Bylaw 20-861 establishes the Greenview Regional Multiplex Advisory Board, which states that the board will consist of 5 members-at-large appointed by Greenview at annual organizational meetings. This bylaw would need to be amended or repealed and replaced to increase the length of time members-at-large are appointed.

Bylaw 17-001 Greenview Regional Waste Management Commission appoints members, Greenview has the ability to appoint one Director-at-Large for a term of one year under the bylaw. In order to change the appointment length of directors for this board, Greenview, the Town of Valleyview and the Town of Fox Creek would need to be in agreement and a new bylaw or an amendment to this bylaw would need to be passed and receive ministerial approval from the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

Bylaw 18-805 Municipal Library Board establishes the Municipal Library Board for the MD of Greenview. In which, 5 members-at-large are appointed for a term of one year. An amendment to this bylaw or a repeal and replace would need to be completed and any agreements with surrounding municipalities would also need to be amended.

Bylaw 13-710 Subdivision and Development Appeal Board appoints 5 members-at-large and two members from Council for an annual term. To change this, the bylaw would need to be repealed and replaced with a new one. However, SDAB training is required to be completed every three years, therefore an appointment for an entire Council term is not advised.

Bylaw 94-045 Valleyview and District Recreation Board is established by this bylaw. 3 members-at-large are appointed, the length of time in which they are appointed is not included in the bylaw. An agreement cannot be located in our records at this time, however once located it will need to be updated with the consent of Valleyview to accommodate for a longer appointment.

1. Council will be able to make an informed decision regarding altering the length of time members-atlarge are appointed to Council Committees and Boards

A motion can be brought back. In accordance with section 14.16B of Bylaw 21-876 Procedural Bylaw

A Councillor may only introduce a motion asking Council to reconsider a matter dealt with in a previous motion if: a Notice of Motion is submitted prior to the meeting at which it is to be considered, in which the Councillor sets out what special or exceptional circumstances warrant Council considering the matter again;

The motion for reintroduction will need to be voted on by Council and if carried the original motion will once again be on the floor.

Further, in accordance with section 4.2 of Bylaw 21-876

In the absence of any statutory obligation, any provision of this Bylaw may be temporarily waived, altered or suspended by Special Resolution (two-thirds majority vote)

There are no statutory obligations regarding the parliamentary procedure of reconsidering motions, therefore Council may make a resolution to temporarily suspend section 14.16.D that limits asking Council to reconsider a matter unless six (6) months have passed since the motion was last considered. The vote to do so would need to be passed by a two-thirds majority and if passed, the original motion is on the floor.



Alberta Environment and Parks (AEP) has approved a habitat restoration project in the Little Smoky Caribou Range for the Forest Resource Improvement Association (FRIAA). Westcore Contracting Inc. (WCI) and Woodlands North Inc. (Woodlands) will implement the restoration of over 383km of legacy seismic lines occurring in an area of roughly 15,364 hectares (ha) within the Little Smoky Caribou Range (see enclosed map) from December 1, 2021-August 31, 2022.

We have identified the Municipal District of Greenview as a stakeholder with boundaries encompassing our project areas of LSM1 and LSM3. A critical success factor for the project is meaningful involvement of local stakeholders where the operational work will occur. WCI would like to notify you of the project and verify if you have any current or future planned operations in the project area so that we may minimize or mitigate any potential disruption.

Planned project treatment options along these seismic lines are detailed below:

- Mounding compacted wet soils in frozen conditions to prepare the ground for improved growing conditions
- Screefing in drier areas to remove competing grass species before tree planting conifer seedlings
- Planting all prepared soil on seismic lines during summer conditions
- Access management will occur to prevent humans from entering the treated lines. Intensified mounding, tree felling from adjacent forest stands, and project signage will be applied to the legacy seismic lines and at key OHV access points from roads







BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

On April 13, 2021, Councillor Delorme made the following motion;

That Council direct Administration to engage in a feasibility study into acquiring the road systems in the Co-operatives and Enterprises to create a registered road right-of-way and registered road plans.

On July 19, 2021, Administration held the first of two open houses in Grande Cache to meet with the Coops and Enterprises on a Road Network System. Prior to the meeting a survey was delivered to each home, by a member of Victor Lake Cooperative. This member sat with each home and explained what Greenview was asking and aided in completing the survey.

The first open house was set up so that each member of the Cooperative/Enterprise could share their ideas and concerns for a Road Network System. Administration also engaged with those in attendance, providing information on the process of Greenview acquiring the right-of-way for each of these road networks systems and providing maps of suggested roadways.

Surveys received from the residents of the Coops/Enterprises indicated that the residents were resistant to Greenview acquiring right-of-way. Administration explained that Greenview would need to purchase a right-of-way of 15, 20 or 30 meters.

- 15-meter right-of-way Greenview will only maintain the roads, snowplow, dust control, the possibility of small culverts.
- 20-meter right-of-way Greenview will be limited, dependant on how much fall for the ditching. We have a standard that we follow
- 30-meter right-of-way will get you everything.

Administration also advised that any land purchased by Greenview would be considered public lands.

Overall, this open house was relatively well received, with 28 residents in attendance.

On September 20, 2021, Administration held a second meeting with members of the Coops and Enterprises. This meeting was with members of individual Coops/Enterprises, as to answer questions which pertained specifically to their community. Victor Lake, Muskeg Seepee, Grande Cache Lake and Susa Creek took advantage of the second meeting and received clarification on what Greenview would need to maintain roads within their Coops.

At this time none of the Cooperatives or Enterprises are interested in selling right-of-way for a road network system.

Administration will continue to plow the school bus route within the Cooperatives as per Greenview Policy 4020;

7. An exception is made to this policy for the Grande Cache Co-operatives as follows provided Permission to Enter agreements are signed by each Co-operative.

7.1 Residents of the Co-operatives may purchase, in advance, snowplow flags for residential driveways from the Grande Cache Public Services Building for snowplowing services. The fee is established by Council annually in accordance with the "Schedule of Fees" for Greenview. The fee for one flag shall be for each 400 meters, or portion thereof, of driveway to be cleared.

7.2 Snowplowing is to be provided at no charge by Greenview to the school bus routes located within the Grande Cache Co-operatives.

Good morning Alyssa,

Thank you for reaching out.

I have a attached a draft agreement for the Coop to review.

Specifically, Greenview is asking if Susa Creek is willing to sell Right-of-Way. Susa Creek has three options of 15, 20 or 30 meters.

15 meters – Greenview will only maintain the roads, snowplows, grading and general maintenance, and may also allow for the installation of small culverts,

20 meters – Greenview is limited on how much ditching and how many culverts as we have standards that we must follow. 20 meters would still allow for snowplows, grading and general maintenance.

30 meters – Along with installing the appropriate culverts, ditches and drainage, Greenview will be responsible for all road maintenance such as grading, and snowplows.

Dust control may be purchased by the Coop or individuals at a rate of \$150.00 per 200 meters.

**Development within Susa Creek will not change**, any development within the Coop is dependent the Coop and a Development Permit from Greenview's Planning and Development department. Any development outside the Coop is Green Zone (Provincially owned).

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF GREENVIEW No. 16

**Purpose:** To establish guidelines under which driveway clearing services may be provided to rural residents of Greenview.

### DEFINITIONS

**Greenview** means the municipal corporation of the Municipal District of Greenview No. 16.

**Hamlet Residential Property** means residential property located within a hamlet within Greenview, including Little Smoky, Ridgevalley, DeBolt, Landry Heights, Grovedale and Grande Cache.

Non-resident means a commercial or institutional property.

Rural Resident means a resident residing outside the boundaries of a hamlet of Greenview.

#### POLICY

- 1. Driveway snow removal for rural residents of Greenview will be provided by Greenview on a low priority basis.
- 2. Rural Residents who wish to have their driveways cleared must first enter into a one-time "Snowplowing Private Driveways" Agreement on the necessary forms releasing Greenview, and Greenview employees and agents from any potential liability arising from snowplow operations on private property.
- 3. The snowplowing service fee will be established by Council in the "Schedule of Fees" for Greenview.
- 4. This policy does not apply to non-residential property and hamlet residential property.
- 5. Private parking areas, granary access, hay access, and other areas are not considered driveways, and will not be cleared.
- 6. The driveway will be cleared only when all other priorities have been completed.
- 7. An exception is made to this policy for the Grande Cache Co-operatives as follows provided Permission to Enter agreements are signed by each Co-operative.

7.1 Residents of the Co-operatives may purchase, in advance, snowplow flags for residential driveways from the Grande Cache Public Services Building for

snowplowing services. The fee is established by Council annually in accordance with the "Schedule of Fees" for Greenview. The fee for one flag shall be for each 400 meters, or portion thereof, of driveway to be cleared.

7.2 Snowplowing is to be provided at no charge by Greenview to the school bus routes located within the Grande Cache Co-operatives.

### PROCEDURE

- 8. The Resident will be issued a snowplow sign indicating the resident's Agreement number. The snowplow sign is to be placed at a location that is easily visible to the operator when the Resident is requesting the snowplow service. The operator will record the agreement number acknowledging that the driveway has been plowed.
- 9. Greenview will forward statements to the Resident showing all charges incurred by the Resident for snowplowing completed by Greenview and the Resident will be required to pay for all charges not later than thirty (30) days immediately following the date of the invoice. In the event that the Resident does not pay his/her account, Greenview will not perform further snowplowing until the account is paid and any account remaining outstanding will be a debt due to Greenview.
- 10. The operator will have the right to refuse to clear a driveway should they have any doubts about safety, equipment damage, or the ability to exit the site.
- 11. If a renter does not pay the required fee, it will be applied to the landowner as per the "Snowplowing Private Driveways" Agreement.

### BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

On February 23, 2021 Council Delorme brought forward a Notice of Motion directing Administration to bring forward an RFD to conduct a feasibility study to provide rural water services to the Co-ops and Enterprises.

On March 23, 2021 Councillor Burton made the following motion;

That Council direct Administration to conduct a feasibility study to provide rural water services to the Co-operatives and Enterprises.

On July 19, 2021 Administration held an Open House in Grande Cache to meet with the Coops and Enterprises on a Water Point in their community. Prior to the meeting a survey was delivered to each home, by a member of Victor Lake Cooperative. This member sat with each home and explained what Greenview was asking and aided in completing the survey.

The open house was set up so that each member of the Cooperative/Enterprise could share their concerns and ideas for a water point. Administration also engaged with those in attendance providing information on the process of Greenview acquiring the right-of-way for the water point.

Surveys received from the residents of the Coops/Enterprise indicated that the residents were resistant to Greenview acquiring right-of-way. Administration explained that Greenview would need to purchase the right-of-way in order to erect a water point.

Greenview also advised that any land purchased by Greenview would be considered public lands.

Overall, this open house was relatively well received, with 28 residents in attendance.

On September 20, 2021, Administration held a second meeting with members of the Coops and Enterprises. This meeting was with individual Coops/Enterprises, as to answer questions which pertained specifically to the community. Victor Lake, Muskeg Seepee, Grande Cache Lake and Susa Creek took advantage of the second meeting and received clarification on what Greenview would need to do in order for each community to have a water point.

Muskeg Seepee and Susa Creek had initially showed interested in working with Greenview on a system in their respective communities. Administration has heard back form Muskeg Seepee stating they are not interested in a water point as it would have limited use. Administration has not heard back from Susa Creek.

### BENEFITS OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The benefit of Council receiving the above information, is that Council will be updated on the request to report on a water point in the Coop/Enterprises.



In order for Greenview to place the Waterpoint at your suggested site, Greenview will still need to purchase 30 meters of road right-of-way from the highway to the building site as well as 15 meters around the building.

Thank you for reaching out.

I have a attached a draft agreement for the Coop to review.

Specifically, Greenview is asking if Susa Creek is willing to sell Right-of-Way. Susa Creek has three options of 15, 20 or 30 meters.

15 meters – Greenview will only maintain the roads, snowplows, grading and general maintenance, and may also allow for the installation of small culverts,

20 meters – Greenview is limited on how much ditching and how many culverts as we have standards that we must follow. 20 meters would still allow for snowplows, grading and general maintenance.

30 meters – Along with installing the appropriate culverts, ditches and drainage, Greenview will be responsible for all road maintenance such as grading, and snowplows.

Dust control may be purchased by the Coop or individuals at a rate of \$150.00 per 200 meters.

**Development within Susa Creek will not change**, any development within the Coop is dependent the Coop and a Development Permit from Greenview's Planning and Development department. Any development outside the Coop is Green Zone (Provincially owned).
