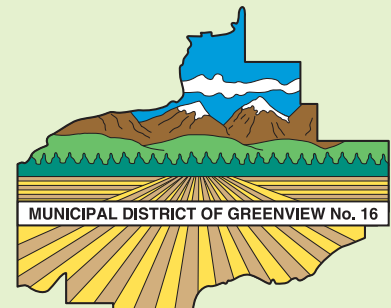

NOTICE is hereby given that a PUBLIC HEARING for Bylaw No. 23-931 being a Land Use Bylaw Amendment will be held on: April 11, 2023, at 9:15 am in the Municipal District No. 16 Administration Building, Valleyview AB.

The purpose of the bylaw is to add the Greenview Industrial Gateway – Heavy Industrial One (GIG-HI-1) District, and introduce different industrial uses compatible with the district, and rezone the parcel legally described as Plan 222 1786, Block 1, Lot 1 from Industrial General (M-2) District to Greenview Industrial Gateway – Heavy Industrial One (GIG-HI-1) District.

Council Highlights Summary - Valleyview, Alberta

January 10, 2023: Greenview Council Approves Firearms Restriction Bylaw in Hamlet of Grande Cache

In February of 2021, Council directed Administration to draft a bylaw prohibiting the use of firearms and bows within the Hamlet of Grande Cache (Ward 9). After map updates and amendments, Council approved Bylaw 21-870, and Greenview is awaiting approval by the Minister of Environment and Protected areas, as a requirement noted in the Municipal Government Act.

Operating expenses of \$154.4 million reflect an overall decrease of \$9.4 million from the 2022 Operating budget. Budget 2023 will be finalized pending the completion of property assessment values, provincial requisitions collected on behalf of the Government of Alberta, and seniors' foundation requisitions.

The 2023 Capital budget allows for infrastructure costs for roads, bridges, utilities, equipment, and buildings and includes \$58.7 million in new commitments.

The interim budget covers day-to-day operating expenses and allows projects to proceed until the final budget is approved in the spring.

Council will also set tax rates in the spring of 2023.

January 24, 2023: Greenview to explore grant funding and partnerships for communication towers on Highway 40

At the January 10, 2023, Regular Council Meeting, Reeve Olsen made a Notice of Motion that Administration explores opportunities for grant funding and partnerships for establishing communication towers on Highway 40 from Grande Cache to Grande Prairie utilizing fibre connection. Council moved to direct Administration to explore opportunities for grant funding and partnerships for communication towers to improve connectivity along this busy section of the highway.

January 24, 2023: Community Development Initiative Agreements approved by Greenview

For several years Greenview has provided funding to the Towns of Fox Creek and Valleyview through a Community Development Initiative (CDI) agreement. CDI agreements provide funding to the towns, demonstrating Greenview's recognition and commitment to the well-being of its communities, environment, and high quality of life.

Council authorized Administration to enter into a three-year (2023-2025) Community Development Initiative (CDI) Agreement with the Town of Valleyview in the yearly amount of \$3,000,000 and the Town of Fox Creek in the yearly amount of \$2,500,000 with funds to come from the Community Services Budget.

February 14, 2023: Bylaw 22-889 Tax Payment Plan to be Updated

Current delays in processing land titles for property ownership changes has presented challenges for new property owners to enroll in Greenview's Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP). Council has directed Administration to complete changes to the Bylaw to allow for new property owners to apply for the TIPP program throughout the year.

February 14, 2023: Greenview Opposition to Federal Bill C-21

Council accepted a report outlining options to show their opposition to the federal Bill C-21 Firearms Act and directed Administration to proceed with a letter to Alberta's Chief Firearms Officer, Teri Bryant, expressing Council's displeasure with Bill C-21 and offering Greenview's support in ensuring Albertan firearm independence. They further directed Administration to write to

the three Members of Parliament that represent portions of Greenview, Gerald Soroka, Arnold Viersen and Chris Warkentin to express Council's opposition to Bill C-21.

January 14, 2023: Heart River Housing Seniors Housing Project in Falher Gets Greenview Support

Heart River Housing presented at Committee of the Whole on December 20, 2022. At that time, they presented the plans for construction in 2023 to address seniors housing in Falher. Greenview is assisting HRH with securing a loan up to 10 million.

February 28, 2023: Public Engagement on Joint K-12 School Use with the Greenview Regional Multiplex Report

Council directed Administration to release the Greenview Regional Multiplex Joint Use School survey detailed report to the public.

February 28, 2023: Enhanced Level of Maintenance Service for Range Road 202 Bridge Hill

Council directed Administration to provide an enhanced level of service on Range Road 202 bridge hill near Sweathouse until June 1, 2023, due to extenuating circumstances caused by the Highway 747 bridge work restricted use.

March 14, 2023: Greenview Industrial Gateway Heavy Industrial One District Created

The proposed Greenview Industrial Gateway – Heavy Industrial – One (GIG-HI-1) District will allow appropriate permitted and discretionary uses for the types of development unique to the Greenview Industrial Gateway. The proposed GIG-HI-1 District will complement the staging plan for the Greenview Industrial Gateway (GIG) Area Structure Plan (ASP), being Bylaw 19-815. The GIG ASP is structured to take advantage of the area's location within the Montney formation and existing road, rail, water, utilities, and pipeline infrastructure. Council gave first reading to Bylaw 23-931, to amend Land Use Bylaw No. 18-800 for the addition of the Greenview Industrial Gateway and scheduled a Public Hearing:

These large-scale industrial projects will provide tremendous long-term job opportunities, local business retention and growth for all sectors in the region balanced with an environmental approach for long-term sustainability not only for the Greenview but the Grande Prairie Region.

The Greenview Industrial Gateway (GIG) is on track to become one of Canada's leading "plug and play" net-zero eco-industrial developments, setting the gold standard for low-carbon emissions for natural gas processing and manufacturing.

Construction & Engineering: Greenview Wetlands

Greenview has partnered with Alberta Environment and Parks to construct wetlands throughout Greenview. One area that has already been constructed is south of Grande Cache located between Hwy 40 and Victor Lake. Greenview has committed to finding other areas within our Municipality to incorporate wetlands. Please see the Landowner Guidance information sheet for your chance to be a part of the wetland replacement program within your community. 2023 GREENVIEW POSTSECONDARY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



Post Secondary Scholarship Program

Greenview Council supports applicants pursuing postsecondary education in trades and apprenticeship fields, college, and university.

Degree Program Scholarship

Students enrolled in an integrated course of study leading to an academic degree are eligible for \$2,500 in funding, with \$25,000.00 in dedicated funding allocated annually.

Trade-Diploma Program Scholarships

Students enrolled in a program of study that leads to the granting of a diploma or certificate or involves a trade or apprenticeship program are eligible for \$1,500 in funding, with \$15,000.00 in dedicated funding allocated annually.

The application deadline is June 30 annually.

2023 Greenview Roadside Spraying — Scheduled

Greenview's annual roadside spraying will be commencing for the 2023 season on May 1, 2023. Please be advised that Greenview Agricultural Staff will be out controlling invasive plants on municipal and private lands. Our staff will be in white Greenview pick-up trucks and wearing a hi-visibility vest while out in the field. This year crews will be focusing on the areas of New Fish Creek, Sunset House, Sweathouse, Little Smoky, and Grovedale. Spot spraying will occur in other areas, including Grande Cache.

Dust Control Program

The application deadline for the 2023 Dust Control Program is **Monday, April 17, 2023.**

All residents who wish to be considered for the program must apply each year. Greenview will supply dust control to residents, subject to payment of fee as follows:

1. The established fee will cover the first 200 meters. Any additional length over 200 meters will be paid in full by the applicant at the full cost for the dust control agent as established by Council annually.
2. Multi-Parcel Country Residential Subdivisions: Applicants with multi-parcel subdivisions have the option of applying for 100 meters of dust control at the established fee.

Road Ban Order

Effective Monday, March 27, 2023, at 9:00 am, the Municipal District of Greenview No. 16 has updated its road bans.

All Greenview gravel roads, including the Forestry Trunk Road, will be at 75% axle weights from 9:00 am to 10:00 pm.

All Greenview gravel roads, including the Forestry Trunk Road, will be at 100% axle weights from 10:00 pm to 9:00 am during frost conditions only until further notice.

All Greenview asphalt roads will be at 100% axle weights until further notice.

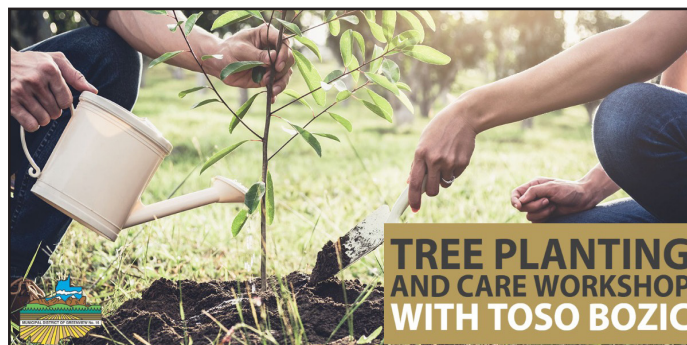
We still have lots of fruit-bearing trees available! Sour cherries, chokecherries, and saskatoons are all still available!

Greenview Riparian and Agricultural Sustainability Support (G.R.A.S.S.) is designed to help agricultural producers conduct projects and activities on their land without worrying about the financial impact. Applications will be accepted starting March 1, 2023.

GRASS will help fund up to 50% of a project's costs, to a maximum of \$5000 per project. All projects must demonstrate environmental need and must enhance or protect riparian or environmentally sensitive areas from negative effects caused by agriculture. Projects can also work to mitigate potential negative effects that may be caused by agricultural activities.

Cleanfarms Agricultural Chemical Jug Recycling Program is Changing

Cleanfarms' Ag Chem Jug Recycling Program is changing!

1. Collection sites are transitioning from municipal to retail locations

The Cleanfarms <23L container collection program is gradually changing to align with other provinces, enabling farmers to bring these empty and rinsed containers back to their local agricultural retail outlets. The transition to ag retailers is being phased in over three years.



The transition shifts the responsibility to accept empty containers from the municipality to the agricultural industry. It also simplifies farm disposal of crop input packaging since many agricultural retailers already collect other materials like drums, totes, and seed, pesticide & inoculant bags for recycling with Cleanfarms.

Within Greenview, the transfer stations will stop accepting empty, rinsed agricultural chemical containers for recycling effective March 1, 2023. After this date, your local agricultural retailer will be the primary drop-off location for these containers. Many agricultural retailers are already accepting them for recycling; however, before returning them to your local retailer (where you purchased them), please call to see if they have begun taking them.

2. Large volume agricultural plastics & packaging pickup is now available!

Since 2016, Cleanfarms has been collecting materials directly

from certain high-acreage farms across Canada. As part of our mission to provide convenient and efficient recycling programs to Canadian farmers, we are now extending the offer to pick up agricultural plastics for recycling from high-volume growers across Western Canada. Best of all, this service is available to growers that meet volume requirements, free of charge.

To be eligible for this service, growers must have (or be willing to accumulate) a minimum quantity of used agricultural waste materials that Cleanfarms recovers for recycling and/or safe disposal.

Twine

Twine – it's one of the easiest ag plastics to recycle. Of all the agricultural plastics on prairie farms, baler twine is one of the easiest to overlook when it comes to a commitment to recycle.

Unlike grain bags, which, when empty, are a massive amount of plastic laying in the field, baler twine accumulates in smaller bunches, seemingly innocuous until they start to take over a corner of the barnyard or wrap around farm equipment axles. Some farmers relegate baler twine to the burn barrel, but that's one of the worst options for managing it because burning twine releases toxins into the air.

So, what can farmers do with used agricultural twine?

In Greenview, a pilot project called, 'Alberta Ag Plastic. Recycle it!' is underway to give farmers the option to take

baler twine to Greenview Transfer Stations for recycling, giving that old twine a new life.

Cleanfarms, which operates the pilot program on behalf of Alberta's Agricultural Plastics Recycling Group (APRG), sends the used baler twine to recycling facilities in Canada and the U.S., where it is turned into pellets to be used in the production of new materials. Twine is made of polypropylene, which is a plastic that can be easily remanufactured into new products such as car parts, dimensional lumber, flowerpots and composite decking.

The Twine Collection Program is active in Greenview through Environmental Services and the Pesticide Jug Collection is moving to a return to retail model, with some allowances made in the Peace Region related to low jug volume rates. Quick Facts

What does our Planning & Development Department do?

Planning & Development primarily processes Development Permits and Subdivision applications, provides Rural Address Signs, and issues Business Licenses.

What types of development require a Development Permit?

Any buildings larger than 15.0 m² (161.5 ft²) (10.0 m² or 107.5 ft² within the Hamlet of Grande Cache), including those on skids, or moved from another site, require development permit approval.

All residences, including mobile homes and cabins, regardless of size require a development permit. Home Occupations, Secondary Suites, and changes to the use of buildings require development permit approval and may be discretionary in some districts.

Borrow Pits and Dugouts also require a Development Permit as well as Fences exceeding 1.8 m (5.9 ft) and Decks higher than 1.0 m (3.3 ft) above ground level.

On agriculturally zoned parcels, non-residential farm buildings do not require a development permit however, landowners may wish to complete a Farm Building Confirmation for such buildings as barns or pole structures used for storing farm equipment.

Additional requirements for development permits are established by the MD's Land Use Bylaws; Bylaw 799 for the Hamlet of Grande Cache and Bylaw 18-800 for the rest of the MD.

Please Note: Even where a development permit is not required, placement or construction of any structure is required to meet the setback requirements of the district.

The MD of Greenview does not issue Safety Codes Permits such as Building, Electrical, Plumbing, Gas, and Private Sewage which have additional requirements under the Safety Codes Act of Alberta.



When should I apply for a Development Permit?

In the earliest stages of planning your project, you should contact the Planning & Development department to discuss what may be required. Once your development permit has been approved, you have one (1) year to start your development.

How long does it take to receive Development Permit Approval?

Once a complete application is submitted, most development permits take approximately 3-4 weeks for a decision to be issued. If your development permit application is for a discretionary use, approval from the Municipal Planning Commission is required, this may take up to 8 weeks.

What do I need to operate a business in the MD of Greenview?

Business Licenses are not mandatory in the MD of Greenview, however some provincial licenses such as Alberta Motor Vehicle Industry Council (AMVIC) require a valid municipal Business License. Most businesses require development permit approval prior to issuance of a Business License.

Businesses wishing to be included in the business license directory must have a valid business license issued by Greenview. There is no additional fee to have your business listed in Greenview's Online Business Directory. Your company can be added to the directory at any time by advising our office in writing. Please include all contact information and a brief 2 sentence (maximum) description of your business. The directory is updated monthly.



Do I need a permit to build a deck?

If your property is within the Hamlet of Grande Cache, construction or installation of unenclosed decks requires a Development Permit from Greenview and can be located no closer than 4.5 m (14.8 ft) from the front property line and 3.6 m (11.8 ft) from the rear property line. Other than in the Hamlet of Grande Cache, you are not required to apply for a Development Permit to construct, install, or rebuild a deck so long as it is less than 1.0 m (3.3 ft) above grade and not enclosed.

Most deck construction or installation requires a Building Permit from a contractor of the Alberta Safety Codes Authority. For these requirements please contact:

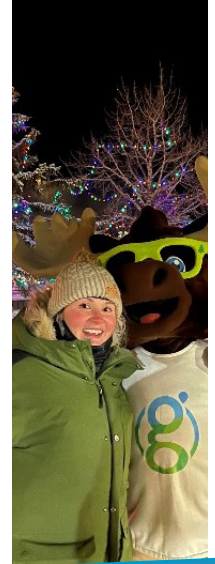
Do I need a permit to build a fence?

In Hamlets other than Grande Cache, no permit is required to build a fence so long as it is no more than 1.0 m (3.3 ft) in height in the front yard or 1.9 m (6.3 ft) in height in the side or rear yard. Hedges on property lines must also follow these height requirements. In the Hamlet of Grande Cache, no permit is required for fences so long as they are no more than 1.2 m (3.9 ft) in the front yard and 2.0 (6.6 ft) in the side and rear yards. Barbed or razor wire and electrified fences are prohibited within all Hamlet residential districts.

Fence construction or maintenance within Agricultural districts does not require a permit and may be up to 3.6 m (11.8 ft) in height for livestock windbreaks or confinement.

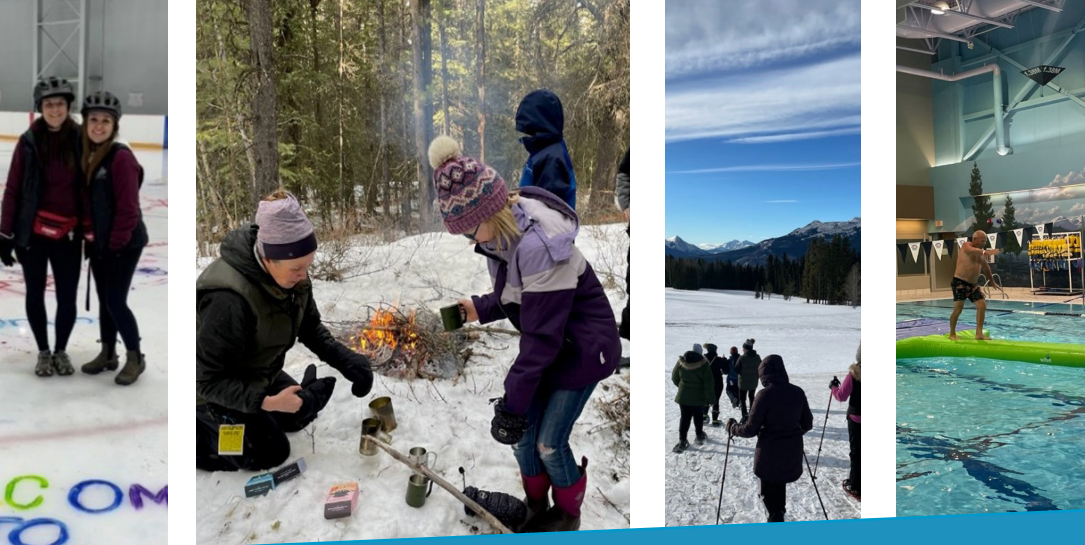

WiseGuyz Update



WiseGuyz is delivered by Green View FCSS in partnership with the Calgary Center for Sexuality and is for male identified youth in grade 9. The program promotes mental health, healthy relationships and prevents adolescent dating violence. Participants have completed the healthy relationships and sexual health portions of the program and everyone is looking forward to the next section, gender, sexuality and media. We will explore subjects like gender norms and stereotypes, and dive into media literacy.

If you would like to know more about the program or are curious about how your soon-to-be grade 9 male youth can participate during the 2023/24 school year contact the Youth Coordinators for your area. Before the end of the current school year Youth Coordinators will be hosting information sessions for parents of youth entering grade 9 next year. FCSS Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP)

Tax season is upon us. Below you will see the income level criteria to qualify for the program. Using staff and trained volunteers we are here to assist low-income individuals to file simple tax returns.

In 2022, Green View FCSS assisted with over 800 returns, bringing a total of \$3.9 million into the community. The number of people who qualify for this service is an indication of how many people live on modest incomes. It is also an opportunity to decipher if individuals may qualify for other provincial or federal programs and is a significant step in poverty reduction.

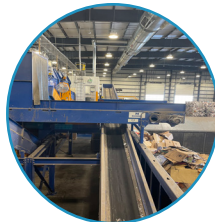
