Valleyview Ag Society

The Valleyview & Districts Agricultural Society was incorporated December 11, 1967 and has been active in the community for 55 years as a non profit organization. The facilities are situated within town limits on over 30 acres of land on top of Crocus Hill in Valleyview. The Board Of Directors are volunteers from the community and oversee the operation of the Agricultural Society.

The Ag Society has been an integral part of the community by providing a facility for recreational, and educational events for many locals and non locals, helping aid in the local economy.

One of the facilities is an indoor riding arena and hall, which is used by many Valleyview and area residents as well as non locals. The Jack Williamson Ag Plex was constructed by local volunteers of the Ag Society and Red Willow Roping Club in 1983.

There are currently 66 active Ag Society members as well as numerous non members that use the facility.

Why do we need a new arena?

The current indoor arena and hall have been well utilized over the past four decades by agriculture enthusiasts. The wood structure has provided multi-disciplinary activities for equine, bovine, canine and small animal use, unfortunately it is at the end of its life span.

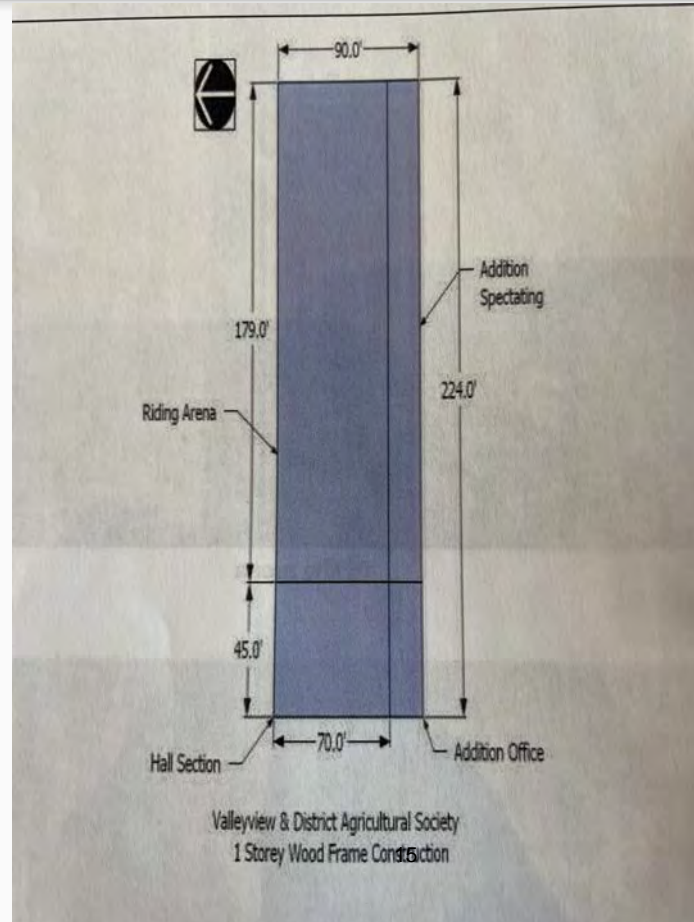
Members as well as non members have expressed concerns with the poor footing, flooding of the arena, air quality (mold), and limited spectator seating. Our major concern is the structural integrity of the building due to ongoing water damage, as the building is supported by untreated wood posts, and the ceiling leaks due to poor vapor barrier/roof. Furthermore, the size of the arena prevents certain events from taking place, such as barrel racing, gymkhana, dressage, cattle penning, and will restrict the amount of youth participants in the ever growing Peace Prospect Show (especially if the arena floods in the spring). As a result of these issues, we have seen a decrease in members over the years.

The Valleyview Ag Society envisions a brand new indoor facility for the diverse agricultural community. A new Ag Events Centre will offer the Municipal District of Greenview #16 residents and surrounding area a venue to host bigger ag events. In turn it will bolster the local economy by drawing in participants/spectators from around Alberta, British Columbia, and Saskatchewan.

The new Ag Events Centre will continue to provide a home for local clubs such as 4-H, beef, horse, canine, and Red Willow Roping Club.

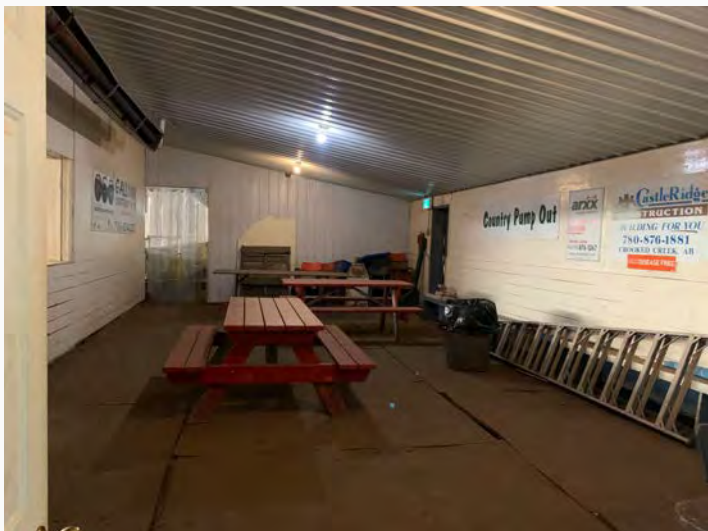

AG Plex Arena Pad and Parking Area

April 18th 2023

Thank you for giving Hollingworth Construction the opportunity to provide you with this proposal.

This estimate is based on constructing a 92m x 54m clay based arena pad and a 92m x 92m gravel surfaced parking area. The topsoil from the locations will be stripped and stored to be re-used for landscaping the surrounding area.

The arena and parking area subgrades will be scarified and compacted to ensure adequate binding with the fill material. The fill material will be placed and compacted in lifts based on the suitability of the material with a final arena pad elevation of 45 centimeters above existing ground (18 inches). The parking area will be padded to an elevation that ensures positive drainage followed by a 10 centimeter lift of ¾" crush.

Day 1

Remove existing steel fence, strip and stockpile arena pad topsoil, Strip/prep borrow pit for hauling.

Please find attached our current fiscal statement.

So far we have assisted with five events this year. The Akasaka figure skating club's carnival, The Ice Breaker Memorial Hockey tournament, the sod turning ceremony for the Kikinow Elders Lodge, the AWN Round Dance and the Grande Theater Players production of Red Riding Hood.

Our staff came in to take action photos for the Carnival. We then took action photos and assisted with security and provided additional resources for the Ice Breaker. Our staff assisted with Audio for the sod turning. We assisted with planning, operation and concession for the AWN Round Dance. Then finally we assisted with the set-up, tear down, front of house sales and local guiding for Red Riding Hood.

Total attendance for these would be Carnival 150-200, Ice Breaker 1500 - 2000 (with over 250 attending the dinner and band), 125-150 for the sod turning, 325-400 for the round dance and finally 300-350 (not including over seventy children who auditioned for the play.)

For our own events and programs our open house saw limited interest as did our light up labyrinth event. Baby Think it over at Susa Creek was well received. Our planning and grant process for Canada Day is now finished and the Three Peaks challenge will start in a few days. Death Fest planning is well under way and assistance for two events has been requested over the summer so far.

So far this fiscal year I have put in three hundred and twelve hours including one twenty two hour shift. My volunteers (including some of our paid staff who volunteered time) have put in around one hundred hours and our paid staff has put in around thirty hours.

Hello Councillors,

My name is Jake O'Reilly and I am the Events Director for the Grande Cache Community Events Foundation. Today I am writing to you to request that we be allowed to return one of the most beloved events in Grande Cache's History to our little mountain community.

Death Fest is the festival that surrounds the Death Race. While the Death Race needs no introduction I would like to go into some history. The race started in August of 2000 and over the years the former town started to put together a mini-festival around the race. This festival grew significantly over the years to have Musical acts like Great Big Sea, The Road Hammers and Corb Lund all perform at the race. While we will never return to this scale, I would like to return the core component of the festival to central park on August long weekend, this year that would be August 4th to August 7th.

Live Music, Family Activities, Food, Games and Children's Performances are all in the plans for this year with the intention to grow the festival back to what it was previously. This year we have Inflatable rides, A Magic show, Face Painting, A Foam Pit, Demonstrations and performances by local groups, Costumed entertainers, Assorted Games, Live music and more is still on the way.

To pay for this is not cheap. The stage and tents cost over eight thousand dollars to be delivered, Fencing will be expensive, The entertainment is going to be almost five thousand dollars and the inflatables and foam pit nearly another five thousand. This is a stretch for a non-profit organization at the best of times. The cost of this event was heavy on even the former town.

To help pay for this, they used alcohol sales, ticket prices and food sales. We would like to request permission to do the same.

Central Park has been the home for Death Fest in years prior. Before that it was The High School field. In order to use this space we would need the permission of council to rent the park and set up a temporarily fenced, Licensed area. This area would run from 12pm until 10pm on Saturday night and 12PM until 5PM Sunday Night.

Additional measures are being taken to prevent rowdy behavior. I see this as a family event that is licensed, not a place to go and get drunk. As a result we have no hard liquor sales at all. To prevent noise disturbance, We also are staying within the time period allowed by the noise bylaw meaning our live music will end at 10PM.

It is estimated that the sales from this area would likely cover a significant portion of our costs for the event. Combined with merchandise, Concession sales, Admission fees and Vendor fees we could potentially make money to put towards events later in the year. This would significantly help our organization to create more for the community.

This festival has meant a lot to everyone in this community for a very long time. I will always remember the concerts I attended as a child, right in the heart of my own little mountain town. The Go Karts, Paintball, My first job, All the Carnival games, My friends challenging me to the giant boxing glove ring or the sumo suits and so many other memories. I hope you will let me bring this one back for the next generation of kids...and for the kids who are now adults, who grew up in this community with me and would love the chance to give their kids the same opportunities they had.

Hello Duane,

I am writing this letter today to request permission to run a licensed area in central park during the Death Race weekend. We are not requesting money. We are asking to have the ability to earn it ourselves by setting up a licensed area for alcohol sales.

Licensed areas in public areas are quite common. Key examples would include Ufest in Edmonton which is being run in Borden park, Bear Creek Folk Festival being run in Muskoseepi Park, the Ball/Golf tournaments run here in Grande Cache or even Death Fest itself in prior years.

Death Fest is part of Grande Cache's Identity. The Death Race remains the only event that will book all the hotels in town almost a full year in advance. It will allow us to showcase local artists in a family friendly environment during one of the busiest weekends of our year.

The intention is to grow the festival back to what it was previously. This year we have Inflatable rides, A Magic show, Face Painting, A Foam Pit, Demonstrations and performances by local groups, Costumed entertainers, Assorted Games, Live music and more is still on the way.

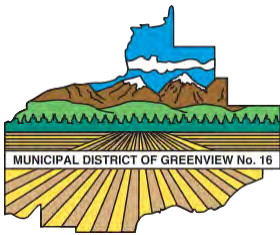

Please find attached our current fiscal statement.

So far we have assisted with five events this year. The Akasaka figure skating club's carnival, The Ice Breaker Memorial Hockey tournament, the sod turning ceremony for the Kikinow Elders Lodge, the AWN Round Dance and the Grande Theater Players production of Red Riding Hood.

Our staff came in to take action photos for the Carnival. We then took action photos and assisted with security and provided additional resources for the Ice Breaker. Our staff assisted with Audio for the sod turning. We assisted with

planning, operation and concession for the AWN Round Dance. Then finally we assisted with the set-up, tear down, front of house sales and local guiding for Red Riding Hood.

Total attendance for these would be Carnival 150-200, Ice Breaker 1500 - 2000 (with over 250 attending the dinner and band), 125-150 for the sod turning, 325-400 for the round dance and finally 300-350 (not including over seventy children who auditioned for the play.)

For our own events and programs our open house saw limited interest as did our light up labyrinth event. Baby Think it over at Susa Creek was well received. Our planning and grant process for Canada Day is now finished and the Three Peaks challenge will start in a few days. Death Fest planning is well under way and assistance for two events has been requested over the summer so far.

So far this fiscal year I have put in three hundred and twelve hours including one twenty two hour shift. My volunteers (including some of our paid staff who volunteered time) have put in around one hundred hours and our paid staff has put in around thirty hours.

For our summer programming we have to get our orders in as soon as possible. We finally are set up to accept direct deposits, if it is quicker to get our funding that way could you please forward me the form?

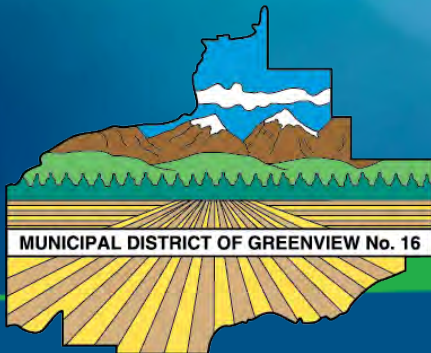

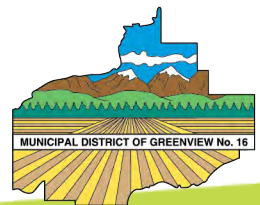


History

1985 – The former Town of Grande Cache applied for a recreation lease for Fireman's Pit following the fire department developing a park at the location, which fell within the Town's existing gravel pit lease. The proposed purpose of the park was for private functions upon request to the fire department.

1985 – The Municipal Planning Commission of Improvement District No. 16 passed a motion having no objections to the proposed lease. This approval was then provided to Municipal Affairs.

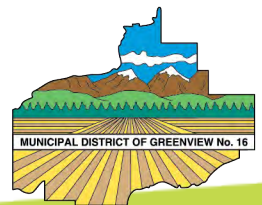
1986 – The disposition (REC 850036) for Fireman's Park is formally approved by the Province of Alberta.



History

1992 – The following statement was made during an Informal Council Meeting:

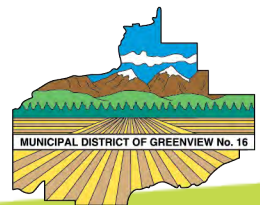
“Council members advised that there would be some firewood needed for Hide-A-Way camp, the Grande Cache Lake area for skidoo races this winter and at the McDonald Site at Pierre Grey Lakes. In addition, some of this firewood could be hauled to the Firemen’s Pit and any group that is interested in loading and hauling and selling to the public such as the Muttoneers, Seniors, etc. are welcomed.”



History

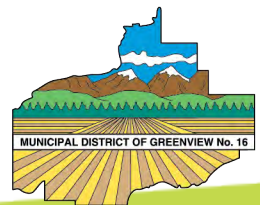
2007 – The Province issued a renewal for the disposition with a 10 year term. Indicating that Lessee shall use the said lands solely for the purpose of a Public Facility (Picnic Area). Additionally, the noticed letter indicated that:

“ As public access is a central feature and is consistent with the intent and purpose of this lease the lease holder shall ensure public accessibility, deemed reasonable to the Minister, to all common recreational/cultural facilities approved under the lease agreement”.



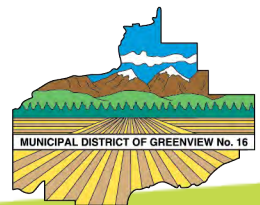
History

2019 – The Municipal District of Greenview No. 16 inherited the disposition following the dissolution of the former Town of Grande Cache. The lease was expired and non-compliant with the *Public Lands Act* at the time.



Provincial Disposition (Current)

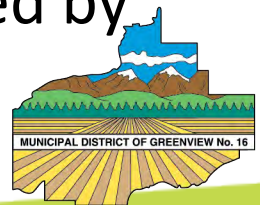
- Greenview Administration received a renewed lease for Fireman's Pit in 2022. (REC 850036)
- Greenview Administration applied for a conversion from a recreation lease to the newly developed tourism and commercial recreation lease in March 2023. This has not been processed at this time and an anticipated timeline has not been provided.



Proposed Sublease

As noted in the former Town of Grande Cache's initial lease application, the Grande Cache Fire Department built the site and has operated it since. As such, Administration is pursuing options to put a formal sublease in place for the operation of the site. This is a recommendation that will come to Council for approval.

Another option would be to pursue having the lease transferred to the Grande Cache Firefighter's Association. However, in conversations with local Alberta Forest, Parks and Tourism staff, this option is not encouraged by the Province.



Insurance Requirements

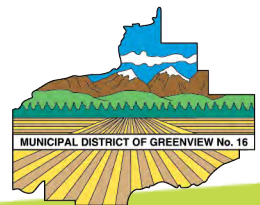
Current Issue:

The Association currently does not hold asset or liability insurance for Fireman's Pit.

Adequate insurance will be a requirement of the proposed sublease.

Proposed Solution:

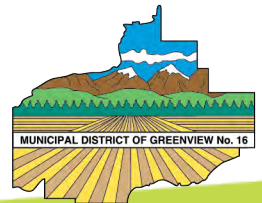
Administration will make a recommendation motion to Council to add the Association to Greenview's Additional Named Insured List, thus providing access to reduced insurance rates.



Infrastructure - Ownership

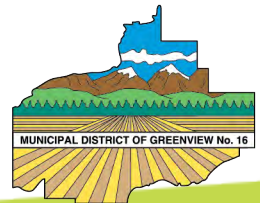
As the disposition holder, all assets on the property are automatically owned by Greenview. However, the Grande Cache Firefighter's Association has purchased and maintained all infrastructure, with no evidence of direct funding for the site from either the former Town of Grande Cache or Greenview.

As such, Administration recommends entering into an agreement with the Association granting them ownership of all assets. This would include a clause that if the sublease was terminated or the Association was to fold, all assets would transfer back to Greenview.

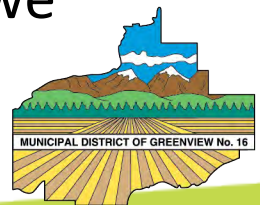


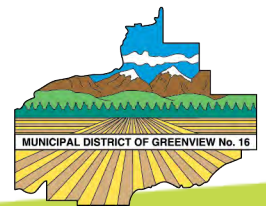
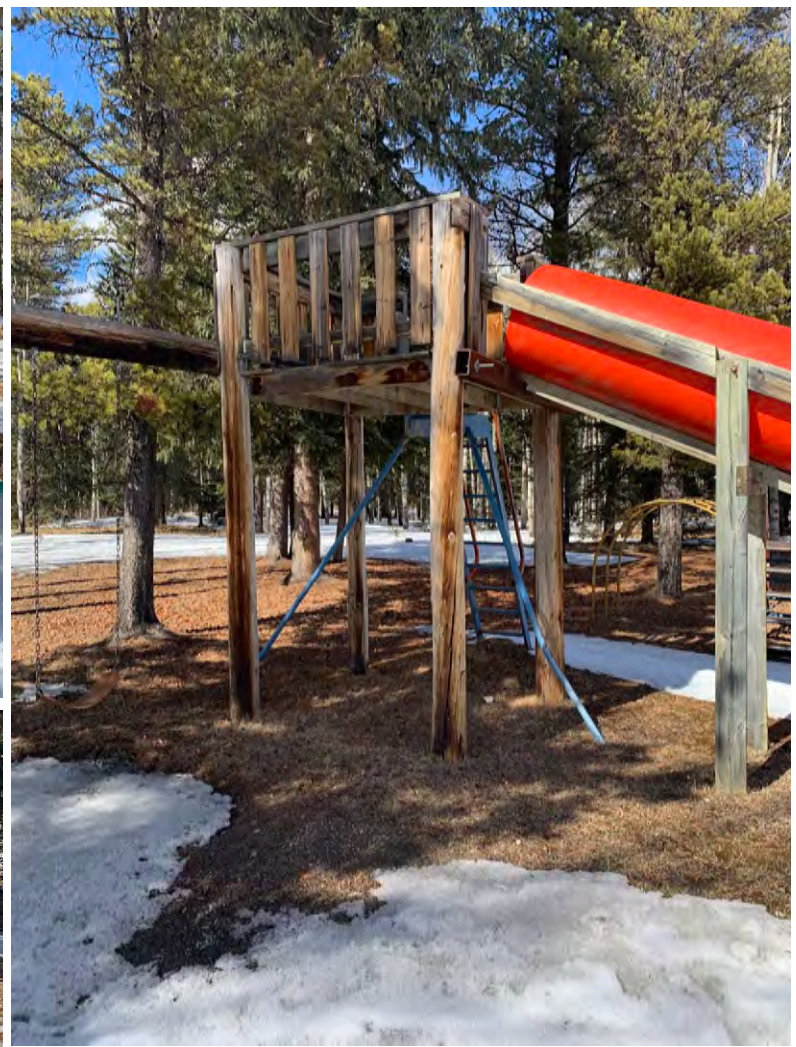
Infrastructure - Concerns

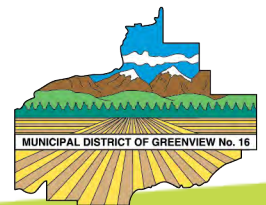
Both the Association and Greenview Administration have identified some concerns with the current infrastructure, including:

- The playground equipment does not meet current playground safety code compliance and requires removal or replacement.
- The outhouse building is reaching the end of its life expectancy and will require replacement.
- The perimeter fence has a portion remaining to be upgraded from barbed wire to chain-link.
- The cookshack will need some maintenance.

The Association is looking into options for upgrading this infrastructure once an agreement is in place for infrastructure ownership and approval is provided. Should Council approve this agreement to be put in place, the Association will be eligible for grants that Greenview could not apply for if we retain ownership.



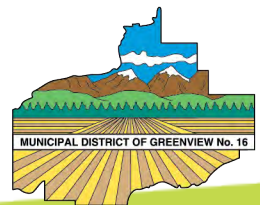




Site Operations

Historically, this site has been accessible to the public for rentals through the Grande Cache Firefighter's Association. These rentals have incurred a reasonable fee, which is retained by the Association.

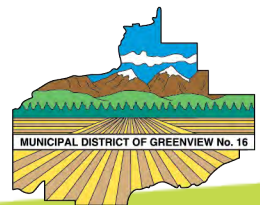
During COVID, this site was unable to operate, and some confusion has existed following Greenview taking over the lease. Administration has provided the Association the go ahead to continue renting the site while we pursue formalizing agreements.



Concerns: Public Accessibility

As a recreation lease on public lands, the intent of the lease is to provide recreational opportunities to the public. The Association has voiced questions on what their specific requirements are to provide access to the site to the public. For example, can the Association block off rentals for x number of weekends throughout the summer for their private use.

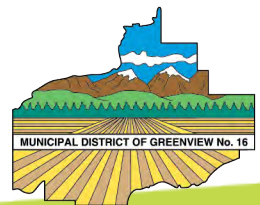
As such, Administration is working with Alberta Forestry, Parks and Tourism to obtain clear direction on the requirements for public access and overall expectations. Once this information is confirmed, the Association will be updated. These requirements will also be clearly outlined within any sublease documents.



Concerns: Processing of Firewood

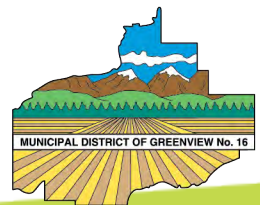
One identified concern about the current operation of the recreation site is that wood is being processed on location by a 3rd party and then being sold for profit. This is likely an activity that has continued since the 1992 approval listed earlier in the presentation.

This is anticipated to be a prohibited activity on a recreation lease within public lands. Administration will receive clarification from the Province and respond accordingly.



Greenview's Current Investment

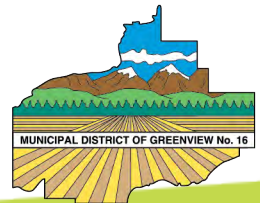
- Annual Lease Fee - \$105.00 in 2022 – Paid by Greenview.
- Insurance Costs – Greenview currently holds both liability and asset insurance for the site. Asset insurance can be removed once an agreement is in place for ownership, if approved.
- Maintenance – The former Town of Grande Cache provided lawn mowing and garbage removal for the site. This services was grandfathered in during the dissolution and still continues. Administration estimates that this costs approximately \$9, 500.00 per year. This will be brought forward to Council for approval as an in kind donation.



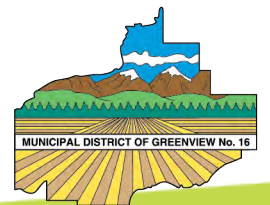
Proposed Next Steps

1. That Council authorize Administration to establish a formal sublease with the Grande Cache Firefighter's Association for the operation of Fireman's Pit.
2. That Council authorize Administration to enter into an agreement with the Grande Cache Firefighter's Association to identify the Association as the legal owner of all infrastructure located at Fireman's Pit.
3. That Council authorize Administration to provide lawn mowing services at Fireman's Pit, as an in kind donation to the Grande Cache Firefighter's Association, for a period of 3-years.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

In 2021 and 2022 Administration received two verbal requests regarding street lighting along Range Road 262 for students going to and from the Ridgevalley School. It is felt, this is a real safety concern for children crossing the road in the darker months.

Administration began the process of investigating the need for street lighting in Ridgevalley by reaching out to ATCO requesting two quotes, “A” cost request that is the minimum for children to safely walk to and from the Ridgevalley School and “B” cost request, is for adding lighting to the interior streets that currently have no streetlights. ATCO also supplied routing plans for both options, please see attached.

The streetlighting within an area can be financially funded solely by the Municipality or by the local electrical distributor. Greenview currently does not own the streetlights within Ridgevalley.

With the **Investment** option, the lighting fixtures are installed, owned, and maintained by ATCO Electric, and will be responsible for the full cost of end-of-life replacement. See attached proposal letter for a more detailed estimate.

With the **No Investment** option, the lighting fixtures are installed, owned, and maintained by ATCO Electric however, Greenview would be responsible for the full cost of placement. See attached proposal letter for a more detailed estimate.

The **Investment Options** will increase with the number of streetlights (Poles and lights) being changed.

ATCO provided the estimates below for both cost requests.

- Colonization follows specific patterns

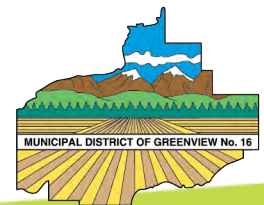

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

Greenview's contractor hiring procedures have varied over the years with one consistent motive, to hire local contractors. Until 2016, the EOI program (also referred to as Equipment Bid Registry) was administered using local contractors providing competitive pricing while policies directed hiring based upon the lowest quoted rate. In light of discussions around the 2023 budget, Administration would like to provide the Committee with some background information and propose discussions around the following topics:

- Combined pricing and equipment hiring of contractors who own multiple pieces of equipment that frequently work together. (ie. an excavator and body job gravel truck working together on ditch cleaning, a mulcher and power saw operators, a grader with a packer and dozer, etc.)
- The ability for Administration to organize smaller projects to be quoted and completed by a single local contractor within the EOI. (i.e. smaller ditch cleaning projects, maintenance road repairs on the Forestry Trunk Road, etc.)

- Tendering or quoting annual water truck services for the Forestry Trunk Road. (2022 Actuals for water trucks on the Forestry Trunk Road are \$543,353.64)
- Tendering or quoting dozer services for pushing back drifts and snowbanks on the south portion of the Forestry Trunk Road. (Expenses are approximately \$250,000.00 annually depending on conditions.)
- Requesting annual quotes from individual local contractors for hourly and tonne/km rates as part of the EOI Package as an alternative to paying 100% of the Alberta Roadbuilders and Heavy Construction Association's (ARHCA) rates. (Attached to this RFD is an excerpt from 2012's Contractor Registry as well as the annual advertisement from 2010 and previous policies.)
 - 89% of ARHCA was the chosen rate when first implementing the EOI Program in its current form as this was the average rate when contractors provided competitive pricing.

By following the recommendations above, Administration will have the ability to work cohesively with other departments, and contractors and organize projects while following Council's Strategic Plan *"Maintaining Fiscal Responsibility"*.

Practices of Various Municipalities

Equipment and Gravel Truck Hiring

Big Lakes County

- Each year an ad requesting bids goes out: 1 for equipment and 1 for gravel trucks
- Council sets a municipal rate and contractors bid a percentage of the rate
- Bids are accepted after the closing date but those bids are automatically added to the bottom of the list no matter what the rate is
- Local trucks and equipment are prioritized before non-local even if their bid rate is higher

County of Grande Prairie

- Projects are posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection: 2-year contracts for gravel hauling to roads and stockpiling programs with options to extend
- Equipment contractors submit rate sheets for shorter projects
- Contractors are chosen based on bid rates and proximity to projects
- Travel time is paid but contractors are strategically chosen to work as locally as possible
- Past performance with the County is taken into consideration when hiring

MD of Smoky River

- The MD of Smoky River owns 5 super b gravel trucks and does its own gravel program
- Other equipment is hired based upon bid price, availability, and proximity to project
- Local hiring is prioritized

Woodlands County

- An equipment and truck binder with Workers Compensation Board clearance, proof of insurance, etc... is compiled annually
- Equipment and trucks submit bid rates, lowest bids are prioritized with consideration for work history, condition of equipment, competency of operator, proximity to jobsite. No consideration for local or non-local contractors. 1 mob and 1 demob is paid per project.
- For the annual re-gravelling program, a Request For Proposal goes out and the County determines the most cost-effective means to complete the work

Birch Hills County

- Heavy equipment provide a proposed bid rate
- Jobs worth \$50,000 or higher are put to tender
- A contractor list is compiled for gravel trucks annually with preference for local owner-operators
- Highest priority is given to local resident contractors with years of experience hauling for the County

PURPOSE:

To ensure that the Municipal District institutes a cost effective method of hiring gravel trucks.

POLICY:

The Municipal District shall establish an annual list of all available gravel trucks willing to work for the Municipal District.

The Municipal District will establish fair and equitable rates as determined by the Superintendent of Public Works and approved by Council for major, unique or remote gravel hauling projects.

PROCEDURE:

1.0 The Superintendent of Public Works shall advertise annually, for a minimum of two weeks prior to March 15th, requesting gravel truck owners to supply their rates per hour and per tonne kilometer to be effective until April 1st of the following year.

2.0 All submissions received must be sealed and post-marked prior to or including the day of deadline for submissions.

3.0 Upon opening of submissions, the Superintendent of Public Works shall ensure that all submissions:

- 3.1 Are in good standing with the Municipal District;
- 3.2 Have supplied proof of a minimum \$2,000,000 in liability insurance;
- 3.3 Have supplied proof of W.C.B. coverage;
- 3.4 Have provided proof of vehicle certification; and
- 3.5 Have signed the Contractor's Safety Rule Book.

4.0 The annual list shall be presented to the Municipal Manager for approval.

5.0 The Superintendent of Public Works or designate shall attempt to contract the lowest bidder (or as per the municipality's discretion in Clause 6.0 below) unless the bidder is unavailable or waives his/her right to work. The Superintendent of Public Works may proceed to use the next lowest bidder upon receiving confirmation as stated above and a written record of contacts shall be maintained.

6.0 The Municipal District of Greenview reserves the right to contract any bid other than the lowest bid without stating reasons. By the act of submitting its bid, the Bidder waives any right to contest in any legal proceeding or action the right of the Municipal District of Greenview to award the work to whomever it chooses, in its sole and unfettered discretion, and for whatever reasons the Municipality deems appropriate. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Municipal District of Greenview may consider any other factor besides price and capability to perform the work that it deems in its sole discretion to be relevant to its decision including but not limited to the following:

- 6.1 Any past experience with the Bidder, or lack thereof;
- 6.2 The results of any reference check done by the Municipal District of Greenview;
- 6.3 Information relating to the financial state of the Bidder, however obtained; and
- 6.4 Production rates of equipment to be utilized.

7.0 Preferential hiring of Municipal District resident gravel trucks shall be considered when it is economically efficient and advantageous for the Municipal District.

8.0 Payment for major hauls and remote location may be dealt with as determined by the Superintendent of Public Works based on unique circumstances and shall be approved by Council. Sign-off sheets will be used in this situation.

9.0 Only the annual list shall be used for work in the Municipal District, except for major haul/remote locations, however does not guarantee employment throughout the year.

- 2.0 All submissions received must be sealed and post marked prior to or including the day of deadline for submissions.
- 3.0 Upon opening of submissions, the Superintendent of Public Works shall ensure that all submissions:
 - 3.1 Are in good standing with the Municipal District;
 - 3.2 Have supplied proof of a minimum \$2,000,000 in liability insurance;
 - 3.3 Have supplied proof of W.C.B. coverage; and
 - 3.4 Have signed a Contractor's Safety Rule Book.
- 4.0 The equipment will be prioritized based on the bid prices as compared to the equipment rates listed in the previous years edition of the Alberta Road Builders and Heavy Construction Association publication.
- 5.0 The municipality shall pay haul rates for mobilization and de-mobilization of heavy equipment in accordance to the rates established by the Alberta Road Builders and Heavy Construction Association's equipment rental rates book.
- 6.0 The equipment owner shall be responsible for all moves and payments to third party contractors.
- 7.0 The annual list shall be presented to the Municipal Manager for approval.
- 8.0 The Superintendent of Public Works or designate shall attempt to contract the lowest bidder (or as per the municipality's discretion in Clause 9.0 below) by determining the hourly rate and the haul rate combined and a written record of all contacts shall be maintained.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

The 2023 Community Grants & Sponsorships program has an approved budget of \$1,500,000.00 out of which community grants and sponsorship funding is allotted. There are two separate funding disbursement dates which are awarded in the winter and spring of each calendar year.

Council approved \$557,228.75 in grant funding in January 2023 of which \$109,500.00 came from the 2023 Agricultural Services Budget. The balance of the Community Grants Miscellaneous Budget as of June 20, 2023, is approximately \$567,821.70.

To aid Council in the grant review process, Administration is recommending that a decision framework be established. The following questions may be considered:

- 1) What types of groups or organizations should Greenview fund?
- 2) What is the criteria used when funding events?
- 3) Will Greenview fund charitable organizations?
- 4) Will Greenview fund groups competing with private industry?
- 5) Is there a degree of consistency and fairness?

A summary of the grant requests has been categorized into a spreadsheet. Administration provided recommendations with the grant applications for Council's consideration.

1. The benefit of accepting the recommended motion is that Committee of the Whole will recommend that Council award the 2023 Community Grants accordingly.

MOTION: The Committee of the Whole accept the Sturgeon Lake and Puskwaskau Wildfire discussion for information, as presented.

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL:

On May 5th, 2023, wildfires began in populated areas of the Sturgeon Lake Cree First Nations and the surrounding area. Wildfires in this area severely damaged or destroyed approximately 71 structures, 36 of which were dwellings. With fires now under control, owners are anxious to start the recovery process, and inquiries received commonly by the Planning and Development Department have been catalogued. Some of the questions we are getting are:

Will the MD help pay for the properties to be surveyed to ensure new buildings are built within property lines?

- Greenview does not require a real property report in order for Administration to review and issue a permit, and this is not a basic requirement of rebuilding and would be of limited value as no structures exist on most damaged property. Posting the lots would likely have markers buried, removed, or their location altered, perhaps creating rather than solving issues. This is not currently recommended.

Do we need to have a development permit and building permit prior to starting clean-up, and will the MD cover the cost of the permit fees?

- Administration recommends a demolition permit. However, many of these sites are simply debris and no permit is required to clean sites where municipal services are not connected. Landowners may go in to start the clean-up process. It is the recommendation Council consider a motion to waive the cost of municipal permits, the permit fees will not impact the budget, and the administrative tasks can be absorbed within workflows without the need for added resources. However, building permits would be required by the Alberta Safety Codes Authority, and they establish fees for those permitting requirements.

Do they need an engineer to inspect their properties to ensure proper grading, and will the MD pay for this?

- Greenview does not have a drainage bylaw. Unless it is clear there is a potential impact on a neighbouring property when reviewing a development permit, this is not a standard requirement.

Clean up specific questions:

- a. Can they use the transfer station for the debris?
 - No, this is an AEP-regulated site, so construction debris is prohibited.
- b. Can Greenview place extra bins at the transfer station for debris drop off?
 - The bins cannot be placed within the transfer station. However, the MD could provide bins at the entrance to Sandy Bay for residents to place debris. We would also place a bin at locations in the rural area where significant structural losses occurred to ensure fair access to this effort of Council.
- c. Are there any plans for tree removal by Greenview?
 - At this time, tree removal is only anticipated on Municipal property, but this will be undertaken as a course of common business. Due to liability issues, Administration would not remove trees on private property, and there are services available which may be covered by insurance.
- d. If the trees are cut down, can the landowners keep the wood as firewood, and where can it be stored?
 - When trees are downed and bucked up, they are collected at a future date. Should area residents seek to acquire the wood, this lessens the effort required by Greenview when collection occurs and is viewed as a mutual benefit. Storage would need to be on private lands.

Is there going to be a grace period for taxes?

- 2023 taxes are based on the 2022 Assessment. In the event of a fire loss, municipal taxes are covered under insurance.

Will the property taxes be reassessed for the area?

- 2024 taxes will be based on 2023 assessments. The assessments for the damaged property will be conducted later in the year 2023. The property will be reassessed based on the condition at the assessment time.

Are Telus & ATCO going to improve their services to the area?

- This is a franchised utility, and we cannot comment on their level of service.

Will the fire breaks that are on private property be cleaned up?

- Where Greenview has contracts for fire breaks on private lands, we will restore those lands pursuant to our contract. It should be noted that many fire breaks were installed by or at the

express direction of Forestry, not Greenview, on privately held lands, and Greenview will not undertake those fire breaks.

BENEFITS OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The benefit of Committee of the Whole accepting the recommended motion is that both Council and Administration will have a common understanding of Greenview's role during the recovery phase and what issues require a future Council motion to be undertaken.

DISADVANTAGES OF THE RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. The disadvantage of Committee of the Whole accepting the recommended motion is that landowners who had insurance may be helping to pay for those that did not.

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:

Alternative #1: Committee of the Whole has the alternative to recommend Administration attend a future meeting with additional information.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATION:

Direct Costs:

There are no costs to accepting the report as information. However, the cost of recommended actions are:

- The cost of providing extra bins would be borne by Greenview, as would Regional Landfill tipping fees. Tipping fees have not been estimated at the time of writing this report.
- Loss of revenue from Development permits is anticipated to be less than \$10,000.
- Tree removal has a cost but will be addressed under current operational budgets.

STAFFING IMPLICATION:

Planning staff will need to engage with landowners, which may need to be after regular business hours, which may result in overtime.
