

Council Highlights Summary - Valleyview, Alberta

September 26, 2023 Grande Prairie Aboriginal Circle of Services (GPACOS) 9th Annual Round Dance

Council approved sponsorship of \$500.00 for the 9th Annual Grande Prairie Round Dance to be held on November 25, 2023. GPACOS is an inter-agency group that works to help strengthen communities and services for Indigenous people within the Grande Prairie area. The Annual Round Dance is held to unite people to celebrate the traditional celebration of healing, sharing, and helping. This event is a day of colourful dance and drumming, traditional foods, cultural education, and inclusiveness open to the public.

September 26, 2023 Relocation of Grant Funding to Ridgevalley Seniors Home Approved

Relocation of Grant Funding to Ridgevalley Seniors Home Approved Greenview Council awarded the Ridgevalley Seniors Home a capital grant in 2022 to complete upgrades at the facility. Recently, the facility has experienced mechanical issues with the boiler that provides hot water within the building, making replacing the equipment a top priority. To complete this project, funding previously allocated to facility upgrades is needed to install a new boiler. Council approved the reallocation of funds they received from the 2022 capital grant.

September 12, 2023 Greenview Council provides financial support for the Ridgevalley Area Maintenance

The Ridgevalley Arena sees high use, and the facility is in relatively good condition, but over the last few years, it has begun to experience mechanical failures. Most recently, the facility has been experiencing furnace issues and problems with their Zamboni. Without the muchneeded repairs, services offered would significantly impact youth and families across the area. Council approved funding for \$25,000.00 to complete repairs and maintenance as needed.

September 12, 2023 Grande Cache Recreation Centre Fieldhouse Design & Drafting contract awarded

On June 26, 2023, Greenview's Recreation Department issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the Grande Cache Recreation Centre Fieldhouse Design & Drafting. Administration received two acceptable proposals, which were evaluated for consideration. Council awarded the RFP to ACI Architecture Inc. for the sum of \$64,8074.00 plus GST.

October 12, 2023 Peace Area Riding for the Disabled Society (PARDS) Annual Fundraiser Gets Greenview Support

Peace Area Riding for the Disabled Society (PARDS) Annual Fundraiser **Gets Greenview Support** PARDS is a non-profit organization in the County of Grande Prairie that has provided therapeutic and inclusive equine and animal-assisted programs for people living with disabilities in the Peace Region since 1984. Council approved a sponsorship to the Peace Area Riding for the Disabled Society (PARDS) in the amount of \$1,000.00 and an In-Kind Donation of value up to \$500.00 for PARDS 25th Annual Dine & Dance on November 4, 2023, at the Five Mile Hall in the County of Grande Prairie, with funds to come from the Community Services Grants and Sponsorships Budget.

Residential & Farmland Property Taxes due November 15, 2023

- The due date for the residential & farmland property taxes is November 15, 2023. There are a number of options property tax payment options provided below.
- *NOTE: ratepayers should allow at least (3) three business days for their bank to process the payment.
- All Greenview Offices will be closed on Monday, November 13, 2023, in lieu of Remembrance Day.
- Failure to pay your taxes by the deadline will result in an 8% penalty on the unpaid balance of current taxes. A further penalty of 10% will be applied to the unpaid balance of the basic current tax as of January 1, 2024. Any other tax arrears as of January 1, 2024, will have an 18% penalty applied.

DeBolt & Ridgevalley Area Structure Plans

PURPOSE:

The MD of Greenview is in the process of drafting Area Structure Plans (ASPs) for DeBolt and Ridgevalley. The ASPs will provide a vision for the future development of hamlets and their surrounding lands. The ASPs will direct growth and change that will help meet the residential, commercial, industrial, service, and community needs of the local residents. Both plans will follow the processes outlined in the Municipal Development Plan.

Throughout this project, we aim to gather community feedback and encourage active participation in the upcoming engagement events. The project seeks to enhance future development within the hamlets by creating opportunities for voicing opinions, concerns, and ideas.

BACKGROUND:

The Hamlet of Ridgevalley is located 3km south of Highway 43 along Ridgevalley Road, approximately 30 minutes west of Valleyview, and 10 minutes northwest is the Hamlet of DeBolt. Given their proximity, the two hamlets are regionally interconnected and share amenities, including the arena, the Ridgevalley School, and the library.

Economic Development - Beautification Grant



Greenview is committed to supporting small businesses and entrepreneurs in our communities. Greenview aims to advance our local economic goals by encouraging pride in the success and potential of our local businesses by implementing a Beautification Grant.

The Beautification Grant acts as an immediate economic driver by providing local employment and business for local trades and suppliers and enhancing building aesthetics, contributing to the beautification and vibrancy of Greenview and its communities.

The beautification grant will pay businesses between 50-70% of eligible costs, up to a maximum of \$5,000, depending on where your business is located within Greenview.

To be eligible for the Storefront Stream, applicants must meet the following requirements:

• Operates a small business on a parcel of land zoned for commercial purposes as per Greenview's Land Use Bylaw.

The Beautification Grant will remain open until grant funding has been allocated.

Greenview Beautification has two (2) streams: Storefront Stream and Small Business Stream. The difference between the streams is the amount of reimbursement. Businesses that are eligible for Storefront Stream can apply for up to 70% of total project costs up to a maximum of \$5,000.00. Businesses that are eligible for Small Business Stream can apply for up to 50% of total project costs up to a maximum of \$5,000.00. Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria for either stream to be considered for a beautification grant:

- Must be a small business.
- Must be located within Greenview.
- Must hold a valid Greenview Business License.
- Must plan to use this program for the purpose relating to the exterior or signage of the building. Examples may include:
 - Restoration of exterior finishes and repainting, including murals.
 - Planter, hanging baskets, and garden areas, especially in downtown hamlet setting.
 - Repair or replacement of storefront windows, patios, and doors.
 - Exterior lighting of the building and signage.
 - Signage on the front of the business location.
 - Replacement of awnings and signs.
 - New architectural details, such as entryway features and cornices.
 - Addition of patio areas and permanent landscaping elements; and
 - Removal of barriers to access for people with disabilities and mobility challenges.

Note: The above list is not exhaustive, and other improvements may be considered eligible if they align with the program's objectives and comply with the applicable development regulations.

Safe Use of Space Heaters During the Winter Months



As the colder winter months approach, space heaters can boost home warmth, but they can cause fires if you aren't careful. A space heater can be an easy and effective way to warm your home, but space heaters come with some risks.

Greenview Fire-Rescue Services does not keep specific statistics on space heater fires; however, a report from the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) stated that space heaters are the culprits in 81% of fatal house fires caused by heat. More than half of the fires caused by heating equipment between 2014 and 2018 occurred in January.

Regional Fire Chief Wayne Brown cautions, "You want to make sure to keep a good three to five feet of clearance around a space heater, as they can generate a lot of heat, so anything combustible that's near is an opportunity for a fire to start."

That's the bad news. The good news is that the risk of a fire goes down substantially if you follow these

space heater safety tips:

- Please make sure the space heater has safety features. Choose a space heater that automatically shuts off when it starts to overheat or tips over, as that will help minimize any risk of an accidental house fire.
- Don't use extension cords and power strips, extension cords and power strips can overheat and cause a fire when connected to a space heater. Play it safe by plugging your space heater directly into a wall outlet.
- Place the space heater out of harm's way, and keep space heaters at least three feet away from anything combustible or flammable, such as curtains, rugs, beds, and clothes. Also, avoid placing space heaters on carpets or in high-traffic areas where they could become a tripping hazard.
- Keep kids and pets away from space heaters. Place space heaters where young children and pets

can't get to them. Consider putting your heater behind a child-proof gate if necessary.

- Place space heaters on a level surface. Space heaters should be placed on flat, level floor surfaces to avoid dangerous tip-overs.
- Don't hide space heater cords. Running a space heater's cord under a rug, carpet or piece of furniture poses a fire risk. Keep them out in the open.
- Turn off your space heater when you can't monitor It. Power down your space heater before you go to sleep. Always ensure you are in the same room as the space heater, or at least you can keep an eye on it while it's running.
- Get rid of space heaters running too hot. If your space heater or its power cord is hot to the touch, turn it off and unplug it ASAP. Don't plug in the space heater again until you've had an appliance repair person check it out. If you've had the space heater for a while, consider replacing it. Do not donate the overheating space heater to a charity or put it outside for free.
- Regularly inspect your space heater, and immediately replace any space heater with a cracked or frayed cord, damaged prongs or loose connections.

Chief Brown also reinforced the importance of having functioning smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in the home.

As the weather turns cooler and we say goodbye to another summer Green View Family and Community Support Services is gearing up for a busy fall/winter season. Programming resumes in schools for children and youth that provide opportunities to learn new information and practice skills utilized throughout their life spans. Skills like emotional regulation, healthy friendships and relationships, communication, media literacy, and sexual health are a few examples of topics taught.

Providing a safe space for young men WiseGuyz returns this fall. The program was created by the Centre for Sexuality and described as "... a healthy relationship, life skills program for male-identified individuals in grade nine. WiseGuyz is an evidence-informed participatory program designed to promote healthy relationships and prevent adolescent dating violence." Through this participatory program facilitators encourage participants to reflect on what it means to be a man and how their decisions impact the world around them.

There are services and programs available that assist older adults. Life can be challenging as a human ages and Green View FCSS is here to help in a variety of ways. We can assist with filling out forms to gain access to federal and provincial support. The Home Support program provides light housekeeping, meal preparations, and transportation to access essential needs. Programs like Wheels for Meals and workshops on advanced planning (preparing documents and information needed when you or a family member has a sudden death or emergency) are also available. For a complete list of programs and services available through Green View FCSS you can visit or call our office in Valleyview or Grande Cache. The information is also available on the Municipal District of Greenview website.







Death Cafes

New this fall, residents in Grande Cache, the Cooperatives, and Enterprises will have the opportunity to attend a Death Café in the month of November. These conversational evenings will take place on Mondays (November 6, 13, 20, 27), 6:30 pm – 7:30 pm at the Green View FCSS office (10001 Hoppe Avenue). Death Cafés are not grief support or counselling, instead they are group directed discussions of death with no agenda, objectives or themes. If you are interested in exploring the topic of death in a comfortable social setting, consider attending. It is free to attend with refreshments and a light snack provided.

WiseGuyz Program

Returning for the second year, the WiseGuyz program will be delivered in Valleyview and Grande Cache to grade 9 students. The program, designed by the Centre for Sexuality, has been around for 10 years and has proven successful in its approach to reducing adolescent dating violence. The 22-week participatory program covers topics like, healthy relationships, harmful gender stereotypes, sexual health, gender and the media and bystander behavior.

Meadows to Mountains Homelessness Prevention Project

The Meadows to Mountains Homelessness Prevention Project is available to residents of the Municipal District of Greenview. An individual or family can very quickly move from solid ground to shaky ground when unexpected job loss, affordable housing, injury or illness happens. Working with clients, Green View FCSS staff will assist in identifying supports, income opportunities and build a personalized success plan to prevent homelessness.

The Rural Development Network provides funding for the project under the federal Reaching Home Program. If you would like more information on how we can help reach out to your closest FCSS.

Construction Update of the New Wastewater Treatment Plant in Grande Cache



Construction has progressed over the summer and into the fall on the Grande Cache Wastewater Treatment Facility upgrade project. Work started with excavating the future twin bioreactor and clarifier treatment structures and continued with pouring the main concrete slab to support the wall, pipes, pumps, and other treatment equipment. As shown in the picture the circular elements show the location of the clarifiers while the larger rectangular section is the bioreactors. Between the clarifiers and bioreactors is the pump room where many of the pumps, pipes, and other equipment is housed that transfer the wastewater between treatment areas. As of late September, circular form work was hoisted into place to start the construction of the clarifier walls, standing just under 6m high. With one side of the formwork anchored down, reinforcement is being installed and the first section of wall will be poured in mid-October. Construction on the large concrete structure will continue through the winter and will be complete by spring 2024.

Other work has included draining the contents of one of the existing sludge ponds. Once all of the contents were removed, reconstruction work began with excavating out the first pond and installing various piping infrastructure that will connect the new equalization pond (for high flow events) to the rest of the wastewater treatment system. To continue building the pond, layers of geotextile and geo-membranes will line the pond to separate the ponds future contents from the ground. Once the first pond is temporarily connected to the existing system, reconstruction of the second pond can start. This ensures that the existing system can continue to function as normal while the new facility is constructed.

The Grande Cache Wastewater Treatment Facility is receiving these upgrades and new infrastructure while the current facility remains at full operation. This allows continued and reliable service to the community without disruption while working to provide an improved facility in the future. The project is expected to continue until January 2026 when full operations will be switched over to the new facility and any remaining portions of the old facility properly taken off-line and disposed of.

The MD of Greenview has successfully purchased, subdivided, and rezoned 2,000 acres of land, for the creation of an Eco - Industrial parcel of land which is the Greenview Industrial Gateway (GIG). This 2,000-acre parcel is conveniently located 40 kms south of the City of Grande Prairie on highway 40 which boasts many amenities that will be able to support the eco-industrial park by providing access to millions of cubic metres of water, Atco 144 kV powerline, an abundance of natural gas, transportation corridors such as a railway and highway. A paved industrial grade road within the GIG has been completed.

In collaboration with the County of Grande Prairie and the City of Grande Prairie, the MD of Greenview shared a booth at the Carbon Capture Canada 2023 in Edmonton from September 12-14 and the World Petroleum Congress



(WPC) in Calgary from September 18-21 to promote the region. As a result, there are now 131 vendors registered on the GIG's Local Business Vendor Directory. Residential Snowplowing Private Rural Driveways



Residents of Greenview who wish to have their driveways cleared, must first enter into a Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement releasing Greenview, Greenview employees, and agents from any potential liability arising from snowplow operations on private property. Greenview will not proceed until all documentation is complete.

This agreement can be obtained from the Administration Building in Valleyview and the Public Service Buildings in DeBolt and Grovedale. Signs are available for pickup from these locations once the agreements have been signed. Please call 780.524.7600 in Valleyview, 780.524.6094 in DeBolt, and 780.539.0863 in Grovedale for more information.

For residents who wish to have their driveway plowed and have an existing valid Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement, this is a **reminder to place your sign at a location that is easily visible to the equipment operator,** i.e., the driveway entrance. Please note that the snowplowing service is for residence access only; parking areas, granary and hay access, and other areas are not considered driveways and will not be cleared.

New applicants will need to visit an MD office, located in Valleyview (Administration Building), DeBolt (Public Services Building) or Grovedale (Public Services Building). Here you will receive a one-time Snowplow Request Sign indicating the resident's Agreement number.

The snowplow sign is to be placed at a location that is easily visible to the equipment operator when the resident is requesting the snowplow service. The driveways will be cleared as time and priorities permit, the equipment operator will record the appropriate agreement number acknowledging that the driveway has been plowed. Greenview will issue an invoice to the resident for the service monthly.

The snowplowing service is for residence access only; parking areas, granary and hay access, and other areas are not considered driveways, and will not be cleared.

For residents in the Grande Cache area's Cooperatives and Enterprises, snowplow flags can be purchased for \$50.00 plus GST at the Grande Cache Public Service Building located at 10002 Shand Avenue. This is a onetime flag that should be placed at the end of the driveway when plowing is required. The operator will pick up the flag when plowing has been completed and return it to our office so it can be utilized again.

Did you know?

Greenview's snowplowing response levels are outlined in Policy 4011 – Snow Clearing and Ice Control of Greenview Roadways and Public Buildings. Snow Removal Priorities – In cases of heavy snowfall, priorities may change with emphasis on emergency services.

- 1. Arterial Roads (major roadways that carry high volumes of traffic).
- 2. Local Residential Roads, Seasonal Roads, and Collector Roads.
- **3**. Greenview Walkways, Sidewalks, Parking Lots and Public Buildings.
- 4. Back Lanes and other areas

Urban Roadways: Snowplowing begins when accumulations reach 3-4 cm.

Rural Roadways: Arterial Roads/Paved Surfaces -Snowplowing begins when snow accumulation reaches 3 to 6 cm.

Arterial Roads/Gravel Surfaces: Snowplowing begins when snow accumulation reaches a depth of 10 to 15 cm.


Local Roads/Gravel Surfaces: Snowplowing begins when snow reaches a depth of 10 to 15 centimeters on the roadway, provided arterial and collector priorities have been plowed.

Private Driveways: Rural residential driveways with active agreements are completed at a lower priority than all of these. However, these services may all be provided in conjunction with other plowing and ice control measures for efficiency.
