



Council Highlights Summary - Valleyview, Alberta

December 12, 2023: Greenview Council Adopts Interim 2024 Operating & Capital Budgets

Council deliberated the 2024 budgets over three days in November and approved the 2024 interim operating budget and 2024 capital budget at the December 12, 2023, Regular Council Meeting. Operating expenses of \$162.8 million reflect an \$8.2 million increase from the 2023 Operating budget. However, this does include the final payment of \$15.0 million for the Hwy 40 Bridge Twinning Budget 2024 will be Project. finalized pending the completion of property assessment values, provincial requisitions collected on behalf of the Government of Alberta, and seniors' foundation requisitions. The 2024 Capital budget allows for infrastructure costs for roads, bridges, utilities, equipment, and buildings and includes \$34.2 million in new commitments. The interim budget covers dav-to-dav operating expenses and allows projects to proceed until the final budget is approved in the spring. Council will also set tax rates in the spring of 2024.

November 28, 2023: Greenview 2004 By-Election -Ward 9

Greenview Council approved Wednesday, February 15, 2024, as the date for an Advance Vote for the By-Election, with Wednesday, February 21, 2024, set as the Election date for a By-Election to fill the vacancy of one Councillor position within Ward 9. November 14, 2023: 2023 Annual Greenview Clay Shoot Report

Greenview hosted the 6th Annual Greenview Charity Clay Shoot at Shot Shell Shooting Range south of Valleyview on Thursday, September 7, 2023. This Clay Shoot Tournament was held to improve stakeholder relations and raise funds for the five Food Banks that serve Greenview (Fox Creek Food Bank Society, Valleyview Interfaith Food Bank, DeBolt Food Bank, Salvation Army (Grovedale), and Grande Cache Food Bank). Once again, Greenview received extremely generous support from sponsors and very positive feedback from attendees. highlighting this unique event as a refreshing change of pace. A whopping total of \$62,627.94 was raised this year thanks to generous sponsors and participants. Council further approved the donation of the remaining budgeted amount of \$4,908.05 to the five Food Banks that serve Greenview residents from the unspent Clay Shoot operational budget, bringing the total amount to be split equally among the food banks which serve Greenview residents to \$67,535.99.

November 14, 2023: Additional Area Structure Plan Open Houses for Hamlets of Ridgevalley and Debolt Planned

Council directed Administration to schedule an additional open house for the Hamlet of DeBolt Area Structure Plan and the Hamlet of Ridgevalley Area Structure Plan to provide further opportunity for community members to share their feedback and review draft revisions.

Embracing Sustainability: Proposed Changes to Water & Sewer Fees in March 2024

Proposed Changes to Water & Sewer Fees March 2024

At Greenview, we are committed to building a community that thrives on sustainability and responsible resource management. To align with this vision, we are implementing changes to our water and sewer fees. These adjustments aim to strike a balance between financial sustainability and encouraging responsible water usage among our residents.

What's Changing:

Water Consumption:

- Adjustment of base water consumption volume from 0-30m³ to 0-15m³ at the lower rate of \$3.50/m³.
- After reaching 15m3, additional water usage will be charged at the standard rate of \$4.00/m³.

Sewer Usage:

- Adjustment to provide 10m³ for \$24.00.
- Beyond the initial 10m³, an additional \$1.25 per m³ will be charged for sewer usage.

These changes are tentatively scheduled to take effect on March 1, 2024.

Understanding Your Bill: Base Rate and Variable Rate

Your water bill consists of two main components: the base rate and the variable rate.

- 1. Base Rate:
 - The base rate is a fixed amount that covers the essential costs associated with providing water and sewer services. This includes maintaining infrastructure, administrative expenses, and ensuring the availability of services regardless of your actual water consumption.
- 2. Variable Rate:
 - The variable rate is based on your actual water usage. For the amount of water you consume beyond the base allowance, you're charged a variable rate. This encourages responsible water usage, as you have control over your bill by managing your water consumption.

Why These Changes?

- 1. Average Water Usage:
 - The average home water usage in Alberta is between 12.0 cubic meters and 14.5 cubic meters monthly.
 - Greenview's average water use is currently 16.0 cubic

meters monthly.

- 2. Costs, Inflation, and Sustainability
 - It's essential to acknowledge that, like all Albertans, Greenview faces inflationary or rising costs for energy, power, and gas.
 - Water billing is determined by your usage. Decreasing your usage means lower bills and is good for the environment.
 - It costs energy to pump and treat water, maintain distribution systems, and treat wastewater before releasing it back into the environment.
 - Infrastructure and operational cost recovery is paramount to ensure sustainable systems for the future.

Financial Implications

Looking at our data, Greenview's water and sewer rates remain competitive. In 2023, the Hamlet and Rural Residential rates for 15 cubic meters of water and sewer combined stand at \$76.50. In 2024, there is a modest increase, bringing the total to \$82.75, reflecting a \$6.25 increase (water-only customers would see no change to their monthly bill). This increase ensures that we can maintain the highquality services our residents expect.

Your Role in Water Conservation: Tips for Residents

Our residents play a crucial role in water conservation. By implementing these changes, we aim to reduce water usage and wastage, promoting responsible consumption. Here are some tips to help you play a crucial role:

Daily Habits for Water Savings:

- 1. Fix Leaks Promptly:
 - Regularly inspect faucets, toilets, and pipes for leaks.
 - Put a few drops of food coloring in your toilet tank. If the coloring begins to appear in the bowl without flushing, you have a leak that may be wasting up to 700 liters water a day
- 2. Turn Off the Tap:
 - Conserve water by turning off the tap when not in use,

whether it's while brushing your teeth, shaving, or rinsing dishes and vegetables.

- 3. Shorten Showers:
 - Use your favorite two-minute song as a timer for enjoyable, water-efficient showers.
 - A typical shower uses 18.9 to 37.9 Liters of water per minute. Limit your showers to the time it takes to soap up, wash down, and rinse off.
- 4. Install Water-Saving Fixtures:
 - Install water-saving showerheads and low-flush or dual-flush toilets.

Kitchen & Cooking Tips

- 1. Check for Leaks:
 - Regularly check for leaks and drips in pipes.
 - Don't let water go to waste unnoticed.
- 2. Towel Management:
 - Avoid washing towels after every use; instead, hang them to dry for extended use.
- 3. Optimize Dish washing:
 - Use the dishwasher instead of hand washing (if you can).Run full dishwasher loads. Optimize loading to maximize
 - space and ensure proper cleaning.
- 4. Thawing Food:
 - Take food out of the freezer early to thaw rather than running water over it.
- 5. Refrigerator Water Jug:
 - Keep a jug of water in the fridge so you don't have to run the tap to get it cold.
- 6. Cooking Efficiency:
 - Use cooking methods that require less water than boiling a full pot, such as a steamer, pressure cooker, or cooking pasta in sauce instead of separately.
 - Find creative reuses for leftover cooking liquids.
- 7. Faucet Aerators:
 - Install aerators on faucets. They mix air with water, reducing the flow rate without compromising water pressure.
- 8. Upgrade Appliances:
 - Install water-efficient appliances. Look for high waterefficiency ratings when purchasing dishwashers and refrigerators. Energy Star–certified appliances often come with water-saving features.

Laundry & Cleaning:

- 1. Wear Clothes More Than Once:
 - Extend the life of your clothes and reduce laundry frequency.
- 2. Optimize Washing Machine Use:
 - Wash only full loads.
 - Adjust washing machine water levels to avoid excessive usage for smaller loads.
- 3. Choose shorter wash cycles.
 - Pre-treat stains.
- 4. Upgrade to High-Efficiency Washer:

- Consider upgrading to a high-efficiency washer.
- 5. Collect Rinse Water:
 - Collect rinse water (if you can) and reuse it to wash the floor.
- 6. Use Eco-Friendly Detergents:
 - Use eco-friendly laundry detergents or make your own. They minimize water pollution and require less water for effective rinsing.

Outdoor Water Conservation:

- 1. Sweep, Don't Hose:
 - Sweep driveways, sidewalks, and steps instead of hosing them off.
- 2. Smart Irrigation:
 - Use smart irrigation techniques.
 - Invest in weather-based irrigation controllers.
 - Install drip irrigation systems that deliver water directly to plant roots, reducing evaporation.
 - Never use sprinklers in the wind; water is wasted as it evaporates.
- 3. Watering Plants:
 - Water plants in the early morning or late evening when temperatures are cooler, reducing loss through evaporation.
- 4. Native Plants and Xeriscaping:
 - Choose native plants adapted to your eco-region's climate and require less water.
 - Group plants with similar water needs together to optimize irrigation.
 - Utilize mulch around plants to retain moisture and reduce evaporation.
- 5. Rainwater Harvesting:
 - Collect and reuse rainwater. Install a rain barrel or large rainwater harvesting system in your garden. Use collected water for watering plants, cleaning outdoors
 even flushing toilets.

Stay Informed & Engaged:

We value open communication with our residents. Stay informed about updates on the fee changes, which are tentatively scheduled to take effect on March 1, 2024. Feel free to reach out with any questions or insights you may have. Together, we can make Greenview a shining example of sustainability. Construction & Engineering - Township Road 683

Township Road 683 Update

The Construction and Engineering Department was brought in to assist with a sloughing issue that has been ongoing near a creek south of Valleyview.

Previous attempts to correct the issues have been ineffective to date. Geotechnical drill holes were completed to determine the road's water level and what materials could possibly be causing these issues.

Administration prepared a design to determine the structure best for this location. With the system under the road, it is anticipated to eliminate the moving of the south driving lane.

Employees Give High Scores to Northwestern Alberta Region's Quality of Life

From Media Release Grande Prairie & District Chamber of Commerce December 20, 2023.

An overwhelming majority of workers are satisfied with the region as a place to work (92 percent) and with the quality of life (86 percent) it offers, says a regional workforce study released December 19, 2023. The study dug deep into the insights of employees, job seekers and employers to guide programs and actions aimed at growing the local workforce across the region.

Conducted across the City of Grande Prairie, County of Grande Prairie, MD of Greenview and area communities, the study dug deep into the insights of employees, job seekers and employers to guide programs and actions aimed at growing the local workforce.

The research shows the region's familyfriendliness, K-12 education and recreation options along with job opportunities, job security, commute times and access to health benefits/ sick pay are top factors attracting people to work and stay in the region.

The City of Grande Prairie, County of Grande Prairie, MD of Greenview, Grande Prairie & District Chamber of Commerce, and Alberta Jobs, Economy and Trade commissioned research-firm Deloitte for the study. A total of 195 employers and 465 employees and job seekers from across the region participated in surveys conducted earlier this year.

The three municipalities are collaborating with the Grande Prairie & District Chamber of Commerce and Northwestern Polytechnic to put the data to work. Partners are building attraction and retention programs and marketing tools, which will be available to local employers and communities starting spring 2024.

Please be reminded that your 2023 Animal License has expired on December 31, 2023.

As per Bylaw No. 801; ALL dogs over the age of 4 months are required to be licensed and no more than 3 dogs per household shall be allowed.

The following fees apply for dog licenses obtained on or before the first day of February in each year:

- Spayed/Neutered Animal...... \$20.00
- Unspayed/Unneutered Animal.... \$30.00
- For licenses applied for after February 1, a \$10.00 penalty will be assessed in addition to the fees prescribed above
- Replacement cost for lost tags is \$5.00.

Families located within the MD of Greenview can explore local experiences! Most people are familiar with public library services – sign out a book, access computers and online resources. Wouldn't it be great if you and your family could sign out an experience? More than read about it – experience it! For Greenview residents in the hamlets of Grande Cache, DeBolt, and Valleyview – it is that easy.

The Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum partnered in 2020 with Grande Cache Municipal Library, Valleyview Municipal Library and DeBolt Public Library to bring the experience of "A Day at the Museum" to families in these Greenview communities. Each library was gifted and will host two Family Membership cards (\$90 value each) that library patrons can sign out like they would a book or other library resource. The Family Membership card provides one day, unlimited entry for one family of two adults and up to four children. It also grants 10% off dining at the Café on 43 Restaurant, 10% off gift shop purchases, and discounts on theatre bookings.

Museum representatives recommend checking their website or calling the museum for current information before visiting. The Phillip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum is located in Wembley, County of Grande Prairie, and is approximately 81 km from DeBolt and 206 km from Grande Cache - just 20 minutes away from Grande Prairie!

Business Licenses are now required in Greenview Hamlets

Greenview Business Licensing Bylaw 23-951

Business Licenses are now required for businesses located within Greenview Hamlets. Any person who owns or operates a business within Greenview may obtain a business license in accordance with Bylaw 23-951 and receive the benefits which are provided by Greenview for business support initiatives.

Any person owning or operating a business, within Greenview, holding a valid Development Permit, may obtain a Business License in accordance with the Business License Bylaw 23-951.

This applies to all types of businesses as stated in our Land Use Bylaws (18-800 & 799, available at https:// mdgreenview.ab.ca/government/policies-bylaws/

Why do I need a business license?

A business license shows the public that your business meets requirements and is permitted to operate within Greenview. A license may be required for insurance purposes or licensing requirements applicable to organizations outside of Greenview.

Greenview is able to offer several Small Business Tax Incentives, if your business is eligible, and provide assistance on other government funding and programs that may be available to business owners.

Where do I download the Business License Application?

A business license and other information can be found at https://mdgreenview.ab.ca/ government/forms-information/. Once the form is completed, submit the application to the Planning and Development Department. They can assist



you if a development permit is also required for your intended business use, should those additional requirements be applicable. For personal assistance, contact planning and development staff or visit our administration offices.

What is the cost?

A completed business license application is a \$100.00 application fee for a new business license and \$50.00 for an annual business license renewal.

Greenview's current Schedule of Fees Bylaw https:// mdgreenview.ab.ca/government/policies-bylaws/ provides costs for new or renewal of business licenses, temporary/special events and hawkers or peddlers licenses.

What are the benefits of a Business License:

A business license provides Greenview with permission and information to provide services which are designed to only be accessed by Greenview supported local business. Examples of this include:

- Free permit application for outdoor patio permits for outdoor food, drink or retail service in some public spaces;
- Access to Grants, such as the Greenview Small business Beautification Grant;
- The ability to apply to purchase advertising spaces on public benches in the Hamlet of Grande Cache;

- Monthly updates on new procurement opportunities available and listed in the Greenview Website;
- Proposed Small Business Tax Discounts being proposed for qualifying small businesses throughout Greenview;
- Free advertising opportunities on the Greenview business license directory and any associated Hamlet Services maps and or marketing materials;
- Emails on new programs, training, and business supports; and
- Local start up and business retention support from Greenview's Economic Development Team.

How do I renew?

A business license renewal letter is typically sent every year in November (if you renewed the year prior) to remind you to renew your business license. All Greenview business licenses expire on December 31 of the same calendar year in which your business license was issued.

If I had a business license in the past not within the last year, do I renew my business license or need to apply for a new business license?

You will need to apply for a NEW business license (\$100 fee).

The business I want to operate is not permitted in the location I would prefer, what options do I have?

The Land Use Bylaw regulates the types of business activities permitted in each district. If your business is not listed as a "permitted" or "discretionary" use for the location desired, you may apply for a Land Use Bylaw Amendment, to accommodate the proposed use

Do I need a development permit for my business?

You will most likely require a development permit to operate a business in Greenview however, some smaller businesses may be exempt from a development permit. Please contact the Planning and Development Department to ensure the proposed operation complies with the Land Use Bylaw No. 18-800 or Land Use Bylaw 799 for the Hamlet of Grande Cache and if a development permit is required, they can guide you through that process. A Development Permit is required for most businesses operating within Greenview and are issued once, requiring no annual renewal or approval. The development permit application fee is \$50.00 per \$100,000.00 of a development costs.

Greenview Online Business License Directory

Businesses wishing to be included in the business license directory must have a valid business license issued by Greenview. There is no additional fee to have your business listed in Greenview's Online Business Directory. Your company can be added to the directory at any time by completing the Business License Application form.

Keep us updated

Please note, that if there have been any changes to your business operation, a development permit is required prior to the issuance of a business license. If there have been any changes to your business address, name, or contact information, please ensure our office is updated in writing to

Economic Development - Beautification Grant



Greenview's Beautification Grant

Greenview is committed to supporting small businesses and entrepreneurs in our communities. Greenview aims to advance our local economic goals by encouraging pride in the success and potential of our local businesses by implementing a Beautification Grant.

The Beautification Grant acts as an immediate economic driver by providing local employment and business for local trades and suppliers and enhancing building aesthetics, contributing to the beautification and vibrancy of Greenview and its communities.

The beautification grant will pay businesses between **50-70% of eligible costs, up to a maximum of \$5,000,** depending on where your business is located within Greenview.

To be eligible for the Storefront Stream, applicants must meet the following requirements:

 Operates a small business on a parcel of land zoned for commercial purposes as per Greenview's Land Use Bylaw.

The Beautification Grant will remain open until grant funding has been allocated.

Greenview Beautification has two (2) streams:

Storefront Stream and Small Business Stream. The difference between the streams is the amount of reimbursement.

Businesses that are eligible for **Storefront Stream** can apply for up to 70% of total project costs up to a maximum of \$5,000.00.

Businesses that are eligible for Small Business Stream can apply for up to 50% of total project costs up to a

maximum of \$5,000.00.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria for either stream to be considered for a beautification grant:

- Must be a small business.
- Must be located within Greenview.
- Must hold a valid Greenview Business License.
- Must plan to use this program for the purpose relating to the exterior or signage of the building. Examples may include:
 - Restoration of exterior finishes and repainting, including murals.
 - Planter, hanging baskets, and garden areas, especially in downtown hamlet setting.
 - Repair or replacement of storefront windows, patios, and doors.
 - Exterior lighting of the building and signage.
 - Signage on the front of the business location.
 - Replacement of awnings and signs.
 - New architectural details, such as entryway features and cornices.
 - Addition of patio areas and permanent landscaping elements; and
 - Removal of barriers to access for people with disabilities and mobility challenges.

Note: The above list is not exhaustive, and other improvements may be considered eligible if they align with the program's objectives and comply with the applicable development regulations.



Sign up for the Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP)

If interested in the TIPP but missed the January deadline, you can now enroll during *any month* by submitting the application form before the 20th of any month. Scan QR code below for Application.

The Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP) offers MD of Greenview taxpayers a convenient plan that enables you to pay your property tax in 12 monthly payments (January-December) instead of one annual payment.

Your payment automatically comes out of your account on the last business day of every month, making budgeting easier and eliminating late penalties. Payment due dates are indicated on your property tax bill.

Monthly payments are calculated by dividing the annual tax levy from the preceding year by twelve (12) for the payment amount for January to May. The monthly payments from June to December will be the amount owing after the new levy is calculated divided by seven (7) months. This will result in a zero balance at the end of the year. You will be notified of the change in payment amount on your tax notice. TIPPS automatically continues from year to year; you only need to enroll once.

Residential Snowplowing Agreements & Snow Clearing



Residents of Greenview who wish to have their driveways cleared, must first enter into a Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement releasing Greenview, Greenview employees, and agents from any potential liability arising from snowplow operations on private property. Greenview will not proceed until all documentation is complete.

This agreement can be obtained from the Administration Building in Valleyview and the Public Service Buildings in DeBolt and Grovedale. Signs are available for pickup from these locations once the agreements have been signed. Please call 780.524.7600 in Valleyview, 780.524.6094 in DeBolt, and 780.539.0863 in Grovedale for more information.

For residents who wish to have their driveway plowed and have an existing valid Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement, this is a **reminder to place your sign at a location that is easily visible to the equipment operator,** i.e., the driveway entrance. Please note that the snowplowing service is for residence access only; parking areas, granary and hay access, and other areas are not considered driveways and will not be cleared.

New applicants will need to visit an MD office, located in Valleyview (Administration Building), DeBolt (Public Services Building) or Grovedale (Public Services Building). Here you will receive a one-time Snowplow Request Sign indicating the resident's Agreement number.

The snowplow sign is to be placed at a location that is easily visible to the equipment operator when the resident is requesting the snowplow service. The driveways will be cleared as time and priorities permit, the equipment operator will record the appropriate agreement number acknowledging that the driveway has been plowed. Greenview will issue an invoice to the resident for the service monthly.

The snowplowing service is for residence access only; parking areas, granary and hay access, and other areas are not considered driveways, and will not be cleared.

RESIDENTIAL SNOWPLOW Greenview's Snow Clearing -AGREEMENTS Did you know?

Greenview's snowplowing response levels are outlined in Policy 4011 – Snow Clearing and Ice Control of Greenview Roadways and Public Buildings. Snow Removal Priorities – In cases of heavy snowfall, priorities may change with emphasis on emergency services.

Snow Removal Priorities:

- #1. Arterial Roads (major roadways that carry high volumes of traffic)
- **#2**. Local Residential Roads, Seasonal Roads, and Collector Roads
- **#3**. Greenview Walkways, Sidewalks, Parking Lots and Public Buildings
- **#4**. Back Lanes and other areas
- #5. Rural residential snowplowing

Grande Cache Snow Removal Bylaw 774 Reminders

Bylaw 774 to control and regulate the removal of snow and ice from sidewalks and run off from roof or other drains onto sidewalks in Grande Cache.

A few important reminders:

- Whenever snow or ice is deposited on a sidewalk, adjacent to a parcel of land, the owner and/or occupant of the parcel shall remove the snow or ice from the sidewalk within:
 - a) Twenty-four (24) hours for commercial property (Sundays and Statutory Holidays excepted).
 - b) Forty-eight (48) hours for residential property (Sundays and Statutory Holidays excepted).
- A person shall not place, or permit to be placed, any snow, ice or other material removed from private property onto a highway or other public property.
- A person shall not place, or permit to be placed, any snow, ice or other material removed from a public property onto another public property or onto property other than his own.
- The provisions of this Bylaw shall be enforced by the Peace Officer or other such person as appointed by Council to enforce this Bylaw 744.


