

Council Highlights Summary - Valleyview, Alberta

January 9, 2024: Greenview Approves the 2024 Schedule of Fees Bylaw

Council gave a third and final reading to Bylaw 24-970 – 2024 Schedule of Fees, which saw updates made to descriptions and rates in a few departments. Highlights of the changes include a reduction in cost for dust control in multi-parcel subdivisions, an increase in Road Bond Fees, the introduction of two-day rental rates for Agricultural Services Rental equipment, as well as changes in quantities per unit in water and sewer rates.

January 9, 2024: Grande Prairie Sports Connection Awards Sponsorship Approved

Council approved an individual award sponsorship for "Community Sportsmanship" in the amount of \$500.00 per year for a five-year period for the 2024 Grande Prairie Sports Connection Awards event April 12, 2024, in Grande Prairie, AB. The Northwest Alberta Sport Excellence Awards is an annual event celebrating and recognizing the region's athletes, coaches, teams, officials, and

volunteers, with many of the nominated participants being residents of Greenview each year.

January 9, 2024: Greenview Council Supports the Holistic Management Conference

The Holistic Management Canada Council is a national non-profit organization whose members have been, throughout generations, focusing on regenerating the land and its people on farms and ranches. Council approved a sponsorship of \$6,000.00 to the Holistic Management Canada Council for the Holistic Management Conference, to be hosted on February 10-11, 2024, in Valleyview, Alberta, with funds to come from the 2024 **Community Services Donations** and Sponsorships budget.

January 23, 2024: 2024 Community Grant Requests

Greenview Council deems it desirable to provide stable funding agreements to non-profit organizations that provide direct and indirect benefits to Greenview residents and surrounding communities.

Council approved funding to

grant recipients in the amount of \$641,750.00 to assist 16 non-profit organizations that serve Greenview residents.

January 23, 2024: Grande Cache Minor Hockey U13 Sponsorship

Grande Cache has been chosen as the host community of the U13 2024 Hockey Alberta Provincial Championships on March 21-24, 2024. The Grande Cache Minor Hockey Association has spent many hours of volunteer time applying to be a host community. This event will be used as a fundraiser for a local program called "Legacy Plan," which aims to provide local youth, particularly those who may face financial constraints, to attend hockey camps to enhance their skills. Greenview Council approved a sponsorship in the amount of \$21,800.00 to assist with the operational costs of hosting this

January 23, 2024: Ridgevalley Streetlights

Administration had received feedback regarding the street-lighting along RR 262 within the Hamlet of Ridgevalley,

specifically along the area where children attending Ridgevalley School must cross the road. During the dark winter months, visibility is reduced making safety a concern. Council requested that Administration proceed with the installation of additional streetlights in the area around the school and arena, along with a public open house to discuss the need for future additional streetlights within the hamlet.

January 23, 2024: Maskwa Medical Clinic

Greenview Council authorized Administration to enter into an agreement with Maskwa Medical Center (Canada) Inc. in the amount of \$500,000.00 for the design and engineering services for the Maskwa Medical Center building. The Maskwa Medical Center project was founded in 2019 after recognizing Northern Alberta's need for better access to diagnostic services.

February 13, 2024: Greenview Approves the Sale of Municipal Lot in Grande Cache

A proposal has been submitted to Administration to buy a section of municipally held land in the Grande Cache hamlet, officially known as Plan 972 0898, Block 38, Lot 3PUL, which is located about 100 meters (330 feet) north of the tourism centre. The relevant land is a Public Utility Land (PUL) and measures around 0.935 hectares (2.31 ac). The applicant is interested in purchasing the nearby, vacant PUL because they also intend to purchase Lot 2, next to the PUL, to build a training facility to assist future mining operations near Grande Cache. However, the lot is not large enough for the intended facility. The purchase of this additional land will allow the applicant to complete construction of their training facility. Council approved the sale of approximately 0.768 hectares (1.9 acres) of Plan 972 0898, Block 38, Lot 3PUL for fair market value as determined by a third-party appraisal, subject to subdivision and consolidation with the adjacent lands described as Plan 972 0898, Block 38, Lot 2.

February 13, 2024: "Ride for Vision & Valour" Commemorative Event to Honour Regional World War II Veterans Sponsorship Approved

Council approved a sponsorship to the Canadian Motorcycle Tourism Association in the amount of \$1,000.00 for a sponsorship and up to \$200.00 for an in-kind donation, for the 2024 "Ride for Vision & Valour" Commemoration Event, to be held June 7-9, 2024, in Grande Prairie, with funds to come from the Community Services Sponsorships and Donations budget. The Canadian Motorcycle Tourism Association is a non-profit organization whose mission is "To honor, dedicate & Interpret the military history of Northwestern Alberta". The Association owns

and operates the Veterans Memorial Gardens and Interpretive Centre in Grande Prairie, AB.

February 13, 2024: Greenview Industrial Gateway Sponsorship Agreement with Evergreen Park Approved

Administration presented an opportunity for a three-year sponsorship of a Greenview Industrial Gateway (GIG) fence sign at Evergreen Park in Grande Prairie, AB. This sign will be located along the fence at the entrance/exit to Evergreen Park. In addition to the fence sponsorship promotional ads for the GIG will be shared on promotional screens in the TARA Centre, Wild Horse Casino & Lounge, under the Grandstand, and in the Pines Family Restaurant at no extra cost. Council moved to enter into a three-year sponsorship agreement with Evergreen Park for a Greenview Industrial Gateway Fence Sign for \$2,500.00 annually from 2024-2026 as well as a \$400.00 production cost for the sign, with funds to come from the Greenview Industrial Gateway Budget.

March 12, 2024: Ridgevally Seniors Assistance Society Grant Request

The Ridgevalley Seniors Assistance Society applied for a capital grant at the October 2023 grant deadline for the 2024 calendar year, requesting funds to complete various capital projects within the facility. Council approved a capital grant in the amount of \$112,727.61 to the Ridgevalley Seniors Assistance Society, with funds to come from the Community Services Grants to Organizations budget.

Engage Greenview Website Survey

Greenview's website is an important communication tool that provides a variety of information about programs, services, and operations to its residents, businesses and visitors. The current Greenview website was launched in 2020 and has seen an average of 75,000 users each year. We continue to see an increase in users year after year.

Greenview is at the beginning stages of a website redesign project, and insights gathered through the survey will help shape the new website updates.

The requirements for our website have since evolved, and Greenview staff are launching a consultation process to uncover user motivations and needs for 2024 and beyond. The feedback gathered through public engagement opportunities will provide staff with valuable insight into what's working and not working and ensure any updates and redevelopment work that is done meets the needs of our residents and stakeholders.

The purpose of this website redesign project is to enhance the overall user experience for you and our online visitors and improve the way you access information and services on our website.



Facility Maintenance Projects

Grande Cache Public Works Building - New Shop & Offices



Facility Maintenance has numerous capital projects set to begin Spring 2024:

On March 23, 2023 at the Regular Council Meeting, a tender was approved for the construction of a new Grande Cache Operations building. Council awarded tender AB-2024-00684 to GenMec ACL Inc., in the amount of \$11,629,125.00 plus GST, and approved additional funding in the amount of \$1,364,164.00 to cover contingency costs with funds to come from capital project FM22008 and Facilities Reserves respectively. The existing building predates when the Town of Grande Cache was established and the building no longer meets operational requirements. The new building will be constructed on the existing site without disrupting normal operations. It is anticipated that construction will commence in May.

Another capital project slotted for 2024 is Council's initiative for Generator Ready Preparedness at the Greenview Regional Multiplex, the Grovedale

Community Complex and the Little Smoky Community Hall. This project will provide easy connection points

for portable generators in order to restore power within a few hours during an event. This project is anticipated to start in May and be completed by fall 2024.

The Grovedale Arena's long-term viability depends on modernizing its ice plant to today's standards, all while minimizing disruption to the skating and hockey season. The project involves replacement of the 40-year-old chiller, upgrades to the system piping, converting of controls to Programmable Logic Control system, rebuilding the main compressor and replacement of the refrigerant to the latest environmentally friendly version. This work is scheduled to start in early May after the ice is removed and anticipated to be ready for the September ice installation.

These major initiatives are complemented by additional siding and roofing projects across various Greenview buildings, underscoring a commitment to proactive maintenance and facility asset improvements.



Greenview Career Connects Career & Employment Fair - Grande Cache

Greenview's Economic Development team is partnering with local non-profit groups to host a career fair in Grande Cache on **April 30, 2024** from 3:00 - 7:00 pm at the Grande Cache Legion.

This event will help connect employers to potential candidates, offer career planning resources such as resume writing, introduce local youth to the employment and industry opportunities within the region and provide information on available resources and programs such as those offered by Community Futures including small business start-up and entrepreneurial resources, CLERC services, CAREERS Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) and MORE!

Media Release: Agricultural Challenges and Advocacy Efforts

February 22, 2024

Municipal District of Greenview, Alberta – Greenview's Agricultural Service Board and Council recognizes the importance of actively engaging in advocacy on behalf of Greenview's Agricultural producers to ensure the long-term viability and prosperity of its agricultural sector. We sat down with Greenview's Agricultural Service Board (ASB) Chair Warren Wohlgemuth, ASB Vice Chair, Deputy Reeve Bill Smith, and ASB Council Member Dave Berry to shed some light on what steps Greenview's ASB has taken to help agricultural producers in Greenview.

"On August 23, 2023, Greenview's Agricultural Service Board took a significant step by urging Greenview Administration to delve into the possibility of declaring an Agricultural Disaster. The thorough investigation encompassed the review of crop reports spanning from May to September 2023, consultations with producers, and reaching out to the Agriculture Financial Services Corporation (AFSC). While annual crops saw record yields, forages faced a challenging year. Despite these circumstances and as the criteria for declaration had not been met, on September 27, 2023, the board chose not to recommend a declaration to Council." This underscores the intricate decisions we face in navigating the dynamic realities of our agricultural landscape." – Warren Wohlgemuth, ASB Board Chair

Criteria for a Declaration of Agricultural Disaster

To meet the criteria for such a declaration, 25% - 50% of hectares of crops and forages must be rated as "poor." This benchmark serves as a measure of the severity of agricultural challenges within a municipality.

Exclusion from the Canada-Alberta Drought Livestock **Assistance Program**

"Greenview's exclusion from the 2023 Canada-Alberta Drought Livestock Assistance initiative raised eyebrows. Despite lobbying efforts by the Province for the inclusion of all municipalities, the federal government declined the request. A closer examination revealed that the affected municipalities are primarily comprised of extensive forested crown lands with smaller zones of privately held agricultural lands. The Canadian Drought Monitor's aggregation of weather data failed to account for the nuanced differences in precipitation patterns between these areas, leading to an incomplete understanding of the challenges faced by local producers." - Bill Smith, ASB Vice Chair and Deputy Reeve.

Advocacy Efforts by Greenview's Agricultural Service **Board**

In response to the exclusion, Greenview's Agricultural Service Board, in collaboration with Brazeau County and the MD of Lesser Slave River, took a proactive stance. On February 2, 2024, they addressed their concerns in a letter to the Federal Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food, expressing discontent with the decision and urging reconsideration.

Empowering Local Producers to Advocate

Dave Berry, ASB Council Member, underscores the need for advocacy, stating, "Local producers play a crucial role in amplifying the advocacy efforts. By contacting their respective Member of Parliament and Minister of the Legislative Assembly, they can contribute to the collective voice seeking fair representation and support for Greenview's agricultural sector. The call to action is clear: support the endeavors to secure assistance and recognition for the challenges faced by the local agricultural community."

Concluding Thoughts

Greenview's agricultural community is at the heart of a dynamic and challenging landscape. The ASB's tireless efforts mirror a deep dedication to understanding and tackling the complexities that define agriculture in our region. As we come together in these advocacy efforts, we envision a future where our farming community not only survives but truly thrives. We hope for policies that understand the distinct challenges and valuable contributions of Greenview.

ASB Chair Warren Wohlgemuth stated, "Though the road ahead may be tough, with everyone pitching in and working together, we believe our agricultural sector in Greenview can not only weather the challenges but come out even more robust and resilient than before. I want to emphasize that Greenview Council recognizes the paramount importance of actively engaging in advocacy to safeguard the long-term viability and prosperity of our agricultural sector."

Just a heads up! Greenview's annual weed inspections will be starting in May for the 2024 season. If you have an infestation, we will be attempting contact by phone. Greenview also has programs available to assist you in controlling those pesky weeds.

Rural Acreage Owner Program - Did You Know?

Did you know that the Rural Acreage Owner Herbicide Program was initiated to ensure rural acreage owners (RAO) have access to select Commercial class herbicides to control Prohibited Noxious and Noxious weeds (as identified in the Weed Control Act)? If you're a Greenview resident, call us to see if you qualify!



Herbicide Retailer

Did you know that Greenview Agricultural Services has been designated as a herbicide retailer for a select few range and pasture products? This program is available for landholders who have pasture, hay land, grazing leases, and/or a grazing reserve and wish to control weed species on their property.

Annual Spray Program & Spray Exemption Agreements

Greenview's annual roadside vegetation management program will be commencing for the 2024 season, focusing on DeBolt, Puskwaska, and Grovedale with spot spraying being conducted in other areas. Do you want an exemption from the program? Call us for more information.

Provincial Pest Surveillance Surveys



Business Licenses are now required in Greenview Hamlets

Greenview Business Licensing Bylaw 23-951

Business Licenses are required for businesses located within Greenview Hamlets. Any person who owns or operates a business within Greenview may obtain a business license in accordance with Bylaw 23-951 and receive the benefits which are provided by Greenview for business support initiatives. Greenview had extended the business license renewal date to March 28, 2024, as advertised (which aimed to maximize the benefits provided by Greenview); and it is important to apply for a business licence as per Bylaw 23-951, stating that business Licenses are now required for businesses located within Greenview Hamlets, including Grande Cache, DeBolt, Ridgevalley, Grovedale, Little Smoky and Landry Heights.

Why do I need a business license?

A business license shows the public that your business meets requirements and is permitted to operate within Greenview. A license may be required for insurance purposes or licensing requirements applicable to organizations outside of Greenview. Greenview is able to offer several Small Business Tax Incentives, if your business is eligible, and provide assistance on other government funding and programs that may be available to business owners.

Where do I download the Business License Application?

The business license application and other information can be found at https://mdgreenview. ab.ca/government/forms-information/. Once the form is complete, submit the application to the Planning and Development Department.



They can assist you if a development permit is also required for your intended business use, should those additional requirements be applicable. For personal assistance, contact planning and development staff or visit our administration offices.

What is the cost?

- ▶ \$100.00 application fee for a new business license
- ▶ \$50.00 for an annual business license renewal

Greenview's current Schedule of Fees Bylaw https://mdgreenview.ab.ca/government/policies-bylaws/provides costs for new or renewal of business licenses, temporary/special events and hawkers or peddlers licenses.

What are the benefits of a Business License:

A business license provides Greenview with permission and information to provide services which are designed to only be accessed by Greenview supported local business. Examples of this include:

- Free permit application for outdoor patio permits for outdoor food, drink or retail service in some public spaces;
- Access to grants, such as the Greenview Small Business Beautification Grant;
- The ability to apply to purchase advertising spaces on public benches in the Hamlet of Grande Cache;
- Monthly updates on new procurement

opportunities available and listed in the Greenview Website;

- Proposed Small Business Tax Discounts being proposed for qualifying small businesses throughout Greenview;
- Free advertising opportunities on the Greenview business license directory and any associated Hamlet services maps and or marketing materials;
- Emails on new programs, training, and business supports; and
- Local start up and business retention support from Greenview's Economic Development Team.

How do I renew?

A business license renewal letter is typically sent every year in November (if you renewed the year prior) to remind you to renew your business license. All Greenview business licenses expire on December 31 of the same calendar year in which your business license was issued.

If I had a business license in the past not within the last year, do I renew my business license or need to apply for a new business license?

You will need to apply for a NEW business license (\$100 fee).

The business I want to operate is not permitted in the location I would prefer, what options do I have?

The Land Use Bylaw regulates the types of business activities permitted in each district. If your business is not listed as a "permitted" or "discretionary" use for the location desired, you may apply for a Land Use Bylaw Amendment, to accommodate the proposed use

Do I need a development permit for my business?

You will most likely require a development permit to operate a business in Greenview however, some smaller businesses may be exempt from a development permit. Please contact the Planning and Development Department to ensure the proposed operation complies with the Land Use Bylaw No. 18-800 or Land Use Bylaw 799 for the Hamlet of Grande Cache and if a development permit is required, they can guide you through that process. A Development Permit is required for most businesses operating within Greenview and are issued once, requiring

no annual renewal or approval. The development permit application fee is \$50.00 per \$100,000.00 of a development costs.

Greenview Online Business License Directory

Businesses wishing to be included in the business license directory must have a valid business license issued by Greenview. There is no additional fee to have your business listed in Greenview's Online Business Directory. Your company can be added to the directory at any time by completing the Business License Application form.

Keep us updated

Please note, that if there have been any changes to your business operation, a development permit is required prior to the issuance of a business license. Beautification Grant

Greenview is committed to supporting small businesses and entrepreneurs in our communities. Greenview aims to advance our local economic goals by encouraging pride in the success and potential of our local businesses by implementing a Beautification Grant.

The Beautification Grant acts as an immediate economic driver by providing local employment and business for local trades and suppliers and enhancing building aesthetics, contributing to the beautification and vibrancy of Greenview and its communities.

The beautification grant will pay businesses between 50-70% of eligible costs, up to a maximum of \$5,000, depending on where your business is located within Greenview.

To be eligible for the Storefront Stream, applicants must meet the following requirements:

 Operates a small business on a parcel of land zoned for commercial purposes as per Greenview's Land Use Bylaw.

The Beautification Grant will remain open until grant funding has been allocated.

Greenview Beautification has two (2) streams:

Storefront Stream and Small Business Stream. The difference between the streams is the amount of reimbursement.

Businesses that are eligible for **Storefront Stream** can apply for up to 70% of total project costs up to a maximum of \$5,000.00.

Businesses that are eligible for Small Business Stream can apply for up to 50% of total project costs up to a maximum of \$5,000.00.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria for either stream to be considered for a beautification grant:

- Must be a small business.
- Must be located within Greenview.
- Must hold a valid Greenview Business License.
- Must plan to use this program for the purpose relating to the exterior or signage of the building.

Examples may include:

- Restoration of exterior finishes and repainting, including murals.
- Planter, hanging baskets, and garden areas, especially in downtown hamlet setting.
- Repair or replacement of storefront windows, patios, and doors.
- Exterior lighting of the building and signage.
- Signage on the front of the business location.
- Replacement of awnings and signs.
- New architectural details, such as entryway features and cornices.
- Addition of patio areas and permanent landscaping elements; and
- Removal of barriers to access for people with disabilities and mobility challenges.

Note: The above list is not exhaustive, and other improvements may be considered eligible if they align with the program's objectives and comply with the applicable development regulations.



The Philip J. Please be reminded that your 2023 Animal License has expired on December 31, 2023.

Please visit us at the Grande Cache Public Service Building (located at 10002 Shand Avenue) to have your animal's license renewed for the 2024 year.

As per Bylaw No. 801; ALL dogs over the age of 4 months are required to be licensed and no more than 3 dogs per household shall be allowed.

The following fees apply for dog licenses obtained on or before the first day of February in each year:

- Spayed/Neutered Animal...... \$20.00
- Unspayed/Unneutered Animal.... \$30.00
- For licenses applied for after February 1, a \$10.00 penalty will be assessed in addition to the fees prescribed above.
- Replacement cost for lost tags is \$5.00.

We invite you to join us in promoting a culture of responsible pet ownership. This can be accomplished by obtaining a license for your cherished pet, ensuring cleanliness by promptly cleaning up after them, and safeguarding both their safety and others by keeping them on a leash. Landfill Litter Cleanup:

The MD of Greenview has a Municipal Roadside & Facility/Community Cleanup Policy. It is important to keep our communities clean and litter-free. Greenview will provide an opportunity for Community-Recognized Non-Profit Organizations (NPO) to apply to clean up Greenview's identified an advertised roadsides, transfer stations and landfill sites, and in return, a pre-established, financial donation will be provided to the NPO. We will sponsor up to \$1,500.00 in exchange for doing onsite litter pickup at our Landfills or Transfer stations. We are finalizing a date for this program; please watch our social media channels for the post!

Utilities

Hydrant Flushing:

Flushing hydrants is a proactive and preventive measure that contributes to the overall health and functionality of a water distribution system. It plays a crucial role in maintaining water quality, preventing bacterial growth, ensuring fire protection capabilities, and identifying and addressing potential issues within the system. Regular flushing is often part of a water utility's routine maintenance program.

Water Meter Inspection Program:

Beginning in 2023, the Utilities Department in Grande Cache began inspecting and replacing water meters in residents' homes and businesses, completing a total of 221 meters. Older meters have aged out and batteries are beginning to fail. We are continuing this water meter renewal program this year, planning to inspect and repair hundreds of meters again. If your home is on the list for its meter inspection, you will be receiving a call for an appointment. Water meters measure the amount of water entering homes and businesses, and this program will improve efficiency as well as ensuring accurate reads for residents and Greenview to account for all our water.

SCADA Little Smokey

SCADA Little Smoky: Greenview is committed to safe drinking water and supply; as part of

that commitment, we are upgrading our SCADA (Supervisory Computer and Data Acquisition) systems. Little Smoky water plant SCADA upgrade was completed in 2023; this system allows for alarm status monitoring and continuous monitoring of water levels, chlorine residuals, pressures and pumping, to name a few. This gives operators remote capability to log into the system in alarm events and diagnose or fix issues from off-site when on call and after hours to ensure system is operating within in parameters.

Sewage Treatment Plant Road & Trail Closures, Grande Cache

Effective April 1st to November 30, 2024, the Sewage Treatment Plant Road will be closed due to the construction of the new Wastewater Treatment Plant, affecting trail access in the area.

Please plan your outdoor trail use accordingly, considering these trailhead closures. For example, if you are on Bucksaw Ridge Trail, you will not be able to exit on Bucksaw Ridge onto the Sewage Treatment Road, so please pre-plan your route.


The expected timeframe for the completion of the Wastewater Treatment Plant construction is projected to be January 2026.

Sign up for the Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP)

If interested in the TIPP but missed the January deadline, you can now enroll during *any month* by submitting the application form before the 20th of any month. Scan QR code below for Application.

The Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP) offers MD of Greenview taxpayers a convenient plan that enables you to pay your property tax in 12 monthly payments (January-December) instead of one annual payment.

Your payment automatically comes out of your account on the last business day of every month, making budgeting easier and eliminating late penalties. Payment due dates are indicated on your property tax bill.

Monthly payments are calculated by dividing the annual tax levy from the preceding year by twelve (12) for the payment amount for January to May. The monthly payments from June to December will be the amount owing after the new levy is calculated divided by seven (7) months. This will result in a zero balance at the end of the year. You will be notified of the change in payment amount on your tax notice. TIPPS automatically continues

from year to year; you only need to enroll once.

Construction & Engineering

The Construction and Engineering Department is looking forward to another great construction year. During this time, we ask that you watch for workers and equipment, and to follow the speed limits through any construction zones throughout Greenview.

The following capital projects are slotted for 2024:

- Forestry Trunk Road between KM 71-81, for road regrade in specific areas of concern and ditching.
- Range Road 212 This a new section of road that was approved by Counil for landowners to access to their quarter. It is approximately 850 m in length.
- Bridge File 76637 located on Township Road 692, in the Little Smoky area, for a bridge replacement.
- Township Road 704, in the Valleyview area, for overlay and base repairs.

DID YOU KNOW?

A culvert below 1500mm (5-foot) diameter is classed as a culvert.

- These culverts are maintained and replaced by Greenview
- Funds from the operational approved budget.
- Funding is not available provincially for these replacements.

A culvert over 1500mm diameter is classed as a bridge file.

- The numbers associated, i.e. 76637, are assigned by Alberta Transportation
- These bridge files are under the responsibility of Greenview for replacement and maintenance.
- Funding is available only when a full replacement is required.
- Funding is through Alberta Transportation
 Department through the Strategic Transportation
 Infrastructure Program, also known as STIP
 Funding.



Media Release: January 30, 2024

The Municipal District of Greenview signs a Memorandum of Understanding with Interprovincial Fuel Solutions Ltd. to further expand development in the Greenview Industrial Gateway

MD of Greenview Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Interprovincial Fuel Solutions Ltd. (IFS) to purchase approximately 200 acres (81 hectares) in the Greenview Industrial Gateway (GIG) at the January 23, 2024, Regular Council meeting. IFS intends to develop and construct a \$600 million dollar petrochemical facility on the site to manufacture synthetic low-carbon gasoline from natural gas, water and oxygen (Synthetic Gasoline Facility) and subsequently dispose of excess effluent carbon dioxide from GIG lands via permanent carbon capture and sequestration (CSS).

IFS's Synthetic Gasoline Facility has the capability to produce 5,600 barrels per onstream-day of drop-in lowcarbon ultra-clean synthetic gasoline that is in line with the current and 2030 fuel regulations required in Canada. The Synthetic Gasoline Facility will also produce 250,000 tonnes per year of pure pre-combustion of carbon dioxide, which will be permanently sequestered, and clean hydrogen, which will be used as a fuel for clean and no emissions combustion. IFS will utilize commercially proven technology for its facility to produce highoctane synthetic motor-grade gasoline for consumption by the transportation industry, which requires no new distribution infrastructure, thus fueling the transition to a low-carbon economy. IFS anticipates the development of its Synthetic Gasoline Facility to commence in 2025, with construction to commence in 2026.

The planned IFS Synthetic Gasoline Facility in the GIG will generate approximately 600 regional construction positions with an estimated 50-70 full-time positions once construction is complete. IFS company executives anticipate that this project will proceed quickly once the final investment decision has been reached and a land purchase agreement has been signed with the MD of Greenview.



Reeve Tyler Olsen underscored the significance of this agreement for the region.

"This gasoline will have the lowest carbon intensity score in the market, with the majority of this potentially consumed within the Grande Prairie Region. Taking locally produced natural gas and upgrading it to gasoline and hydrogen follows the exact vision for the GIG. This development will create hundreds of jobs, local business opportunities, and substantial taxes municipally, provincially, and federally. The development of hydrogen is very exciting and highlights that this region is moving in the right direction."

IFS is the third major investor in the GIG, spearheading GIG to be on track to become one of Canada's leading net-zero, eco-industrial developments in Alberta for natural gas processing and manufacturing with low-carbon emissions.

In the first quarter of 2022, the MD of Greenview signed an MOU with Cerilon GTL Inc. to construct a \$2.8 billion dollar Ultra-Low sulphur diesel and jet fuel facility. In late 2021, Greenview signed an agreement with Northern Petro Chemical Corporation to construct a \$2.5 billion Blue Methanol and Blue Ammonia production facility.
