# **Council Highlights Summary - Valleyview, Alberta**

# September 10, 2024: Grande Cache Airport Multi-Day Festival 2025 receives Greenview Council approval for collaboration

The Festival Company approached Greenview Administration to leverage its expertise in organizing a large-scale, multi-day, family-friendly festival at the Grande Cache Airport in 2025. This proposed event will generate economic benefits and promote long-term growth. Under Greenview Council's direction, Administration will proceed to collaborate with local non-profit organizations, increase engagement and participate in the planning and execution of the festival. Once a non-profit group agrees to take the lead, Greenview Administration will pursue grants and other funding opportunities to support the initiative.

# July 23, 2024: Greenview to Support Regional Competitiveness Initiative

Travis Toews, a consultant for the City of Grande Prairie, presented at the July 9, 2024, Regular Council Meeting. His presentation, also delivered to the City of Grande Prairie and County of Grande Prairie Councils, covered the significant value of the resources offered in the Northwest, the progress made in marketing these resources, and the need for the region to address key deficiencies that hinder competitiveness in the market. Key recommendations from his presentation included forming a committee or organization with clear objectives and timelines to develop a comprehensive plan for improving regional competitiveness and unifying efforts to promote the region, thereby amplifying the regions' voice and impact. Council supports Greenview's

participation on the Regional Competitiveness Initiative and appointed Reeve Tyler Olsen, Deputy Reeve Bill Smith and Chief Administrative Officer Stacey Wabick to the committee, with more information and next steps to be brought back for Councils approval

# July 9, 2024: Valleyview and District Agricultural Society Gets Approval for Funding for a New Facility

The Valleyview & District Agricultural Society is a non-profit organization that has been active for 56 years and is an integral part of the community, providing a facility for recreational and educational events. The Society's current facility is experiencing significant issues and has been deemed at the end of its projected lifespan by the current Ag Society Board. To assist with this large-scale endeavour, Council directed Administration to enter into an agreement with the Valleyview and District Agricultural Society in the amount of \$4,000,000.00 for the construction of a new Agricultural Society Facility, with funds to come from the 2024 unrestricted reserves.

# June 11, 2024: Greenview Council Approves Capital Grant for Little Smoky Cemetery Improvements

The Little Smoky Cemetery Committee was formed in August 2023, and the group applied within the regular grant process for new fencing to establish correct site boundaries. Council approved a capital grant of up to \$20,000.00 to the Little Smoky Cemetery Committee to purchase and install new chain-link fencing at the Cemetery.

# **Greenview Gives Back**

Greenview Council is proud to support the Valleyview Agricultural Society, a local non-profit organization that has been active in the community for 56 years.

# **Construction and Engineering Department**

Greenview's Construction and Engineering Department has been hard at work this season, making significant progress on various projects aimed at improving the transportation network and safety across Greenview. Below is an overview of some key initiatives currently underway:

# **BF77159 Bridge Construction**

The construction of Bridge File 77159, located south of Valleyview on Township Road 674, is nearing completion. This project is a critical component of our infrastructure improvement plan. Additionally, a second bridge is slated to be completed within the construction season, further enhancing connectivity in the area.



# **Road Ditch Re-establishment**

On Township Road 714, north of Valleyview, road ditch re-establishment efforts are progressing well. This work is essential for proper drainage and road maintenance, ensuring longevity and safety for drivers.

# **Forestry Trunk Road Stabilization**

Significant progress has been made on the Forestry Trunk Road between KM 76.5 and KM 80. The road stabilization and ditch regrading efforts in this area have been successfully completed, providing a more stable and reliable route for traffic.

# **Township Road 704 Asphalt Overlay**

The asphalt overlay on Township Road 704 is currently in progress. This project includes subgrade preparation in areas where the underlying material has failed, ensuring a smooth and durable road surface for years to come.

# **In-House Surveying**

The department has established in-house surveying, which has proven highly beneficial for Greenview. This new capability allows for more efficient planning and execution of infrastructure projects, leading to cost savings and improved project timelines.

# **Did You Know?**

Greenview is committed to keeping our roads and public spaces safe during winter. Our snowplowing and ice control efforts are guided by Policy 4011 – Snow Clearing and Ice Control of Greenview Roadways and Public Buildings. This policy ensures that our response is both timely and effective, prioritizing key areas to maintain access and safety for all residents. In the event of heavy snowfall, our priorities may shift to ensure that emergency services can continue to operate without interruption. Understanding our snow removal priorities can help you plan and stay safe during winter weather.

# **Snow Removal Priorities:**

- **1. Arterial Roads:** These are major roadways that carry high volumes of traffic and are cleared first to ensure essential movement across the region.
- Local Residential Roads, Seasonal Roads, and Collector Roads: These roads serve neighborhoods and rural areas and are addressed after arterial roads.
- 3. Greenview Walkways, Sidewalks, Parking Lots, and Public Buildings: We focus on ensuring

- public access to facilities and safe pedestrian routes.
- **4. Back Lanes and Other Areas:** These areas are cleared last, as they generally carry less traffic.

# **Snowplowing Triggers:**

- Paved Urban Roadways: Snowplowing begins when snow accumulation reaches a depth of 3-4 cm.
- Rural Arterial Roads and Paved Surfaces: Snowplowing starts when snow accumulation reaches 3 to 6 cm.
- Arterial and Local Roads with Gravel Surfaces: Snowplowing is initiated when snow accumulation reaches 10 to 15 cm.

# **Grande Cache Wastewater Treatment Plant is Making Progress:**

The Grande Cache Wastewater Treatment Plant project is on track for completion in 2025 with significant progress already made. The contractor has successfully poured two clarifiers, constructed the bioreactors, and continues to advance with piping and electrical installations. The new facility has built-in redundancy for key components, ensuring reliable operation. As a vital infrastructure project for Grande Cache, the plant will support future growth and environmental sustainability, utilizing an ultraviolet treatment system as the final stage before treated wastewater is released back into the river.

# **New Battery Recycling Program in Greenview**

Greenview now has new battery recycling boxes available at the following locations:

- DeBolt Public Service Building
- Grovedale Public Service Building
- Grande Cache Public Service Building
- Valleyview Administration Office
- Grande Cache Recreation Centre
- Greenview Regional Multiplex
- Transfer Stations & Landfills in Greenview



Instead of disposing the batteries in the landfill, you can now recycle them using our designated boxes. These boxes are for house batteries, such as AA, AAA, C, D, and 9v batteries. Batteries must be placed in a bag attached to the box, sealed, and placed in the box for recycling. Please be sure to follow the instructions provided at each location to ensure proper recycling.

# **Ridgevalley Water and Lagoon Project Updates**

- Ridgevalley Lagoon Desludging: The desludging project at the Ridgevalley Lagoon has been successfully completed. Two and a half Geotubes were required to contain the removed sludge. Once dried, this sludge will be transported to the Greenview Regional Landfill, where it will be mixed with earth to cover the open landfill pit.
- Lagoon Upgrade Planning: Plans are underway for the Ridgevalley Lagoon upgrade. A receiving stream study will guide the construction methodology and help determine the best options for sewage release and potential ammonia removal. This upgrade is crucial for supporting community growth and stability.
- Water Treatment Plant SCADA Upgrades: The Ridgevalley Water Treatment Plant is also set for significant improvements with SCADA (Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition) upgrades. These are currently in the planning stages, with completion expected by November 2024. The new system will provide 24-hour continuous monitoring, with alarm capabilities to alert staff of potential issues, ensuring that water quality monitoring remains high and meets all legislative requirements.

# STN32 WUI-M Certification:

In June, Greenview Firefighters from DeBolt and Grovedale successfully completed their Wildland Urban Interface Member (WUI-M) training over two weekends of intensive practical and theoretical instruction. This certification equips our crews to deploy sprinkler protection systems swiftly and effectively during wildfires and enhances their ability to combat wildland fires. Additionally, certified members can now be called upon to assist in other regions if needed.

# **STN32 Participated in STARS All-Stars Competition:**

On June 13, 2024, Greenview Station 32 Grovedale had the privilege of participating in the STARS Air Ambulance "All-Stars" Competition. This event allows STARS Paramedics to engage in simulated emergency scenarios, competing against other bases across Western Canada. The winners advance to the World Finals in Salt Lake City, Utah, USA. Station 32 contributed to a realistic river rescue reenactment, working alongside Alberta Conservation, Alberta Health EMS, Grande Prairie Technical Search and Rescue, and the RCMP.

### STN32 Swift Water Technician Certification:

On July 12 - 14, 2024, eight Grovedale firefighters participated in a Swift Water Technician certification course provided by Raven Rescue. This training, held on the Smokey River at MacLeod Flats Recreation Area, was recertification for some, ensuring that 11 Station 32 firefighters are now certified in swift water rescue.

## **STN32 Jet Boat Operator Training:**

From August 9 - 11, 2024, five Grovedale firefighters and six Alberta Conservation Officers from various regions, including Rocky Mountain House, Fort McMurray, Cold Lake, and Grande Prairie, completed Jet Boat Operator certification with Raven Rescue. This ongoing training is crucial as Greenview provides water rescue services across a vast area of Northwest Alberta. The training took place on the Smokey River at MacLeod Flats Recreation Area, utilizing two conservation boats and Grovedale's Outlaw Tomcat LS 6.2 vessel.

# **STN32 Senior Firefighters:**

This summer, Grovedale firefighters Shawna Fedorchuk and Jade Lypkie were honored with the title of "Senior Firefighter." These dedicated volunteers bring invaluable experience, guidance, and professional training in both firefighting and medical services, significantly enhancing leadership during calls and training sessions.

# **STN32 Standard Training Achievements:**

Station 32 is proud to announce the certification of six additional firefighters this year with 1001 Level 1 and Level 2 qualifications, the foundational benchmarks of firefighting. This brings the total number of certified firefighters on the roster to 15. Additionally, four members were certified in April with 1041 Level 1, providing Grovedale with four certified firefighter training instructors for the 1001 curriculum, along with one member who completed the 1403 Live Fire Training, further advancing our station's in-house training capabilities.

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# Grande Cache Animal Licensing & Animal Control Bylaw Policy 801

In Grande Cache, all dogs 4 months or older must be licensed. Licensing your dog is easy and important. A license identifies you as your pet's owner if he or she gets lost. A license provides peace of mind should your dog go missing. Annual Licensing Fees for Dogs, obtained on or before the first day of February in each year are available at the Grande Cache Public Service Building.

We invite you to join us in promoting a culture of responsible pet ownership. This can be accomplished by obtaining a license for your cherished pet, ensuring cleanliness by promptly cleaning up after them, and safeguarding both their safety and others.

Within Animal Control Policy 801, no owner of a dog shall: permit the dog to run at large; chase or bark at a vehicle on a public highway, disturb the quiet of a person, defecate on public or private property, other than the property of its owner; or purse, bite, wound, harass or otherwise assault, a person or animal, whether or not on the property of the owner.

# Greenview completed the Overly Project on Township 704 this summer just north of Valleyview

Overlays have some advantages compared to less costly surface maintenance options. In addition to sealing shallow fatigue cracks, overlays add strength to the existing structure and provide support for heavier loads with less chance of stress failures in the bottom layer of asphalt.



Adding an overlay to an existing asphalt road decreases its width primarily because of the way the new layer is applied and the resulting changes to the road's edges.

### Here is why:

Raised Height at the Edges: When an overlay (a new layer of asphalt) is added, it raises the overall surface of the road. However, the road's edges typically slope or taper off toward the shoulder or adjacent area. As the height increases, the slope at the edges can become steeper, effectively reducing the usable width of the road.

Edge Tapering or Feathering: During the paving process, the edges of the overlay are often "feathered" or tapered to smoothly transition between the new layer and the existing shoulder or drainage area. This tapering gradually narrows the width, especially at the outermost portion of the road, where the overlay thins out.

Overall, while the road's structural width remains the same, the raised surface and tapering at the edges can make the road feel narrower to drivers, effectively reducing the shoulder width.

# **Bale Hauling & Cargo** reminders

Greenview Agricultural Services and Enforcement Services are working together to provide information and assist farmers with vehicle exemption regulations and understand what is and isn't allowed.

Key points from the Department of Transportation Registrars:

- Class 2 Commercial Vehicle under Section 77(1) (b) or Commercial Vehicle contracted with a farmer to haul bales.
- Within 50 km of the load's origin, vehicles can cross highways but cannot transport the load on highways.
- Speed Limit: 80 km/hr.
- The fine is \$810 per improperly secured bale.

# **Outdoor (Storefront) Beautification Grant**

Businesses that are eligible for the Outdoor Storefront Beautification Grant can apply for up to 70% of total project costs up to a maximum of \$5,000.00. The grant will remain open until grant funding has been allocated.

# Greenview Beautification has two (2) streams:

Storefront Stream and Small Business Stream. The difference between the streams is the amount of reimbursement.

Businesses that are eligible for **Storefront Stream** can apply for up to 70% of total project costs up to a maximum of \$5,000.00.

Businesses that are eligible for Small Business Stream can apply for up to 50% of total project costs up to a maximum of \$5,000.00.

### **Eligibility:**

- Must be a small business.
- Must be located within Greenview.
- Must hold a valid Greenview Business License.
- Must plan to use this program for the purpose relating to the exterior or signage of the building.
- Operate a small business on a parcel of land zoned for commercial purposes as per Greenview's Land Use Bylaw.

### **Examples may include:**

- Restoration of exterior finishes and repainting, including murals.
- Planter, hanging baskets, and garden areas, especially in downtown hamlet setting.
- Repair or replacement of storefront windows, patios, and doors.

- Exterior lighting of the building and signage.
- Signage on the front of the business location.
- Replacement of awnings and signs.
- New architectural details, such as entryway features and cornices.
- Addition of patio areas and permanent landscaping elements; and
- Removal of barriers to access for people with disabilities and mobility challenges.

*Note:* The above list is not exhaustive, and other improvements may be considered eligible if they align with the program's objectives and comply with the applicable development regulations.

# **Indoor Beautification Grant**

Business that are eligible for the Indoor Beautification grant can apply for up to 70% of eligible costs, up to a maximum of \$5,000, if your business is located within Greenview and is solely used as a hospitality business. The grant will remain open until funding has been allocated.

Indoor Improvement means enhancing the visual appeal and functionality of a business' interior, focusing on areas like dining spaces, customer service areas, and other public-facing interiors.

To be eligible for reimbursement, no work is to be performed until a Reimbursement Agreement is entered into with Greenview. Work that has commenced prior to Greenview approval is not eligible for reimbursement. Please review the eligibility criteria prior to submitting an application.

### **Eligibility:**

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria to be considered for an indoor beautification grant:

- Must be a small business:
- Must be located within Greenview:
- Must hold a valid Greenview Business License;
- Operate a small business on a parcel of land zoned for commercial purposes as per Greenview's Land Use Bylaw.

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# Residential & Farmland Property Taxes due November 15, 2024

The due date for residential and farmland property taxes is November 15, 2024. Below are several property tax payment options.

Please note that ratepayers should allow at least (3) three business days for their bank to process the payment. All Greenview Offices will be closed on Monday, November 11, 2024, in lieu of Remembrance Day.

Failure to pay your taxes by the deadline will result in an 8% penalty on the unpaid balance of current taxes. A further penalty of 10% will be applied to the unpaid balance of the basic current tax as of January 1, 2025. Any other tax arrears as of January 1, 2025, will have an 18% penalty applied.

# Sign up for the Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP)

The Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP) offers MD of Greenview taxpayers a convenient plan that enables you to pay your property tax in 12 monthly payments (January-December) instead of one annual payment.

You can enroll during any month by submitting the application form before the 20<sup>th</sup> of any month. Just scan the QR code below for the application.

Your payment automatically comes out of your account on the last business day of every month, making budgeting easier and eliminating late penalties. Payment due dates are indicated on your property tax bill.

Monthly payments are calculated by dividing the annual tax levy from the preceding year by twelve (12) for the payment amount for January to May. The monthly payments from June to December will be the amount owing after the new levy is calculated divided by seven (7) months. This will result in a zero balance at the end of the year. You will be notified of the change in payment amount on your tax notice. TIPPS automatically continues from year to year; you only need to enroll once.

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
# Sign out an experience! A Day at the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum
