Council Highlights

March 11, 2025: Area Structure Plans for Hamlets of DeBolt and Ridgevalley/Crooked Creek Adopted by Greenview

In 2023, Greenview hired Invistec Consulting Ltd. to prepare the draft Area Structure Plans (ASP) and assist in engaging local landowners to ensure the future development of these communities were in keeping with the aspirations of local residents and their interests. After nearly two years of drafting, public consultation, Council reviews, and adjustments, these ASPs have been adopted to guide and support future investment in these communities. The hope is these will guide future investors and infrastructure development while maintaining the elements existing residents value and seek to maintain.

The goals of these ASPs are to:

- ▶ Improve recreational opportunities within the surrounding area;
- ▶ Attract local businesses to the area;
- ▶ Preserve and protect environmentally significant areas;
- ▶ Enhance the provision of institutional services; and
- ▶ Preserve the safe and tranquil nature of Ridgevalley and Crooked Creek while encouraging and retaining families in the community.

In order to achieve these goals, the ASP policies address developmental setbacks, diversifying residential development, redeveloping vacant/underutilized lots, locating commercial developments within the ASP boundary, and designating spaces for future parks/trail systems and public infrastructure. March 11, 2025: Grovedale Cemetery Capital Grant Approved

The Grovedale Cemetery Committee submitted a capital grant request in the amount of \$40,465.00 for tree removal at the Grovedale cemetery. This cemetery is owned by Greenview and operated and maintained by the Grovedale Cemetery Committee, a committee appointed by Council. Council approved a capital grant in the amount of \$40,465.00 to the Grovedale Cemetery Committee for tree removal at the Grovedale cemetery, with funds to come from the Community Services Grants budget.

March 11, 2025: Lemonade Day Support Approved to Promote Grovedale Youth Entrepreneurship

Community Futures Grande Prairie and Region is hosting the 2025 Lemonade Day on June 14, 2025, and is expanding the program to Grovedale, Alberta this year to introduce entrepreneurship to kids and give them hands-on experience with running their own businesses through their lemonade stands. Council approved a sponsorship in the amount of \$500.00 to Community Futures Grande Prairie and Region for the 2025 Lemonade Day event on June 14, 2025, in Grovedale, Alberta, with funds to come from the 2025 Community Services Donations and Sponsorships budget.

Land Use Bylaw (LUB) Update

Learn More

Greenview is undertaking a project to update the Land Use Bylaw (LUB) in 2025. Greenview's current LUB was adopted in April 2019, prior to the dissolution of the Town of Grande Cache, which is now a Hamlet within Greenview.

What is Land Use Bylaw?

A Land Use Bylaw is a set of regulations enacted by a municipality to govern how land can be used and developed within a jurisdiction. It also regulates the process of making decisions for various types of development applications. Among other things, it divides the municipality into land use districts and specifies the types of uses that are permitted or discretionary within each district. The Alberta Municipal Government Act requires every municipality in the province to have a Land Use Bylaw. The process of rewriting a Land Use Bylaw is approximately every five to seven years on average. The MD of Greenview's current Land Use Bylaw has been in effect since 2019.

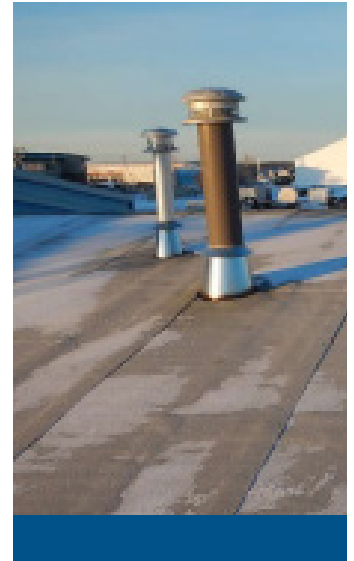
The Land Use Bylaw project includes an in-depth review of the existing Land Use Bylaw, draft Land Use Bylaw writing and review, GIS mapping, public engagement, presentation of findings and direction from The Land Use Bylaw Steering Committee. Supporting work related to the Land Use Bylaw Project includes creating Land Use Bylaw/draft Land Use Bylaw comparison documents, land use district overview information, a refresh of the Planning & Development brochures for public information and assessment of existing Direct Control land use districts.

What is the Land Use Bylaw Steering Committee?

The Land Use Bylaw Steering Committee, formed in November 2024, is made up of Council members and ratepayers. The committee provides direction to Greenview's Planning & Development department and moves the project toward its final draft and approval processes.

The Planning & Development Department recently successfully hosted nine (9) Land Use Bylaw Open Houses in eight (8) locations across the MD of Greenview between January 15 to 26, 2025. Open Houses were held in Ridgevalley, Grovedale, Grande Cache, Sunset House, Valleyview, Little Smoky, DeBolt and New Fish Creek. Attendance included a total of 142 public participants, and feedback was received, reviewed, and presented to the Land Use Bylaw Steering Committee for direction.

Administration will continue to work closely with the Land Use Bylaw Steering Committee until Council approval of the Land Use Bylaw is received. Project information and updates can be found online at Engage Greenview.



Valleyview Field Service Office Roof Replacement

Facility Maintenance determined that the roof of the Field Service Office needed to be replaced due to minor leaks and significant heat loss. The heat loss was identified after hiring a professional who used an infrared camera to assess the extent of the issue. Upon confirming the substantial heat loss, construction on the new roof commenced in September 2024 and was completed in December 2024. The newly installed roof is highly energy-efficient and is expected to provide long-term durability.

Fats, Oils, Grease (F.O.G.), Wipes, and More: The Hidden Culprits Behind Sewer Clogs

Ever had a slow drain or, worse, a sewer backup? The culprit might be hiding in your kitchen or bathroom: fats, oils, grease (F.O.G.), so-called "flushable" wipes, and even hair and hygiene products! These everyday items may seem harmless, but they can lead to expensive plumbing repairs and even damage to Greenview's wastewater system.

The Problem with F.O.G.

Just like cholesterol clogs arteries, F.O.G. creates blockages in the sewer system. When substances like meat fats (think turkey, gravy, bacon, and beef), cooking oils, butter, lard, dairy products, and food scraps are rinsed down the drain, they cool, solidify, and stick to the inside of pipes. Even small amounts from multiple homes or businesses can add up, creating major blockages.

Wipes, Hair & Hygiene Products Hurt Pipes

Many people use "flushable" wipes, believing they're safe to flush. But the truth is, these wipes don't break down like toilet paper and can cause serious clogs in both your pipes and the public wastewater system. Despite their label, there are no strict regulations ensuring they degrade properly in the sewer system. Similarly, hair, dental floss, cotton swabs, and feminine hygiene products can also create plumbing problems. Hair clumps together, trapping grease and soap scum, while dental floss and hygiene products don't dissolve and can worsen blockages.

What's at Stake?

If a sewer issue happens on private property, the homeowner or business owner is responsible for hiring a licensed plumber to identify the problem and covering the cost of repairs. However, if the issue is between the property line and Greenview's main sewer lines

and is NOT caused by improper use (like F.O.G. buildup, wipes, or hygiene products), Greenview will handle the repair costs.

Community Impact

Sewer clogs don't just affect individual homes; they can have a much wider impact on the community. When "flushable" wipes, F.O.G., hair, and hygiene products cause blockages, it doesn't just disrupt plumbing. It can also damage municipal pumping equipment, leading to higher maintenance costs. These costs are often passed on to the entire community, potentially increasing sewer bills for everyone.

Fats, Oils & Grease (F.O.G.)

Preventing sewer clogs starts with proper disposal. Follow these simple steps to keep your plumbing and Greenview's wastewater system running smoothly.

Proper Disposal is Key

Preventing sewer clogs starts with proper disposal. Follow these simple steps to keep your plumbing and Greenview's wastewater system running smoothly.

- ✓ **Cool It:** Let grease and oils cool and solidify in your pan or dish.
- ✓ **Contain It:** Scrape solidified grease, oils, and food scraps into a sealed container (e.g., an old peanut butter jar or yogurt tub).
- ✓ **Trash It:** Dispose of the container and any greasy paper

towels in the garbage, never down the drain.

Wipes, Hair & Hygiene Products

- ✓ **Trash, Not Flush:** "Flushable" wipes don't break down like toilet paper. Always throw them in the garbage.
- ✓ **Use a Drain Catcher:** In showers and sinks, install a hair catcher to prevent buildup before it starts.
- ✓ **Dispose Properly:** Feminine hygiene products, dental floss, and cotton swabs should never be flushed. Always throw them in the trash.

By making small changes in daily habits, we can prevent costly plumbing issues, lower maintenance costs, and protect Greenview's sewer system. Let's all do our part!

Did You Know...Dust Control Program Applications are due by April 15

Greenview's Rural Residential Dust Control Program runs each year from May to June, giving residents and property owners the option to apply for dust control treatment on gravel roads in front of their homes. The dust control agent used in Greenview is Calcium Chloride, which helps reduce dust and improve road conditions.

To take advantage of this program, applications must be submitted by April 15. Late applications may be accepted but are subject to an additional fee, as outlined in the Greenview Schedule of Fees Bylaw. Acceptance of late applications is not guaranteed and depends on product availability, operational priorities, and scheduling.

Roadside Ditch Mowing

Roadside ditch mowing typically starts in June and continues until mid-October. Each year, crews begin in different directions to ensure the program moves through various rural residential areas on a rotating basis. The season finishes along the Forestry Trunk Road.

Road Regravelling Program

Updated Snowplowing Policy for Rural Residential Driveways

Greenview's Policy 4020 – Snowplowing of Rural Residential Driveways has been updated. Visit our website for full details. Some key updates include:

- ▶ Free service eligibility for seniors and residents with disabilities in designated areas, as per Greenview's Schedule of Fees Bylaw
- ▶ Annual registration required, with a sticker placed on the resident's sign for verification
- ▶ Program exclusions now apply to certain high-density rural areas and parcels under 5 acres

Rural Dust Control Program

Following a similar approach to 2024, multiple rural roads have been selected for dust control application. This service prioritizes:

- ▶ Major and minor collector roads
- ▶ Routes to Greenview sites with significant traffic
- ▶ Roads prone to excessive dust, washboards, or requiring frequent maintenance

Grants, Sponsorships & Post-Secondary Scholarship Opportunities

Greenview Council supports applicants pursuing post-secondary education in trades and apprenticeship fields, college, and university.

Degree Program Scholarship

Students enrolled in an integrated course of study leading to an academic degree are eligible for \$2,500 in funding, with \$25,000.00 in dedicated funding allocated annually.

Trade-Diploma Program Scholarships

Students enrolled in a program of study that leads to the granting of a diploma or certificate or involves a trade or apprenticeship program are eligible for \$1,500 in funding, with \$15,000.00 in dedicated funding allocated annually.

The application deadline is **June 30, 2025**.

Investing in Greenview's Roads and Bridges: 2025 Construction & Maintenance Plans

Greenview's Construction and Engineering department is dedicated to maintaining and improving essential infrastructure. From bridge maintenance and road repairs to major construction projects, our team ensures safe, durable, and well-maintained roads for residents, visitors, and industry.

Here's what's planned for the upcoming year:

Major Bridge Construction Projects

As part of Greenview's commitment to sustainable and high-quality infrastructure, three significant bridge construction projects will be posted for tender:

- ▶ **Bridge File 77259** – Sweathouse area, Township Road 691
- ▶ **Bridge File 79118** – Range Road 242, north of Sturgeon Lake
- ▶ **Bridge File 78147** – Tributary to Sturgeon Creek, Township Road 752, north of DeBolt

These projects will ensure safe and reliable transportation across Greenview's road network.

Forestry Trunk Road Upgrades

- ▶ **Overlay Work (KM 0–KM 5):** This overlay will enhance safety and improve travel conditions along this key industrial route. Work will be completed by tendered contractors.
- ▶ **Phase 7 Engineering:** Part of a phased approach to upgrading this vital corridor, this engineering work will prepare the route for future improvements, benefiting both the forestry and oilfield industries.

Township Road 692 Regrade

The stretch from **Highway 40 to the Haul Road** is scheduled for regrading to improve drainage, safety, and durability. This high-traffic section near **Grovedale Fish Pond** will see better accessibility for residents, visitors, and industry alike.

Road Maintenance & Repairs

- ▶ **Spray Patching in 2025** will extend the lifespan of key roadways, including:
 - Ridgevalley area
 - Township Road 713 (near DeBolt)
 - Range Roads 222, 230, 243, 244, & Township Road 700 (near Valleyview)
 - Township Road 704 (Golf Course Road at Sturgeon Lake)
- ▶ Asphalt Milling & Repairs will be completed across Greenview to maintain infrastructure longevity.
- ▶ Crack Sealing & Line Painting will continue as part of annual maintenance on paved roads.

Exploring Cost-Effective Alternatives

To ensure fiscal responsibility while maintaining high-quality roads, Greenview is exploring alternatives to asphalt. SB-90, a durable road surface treatment, will be applied to:

- ▶ **Range Road 230 (Valleyview area)**
- ▶ **Range Road 64 (Grovedale area)**

These roads were initially intended for asphalt and will now receive this hard-structured, maintainable treatment as part of the 2025 season.

Greenview remains committed to investing in infrastructure that enhances quality of life and supports industry growth. Stay tuned for project updates as we continue to build a better-connected community!

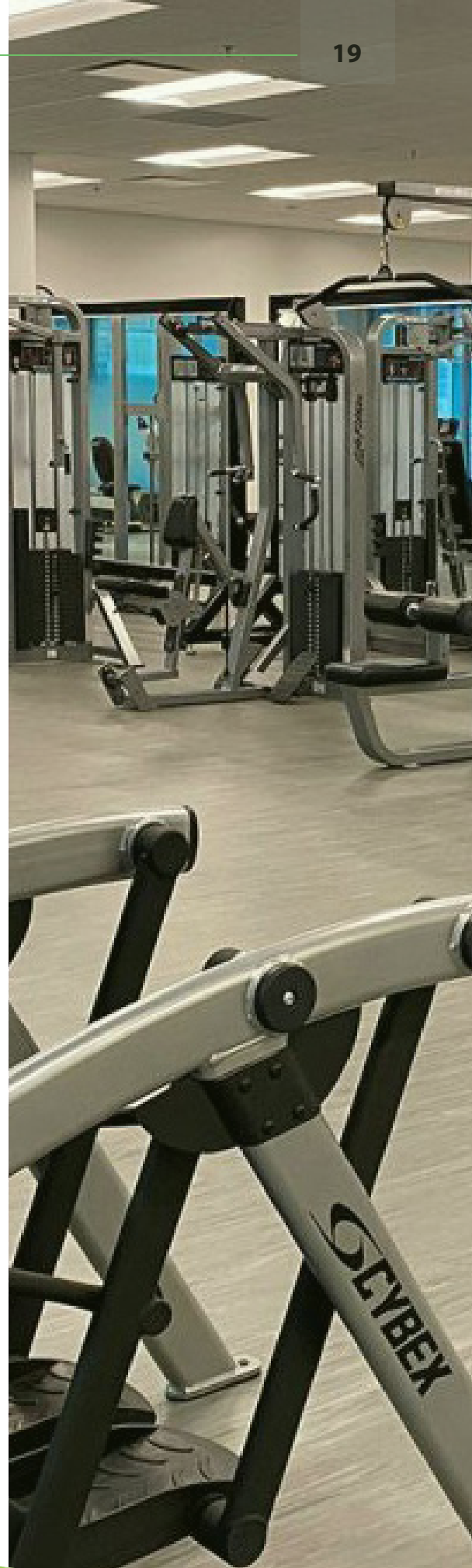
