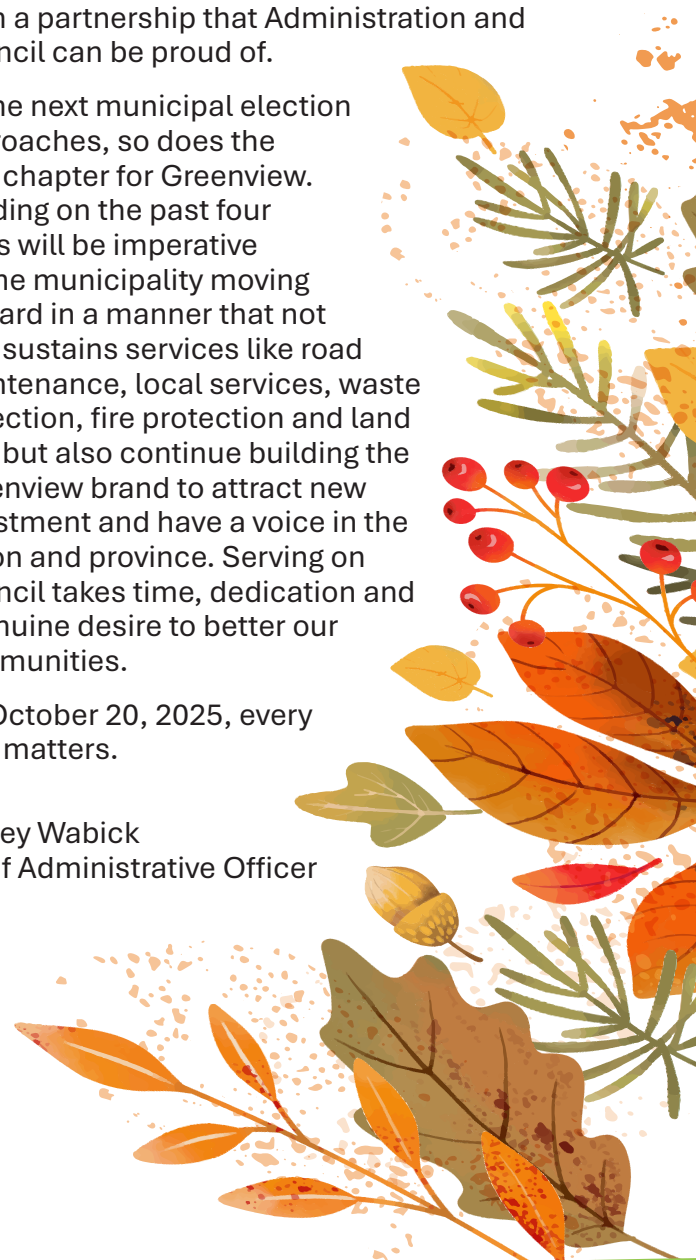
progressive and accountable and it is founded in forming relationships and common ground, internally and externally.

Application for Special Ballot:

An application for Special Ballot may be made to the Returning Officer in writing, by telephone, in person, or by email. Applications for Special Ballots shall be submitted between September 1, 2025, to Monday October 13, 2025 at 4:30 pm. The procedures to be followed for voting by Special Ballot are those procedures set out in the Local Authorities Election Act.

Greenview is divided into 9 electoral divisions (wards). On election day, residents will elect their Municipal Councillor(s) to represent them for the next four years:

- Wards 8 and 9 will elect two Councillors each.
- All other wards will elect one Councillor.

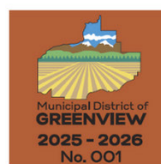

SNOWPLOWING OF RURAL RESIDENTIAL DRIVEWAYS



Residents of Greenview who wish to have their driveways cleared must first enter into a Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement, releasing Greenview, Greenview employees, and agents from any potential liability arising from snowplowing operations on private property. Greenview will not proceed until all documentation is complete. Please be aware that Greenview has recently amended Policy 4020 - Snowplowing of Rural Residential Driveways, and we encourage you to review this policy, which is available on our website.

One of the updates Greenview Council has implemented is that eligible seniors and individuals with disabilities are exempt from all associated service fees. However, they must provide the following documentation to confirm eligibility:

- Seniors must present government-issued photo identification verifying their age and eligibility.
- Individuals with disabilities must provide proof of eligibility, such as a physician's letter or a valid accessible parking placard.

The service remains available for a fee for other eligible residents. The current fee is \$50.00 for the first 400m of driveway and an additional \$25.00 for every 400m section after that. This fee is reviewed annually and set in Greenview's Schedules of Fees Bylaw (also accessible on our website).

Another update to the program is introducing an annual registration process, which includes a colour-coded registration sticker for each winter season. This will help our equipment operators quickly identify registered participants and confirm eligibility on-site. This also gives us a chance to connect with you and for you to inform us of any changes to your yard site so our operators can avoid any hazards.

All eligible residents who would like to participate in the program must sign up annually before the registration deadline on the last Friday of October each year. We will take late registrations, but we may not be able to respond quickly to snow events within 30 days of late registrations. Registering and receiving your sign and registration sticker is free, so we encourage you to sign up as early as possible. To complete a registration form, please visit a Greenview office at the Valleyview Administration Building, or the DeBolt, Grovedale, or Grande Cache Public Service Buildings.

With some exceptions in Policy 4020 under 2.1 (D) and (E), there are also updates to where snowplowing services will no longer be provided. Please refer to the policy for definitions of the following areas where snowplowing services will not be provided:

- Parcels smaller than five (5) acres
- Non-residential properties
- Institutional properties

- High-density subdivisions
- Gated communities
- Hamlets

The snowplowing service is for residential access only; parking areas, granary and hay access, and other areas are not considered driveways and will not be cleared.

Did You Know?

Policy 4011 – Snow Clearing and Ice Control of Greenview Roadways and Public Buildings outlines Greenview's snowplowing response levels. In case of heavy snowfall, priorities may change with emphasis on emergency services.

1. Arterial Roads (major roadways that carry high volumes of traffic).
2. Local Residential Roads, Seasonal Roads, and Collector Roads.
3. Greenview Walkways, Sidewalks, Parking Lots and Public Buildings.
4. Back Lanes and other areas.
5. Rural Residential Driveway Snowplowing

Paved Urban Roadways:

Snowplowing should begin when snow accumulation reaches a depth of 3 to 4 cm.

Rural Arterial Roads and Paved Surfaces:

Snowplowing should begin when snow accumulation reaches a depth of 3 to 6 cm.

Arterial and Local Roads with Gravel Surfaces:

Snowplowing should begin when snow accumulation reaches a depth of 10 to 15 cm.

In Summary:

Eligible residents seeking driveway snow removal services **must apply for or renew a Snowplowing Private Driveway Agreement on an annual basis**, with the **deadline being the last Friday in October**.

New applicants must visit a Greenview Office (Valleyview Administration Building or the DeBolt, Grovedale or Grande Cache Public Service Building) to sign up to receive a one-time Snowplow Request Sign. Applicants are responsible for affixing an annual renewal sticker, which will be issued upon application or renewal, to the bottom left corner of their existing snowplow sign in order to maintain service.

Reminder:

Driveways will be cleared ONLY as time and priorities allow. They will be cleared with snowplowing equipment that is available in the area and most efficient for Greenview's operations.

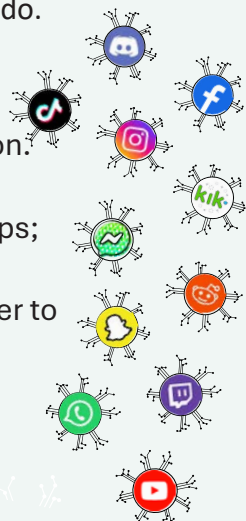

Residential & Farmland Property Taxes Due November 14, 2025

The due date for residential and farmland property taxes is November 14, 2025. Below are several property tax payment options.

Please note that ratepayers should allow at least (3) three business days for their bank to process the payment.

Failure to pay your taxes by the deadline will result in an 8% penalty on the unpaid balance of current taxes. A further penalty of 10% will be applied to the unpaid balance of the basic current tax as of January 1, 2026.

Please record your tax roll number on the cheque and enclose the return portion of your bill. For tax payments, the envelope must be postmarked by Canada Post on or before the due date, otherwise, late payment penalties will be added. Please make cheque payable to: Municipal District of Greenview No. 16

✓ POST-DATED CHEQUES:

Greenview also accepts post-dated cheques. The cheques must be dated for the due date or earlier to avoid penalty. Please record your roll number on the cheque and enclose the return portion of your bill with payment.

Sign up for the Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP)

The Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP) offers MD of Greenview taxpayers a convenient plan that enables you to pay your property tax in 12 monthly payments (January - December) instead of one annual payment.

You can enroll during any month by submitting the application form before the 20th of any month. Just scan the QR code below for the application.

Your payment automatically comes out of your account on the last business day of every month, making budgeting easier and eliminating late penalties. Payment due dates are indicated on your property tax bill.

Monthly payments are calculated by dividing the annual tax levy from the preceding year by twelve (12) for the payment amount for January to May. The monthly payments from June to December will be the amount owing after the new levy is calculated divided by seven (7) months. This will result in a zero balance at the end of the year. You will be notified of the change in payment amount on your tax notice. TIPP automatically continues from year to year; you only need to enroll once.

Bridge Repairs Completed Using Special Equipment

A much-needed upgrade has been completed 38 km northwest of Valleyview, under Range Road 242 in the Crooked Creek/Sturgeon Heights area. The old steel pipe had reached the end of its life and was showing signs of rust, sagging, and wear.

To keep water flowing smoothly into Sturgeon Lake, the old pipe was removed and replaced with a larger, stronger one. Because of the high water levels in the area, crews used special equipment - including an aquadam and pumps - to carefully manage the water and ensure no aquatic life was disturbed during construction.

Even with beaver dams upstream and downstream, the new culvert will continue to keep water moving steadily while providing a safe and lasting improvement for the community.



Testing a Cost-Efficient Alternative to Asphalt

As part of the 2025 budget discussions, Administration introduced trial products aimed at improving gravel road surfaces in a more cost-effective way. These alternatives, already in use in many municipalities and counties, are being tested locally to see how they perform under Greenview's conditions.

Alternative 1: SB-90

This trial product hardens gravel roads to create a surface similar to asphalt while remaining pliable enough for ongoing maintenance. The improved surface provides better dust control and smoother driving conditions—at just a fraction of the cost of traditional paving.

- Trial locations: Range Road 64 (Grovedale) and Township Road 230.



Alternative 2: MG-30

The second product tested was MG-30, a mix of calcium chloride and magnesium hydroxide. Designed for sandy or silty conditions, MG-30 helps reduce dust, stabilize the road base, and minimize aggregate loss.

- Trial location: 2.5 km section of Township Road 692 (west of Highway 666, in the Grovedale area)



These trials will help determine whether alternative surfacing products can provide long-term value for the municipality while keeping roads safer and more comfortable for residents.

Hydrant Flushing Program - Maintaining Our Water System

Did you know Greenview conducts a Hydrant Flushing Program twice a year? Flushing occurs from May to July in the spring and again from September to November in the fall. This routine maintenance helps keep our water system clean, safe, and reliable and ensures hydrants remain fully functional and ready to support firefighting efforts when needed.

Hydrant flushing:

- Clears out sediment and mineral buildup in the water lines
- Ensures hydrants are tested and fully operational in case of emergencies
- Improves water quality and flow across the system
- During flushing, you may notice water running from hydrants or experience temporary water discolouration or reduced pressure. This is normal and will resolve quickly. Running your cold water taps until the water clears will help.

Water Meter Readiness - Tips to Protect Your Meter and Your Wallet

Whether you are heading on vacation or preparing for colder weather, protecting your water meter is an important step to prevent damage and avoid costly repairs.

Here's what you need to know:

- Keep it warm – If your meter is in a crawl space or utility room, ensure the area is insulated and heated. A frozen meter can crack, leak, or stop working.
- Check your heat tape – If your property uses heat tape on pipes or meters, test it before winter. Faulty or unplugged heat tape is one of the most common causes of frozen meters.
- Keep it accessible – Greenview staff must be able to access your meter to read or inspect it safely. Keep the area free of clutter and obstacles.
- Know your responsibility – If a meter fails due to freezing or neglect, the property owner is responsible for the cost of repairs or replacement.

Tip: Add water meter inspection to your seasonal home maintenance checklist, especially before winter arrives.

Spotting Traffic Counters in Greenview

If you've noticed small devices attached to posts around Greenview, you've likely spotted one of our traffic counters. These tools quietly collect valuable data to help shape the future of our roads.

What They Do:

Traffic counters measure axle distance, vehicle weight, speed, and travel direction. From this, we can determine traffic volumes and the types of vehicles using specific roads. This information guides decisions for future road planning, asphalt resurfacing, and other maintenance projects.

Where and When You'll See Them: Traffic counters can be placed on any roadway throughout Greenview. They remain in place for about two weeks to collect accurate data.

Types of Counters:

- **Automatic Counters** – Mounted on posts, like the one pictured.
- **Pneumatic Counters** – Road tubes laid across the pavement.
- **Manual Counts** – A person records traffic by observing and documenting vehicle numbers and types.



Your Privacy Matters:

These counters do not capture video or personal information - only traffic data. By gathering this information, Greenview can plan smarter, maintain roads efficiently, and ensure our transportation network meets the needs of the community.

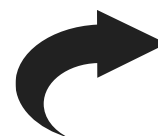
Greenview is seeking community members who are committed to making a positive impact in their communities. Committee members play a vital role in the management, care and development of local cemeteries by:

New Land Use Bylaw Reflects Greenview's Commitment to Residents

After five years of hard work and community consultation, the MD of Greenview is proud to announce the approval of a brand-new Land Use Bylaw (25-1000), officially adopted by Council on July 8, 2025.

This major project was led by Greenview's Planning & Development department and focused on listening to residents, understanding their needs, and creating a fair and balanced approach to land development—both in hamlets and in rural areas.

In 2024, a special committee was formed to guide this process. Made up of elected Council members and residents from across Greenview, the committee helped shape the final bylaw by reviewing proposed updates, supporting community engagement, and ensuring local voices were reflected in the final decisions.

The new bylaw brings many improvements that benefit the public, including:

- Simplified permit processes to make it easier for residents to apply for permits.
- More exemptions for certain developments, reducing red tape for landowners.
- Better support for home-based businesses, helping entrepreneurs thrive.
- Fixes for common problems identified over the past five years.
- More flexible and diverse development options, giving people more choice in how they use their land.

A major part of the work also included fully integrating the Hamlet of Grande Cache into Greenview's land use policies while considering local needs and growth plans.

Overall, this project represents a significant achievement for Greenview. It's a modern, community-driven bylaw designed to serve the public good and guide future development in a way that respects both rural and urban lifestyles.

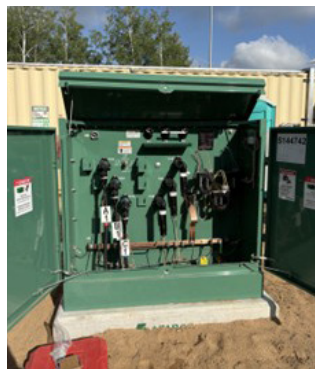

Improved Power Reliability at the Little Smoky Water Point

Until recently, the Little Smoky Water Point operated with only single-phase power from the utility provider, while our equipment required three-phase power. To make this work, the system relied on on-site capacitors to convert the power - an arrangement that was both costly and prone to failure. Capacitors needed replacement about every five years, and unexpected breakdowns risked interrupting water distribution.

Upgrading to a direct three-phase power supply was a major undertaking. Because the main power line runs across a four-lane highway, crews had to drill beneath the road to bring three-phase service to the site.

Now that the upgrade is complete, the water point no longer depends on costly capacitor replacements, and the risk of service disruptions has been greatly reduced. This important investment ensures a more reliable and consistent water supply for the community.



Maskwa Medical Centre

Today, Greenview Council was gifted this special shovel from the Maskwa Medical Center groundbreaking - a symbol of the care, collaboration, and hope this project brings to our communities.

This new medical center will mean better access to healthcare close to home, and opportunities to grow and train the next generation of healthcare professionals right here in the north.

We're proud to stand alongside our municipal partners, healthcare leaders, and educators as we take this powerful step forward.



Grande Cache Wastewater Treatment Plant - Mid Year Update

The Grande Cache Wastewater Treatment Plant is entering its final stages of construction, with staged commissioning (the testing and start-up of the facility) expected to begin this fall. Recent work has focused on interior finishing, testing equipment, and reducing waterline pressure feeding the site.

A major milestone nearing completion is the new Septage Receiving Station. This facility will allow commercial septic haulers to safely dispose of waste directly into the treatment system, helping extend the existing infrastructure's life and improve environmental protection for rural wastewater.

Trucks using the current or new septage station will now travel via Water Treatment Plant Road (100 Street) to improve safety and protect local roads. Fireman's Pit Road will no longer be used as a permitted route, which will help reduce heavy truck traffic on Hoppe Avenue.



Across the site, crews have been installing mechanical systems, completing heating and ventilation work, finalizing wiring in the pump room, and advancing civil work on the treated wastewater outfall. Cleanup and finishing touches are underway as the facility prepares for commissioning later this year.

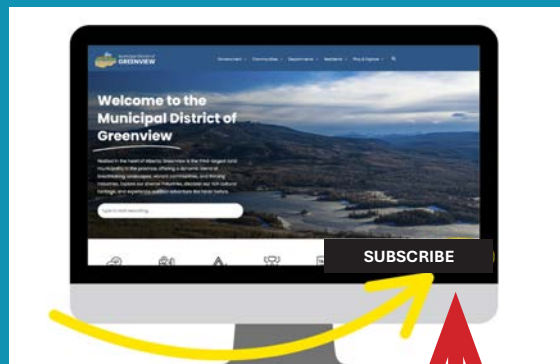

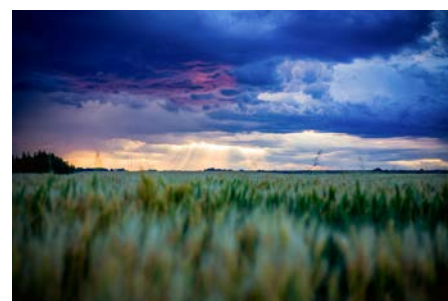

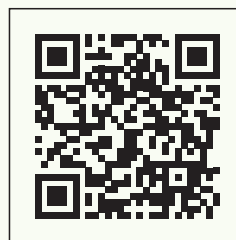
