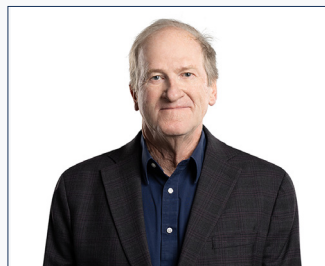

Greenview Council Adopts Interim 2026 Operating & Capital Budgets

Council deliberated the 2026 budget over three days in November and approved the 2026 interim operating budget and 2026 capital budget at the December 9, 2025, Regular Council Meeting.

Budget 2026, which is once again a balanced budget, will be finalized pending the completion of property assessment values, provincial requisitions collected on behalf of the Government of Alberta, and seniors' funding requisitions. The 2026 Capital budget allows for infrastructure costs for roads, bridges, utilities, equipment, and buildings and includes \$40.14 million in new commitments. The interim budget covers day-to-day operating expenses and allows projects to proceed until the final budget is approved in the spring. Council will also set tax rates in the spring of 2026, with no forecasted mill rate increase.

What Do They Do?

The Construction & Engineering Department will place construction signage at the sites of upcoming 2026 projects once the budget has been approved. In the meantime, Administration is actively preparing contracts for the 2026 construction season.

Highway 40 Twinning Project Completed South of Grande Prairie

Grande Prairie, AB – The MD of Greenview and the County of Grande Prairie, with the support of the City of Grande Prairie, joined Minister of Transportation and Economic Corridors Devin Dreeshen, MLA for Grande Prairie-Wapiti Ron Wiebe, and MLA for Grande Prairie Nolan Dyck, today for a ribboncutting ceremony to celebrate the completion of the Highway 40 twinning project south of Grande Prairie. This provincially led infrastructure initiative, supported by local municipalities, enhances safety, reduces congestion, and fosters economic growth for both industry and communities across the region.

“Highway 40 is a vital economic corridor that connects families, workers, and industry across northern Alberta. Our government committed \$168 million to complete this twinning project which sees a daily traffic count of 4,300 vehicles per day. Investments like this strengthen our province’s transportation network and keep Alberta’s communities connected for decades to come.”

To accelerate this project, the MD of Greenview and the County of Grande Prairie worked collaboratively to approve a historical cost-sharing agreement with Alberta’s government in 2020. The project involved twinning approximately 19 kilometres of Highway 40, including the construction of a new Wapiti River Bridge with a pedestrian underpass, intersection improvements, LED lighting, and traffic signals.

These upgrades will improve traffic flow and reduce collision risks on one of Alberta’s busiest industrial corridors.

Hot Water Tank Maintenance – A Simple Step to Improve Water Quality at Home

Did you know that many water quality complaints, such as cloudy water, odours, or unusual tastes, are often caused by the hot water tank, not the municipal water supply? Over time, sediment can accumulate at the bottom of your hot water tank, particularly in older units. This sediment becomes stirred up whenever the tank heats, which can affect the water coming from your hot taps.

- **KNOW THE DIFFERENCE**

Greenview supplies cold potable water only. If water concerns are occurring only on the hot-water side, the issue is almost always related to the hot water tank or internal plumbing.

- **FLUSH YOUR HOT WATER TANK ONCE A YEAR**

Sediment buildup is normal, but flushing helps keep your tank running efficiently and improves the quality of your hot water. If you are unsure how to complete this safely, a licensed plumber can assist.

- **CHECK YOUR TANK'S AGE**

Most hot water tanks last 8 to 12 years. Older tanks may produce more sediment or experience heating issues.

If concerns appear to be related to your cold-water supply, please contact Environmental Services Utilities on call at 780-524-4825 or 780-827-1408 in the Grande Cache area for guidance. If issues are limited to your hot water, it is recommended that you reach out to a licensed plumber for maintenance or inspection.

Wastewater vs Stormwater: What's the Difference?

Many homeowners are surprised to learn that stormwater and wastewater are handled by different systems and understanding how they work can help protect both your property and the environment.

Wastewater: What It Is and Where It Goes

Wastewater is generated from everyday household activities like flushing toilets, taking showers, washing dishes, or doing laundry. It is transported through sewer pipes to a wastewater treatment plant, where it's cleaned and disinfected before being released safely into the environment.

In rural or un-serviced areas, many homes aren't connected to municipal sewer systems. Instead, they use septic tanks, which collect and partially treat household wastewater. When these tanks fill up, they need to be emptied by a septic truck, which transports the wastewater to a municipal lagoon or approved treatment facility for safe disposal and treatment.

Whether it's piped in or trucked in, all wastewater must be properly treated to protect public health and local ecosystems.

What Is Stormwater?

Stormwater comes from rain or snowmelt. It flows over lawns, roads, and driveways into storm drains, roadside ditches, and culverts, often draining directly into nearby creeks, rivers, and lakes without treatment. The final point where this water enters the environment is called an outfall. That means anything that washed into a storm drain- from trash to motor oil- ends up in a natural waterway at the outfall. Stormwater pollution can harm fish, wildlife, and impact water quality.

What NOT To Do

Never dump chemicals, oils, paints, grease, or sewage into storm drains, ditches, or overland. These lead directly to outfalls and into the environment.

Do not connect sump pumps or foundation drains to the sanitary sewer. This overloads the system and can cause backups or overflows. Instead, discharge sump water overland into grass or garden areas.

Septic tanks should only be emptied by licensed haulers and never emptied into storm drains or ditches.

How You Can Help Protect Local Waterways

- Direct downspouts and sump pumps into lawns or gardens to filter water naturally.
- Use rain barrels or rain gardens to capture runoff.
- Dispose of hazardous products at approved facilities.
- Clean up pet waste and yard debris and keep ditches clear of litter.

Remember

Wastewater is treated. Stormwater is not. Whether your home uses a sewer system or a septic tank, your actions impact the water flowing into our community's rivers, lakes, and nearby outfalls. Let's work together to keep our waterways clean and safe.

Shelterbelt Tree Program Returns for 2026

Greenview's Agricultural Services Department is pleased to announce the return of the Shelterbelt Tree Program for 2026 - and this year brings a few exciting updates for residents.

What's New This Year

Beginning January 2, 2026, Greenview residents can place their tree orders earlier than ever. We are also introducing a brand-new option: the "Berry Bunch" package, designed for those looking to add variety and edible landscaping to their properties.

Program Details

- **Pricing:** Seedlings remain affordable at \$1.90 each, sold by bundle (except for landscape seedlings and the new Berry Bunch package).
- **Pickup Date:** Orders will be available for pickup on May 28, 2026.
- **Availability:** All orders are processed on a first-come, first-served basis, and species availability updates will be shared regularly on Greenview's website and Facebook page.

Eligibility:

- This program is open exclusively to Greenview residents.

How to Order:

- Payment is due at the time of ordering and can be made by debit or cheque. Orders are accepted Monday to Friday, 8:00 am – 4:30 pm (closed from 12:00–1:00 pm) at any of the following locations:

Dust Control

Dust Control offers Greenview residents and property owners the opportunity to apply for dust control on rural roads in front of residences. Dust control involves the application of a dust control agent to gravel roads to minimize dust. The residential program typically runs from late May to early June of each year, weather permitting. Application forms can be found on Greenview's website: mdgreenview.ab.ca/departments/operations-services/dust-control/.

Have You Seen Traffic Counters on Greenview Roads?

You may have noticed small devices attached to posts along local roads. These are traffic counters, and they play an important role in planning and maintaining Greenview's road network.

What Do They Do?

Traffic counters collect data on:

- **Traffic volumes** – how many vehicles use the roadway.
- **Vehicle types** – cars, trucks, etc.
- **Speed and direction** – how fast vehicles travel and which way they're going.
- **Axle spacing and weight** – for understanding road wear.

These devices use wireless technology and run on batteries that last about two weeks. After the monitoring period, staff retrieve the counters and upload the data for analysis.

Why Is This Important?

The information helps Greenview:

- Plan future road improvements.
- Schedule asphalt and maintenance work.
- Make informed decisions about infrastructure needs.

Where and When Are They Installed?

Traffic counters can appear on any roadway in Greenview. They are typically installed for two weeks at a time to collect data.

Privacy Matters

These devices do not record video or personal details. They only capture numerical data about vehicle movement - nothing more.

How is Traffic Count Calculated?

Example:

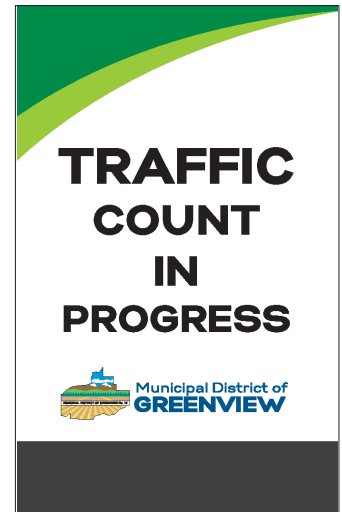
- Counters record 540 vehicles over 14 days.
- Average daily traffic = 38 vehicles per day.

Ongoing Data Collection

Greenview began collecting roadway data in 2023 and expands the program each year:

- 2023: 18 roadways
- 2024: 40 roadways
- 2025: 64 roadways

This growing dataset ensures better planning and safer roads for everyone.



Reminder: 2026 Dog License Renewals

A pet license is more than a simple tag - it's their safe passage back to you. All dogs must be licensed under the Animal Control Bylaw.

This is a reminder that your animal license is valid until December 31 of each year. The license year begins on January 1 and ends December 31 of that year.

In Grande Cache, all dogs 6 months or older must be licensed. Licensing your dog is easy and important. A license identifies you as your pet's owner if he or she gets lost. A license provides peace of mind should your dog go missing.

Annual Licensing Fees for Dogs, obtained **on or before the first day of February in each year** are available at the Grande Cache Public Service Building.



We encourage everyone to help promote a culture of responsible pet ownership. You can support this by licensing your dog, cleaning up after them, and taking steps that protect their safety and the safety of others.

KEEPING OF DOGS – HAMLET OF GRANDE CACHE

Per Bylaw: <https://mdgreenview.ab.ca/wp-content/uploads/2025/06/Bylaw-25-991-Animal-Control.pdf>

- All Dogs, six (6) months and older, residing within the Hamlet of Grande Cache are required to be licensed.
- A license must be purchased from Greenview annually pursuant to all the fees as set out in the Schedule of Fees.
- The license year shall commence on the first (1) day of January every year and shall terminate on the thirty-first (31) day of December of that year.
- An Owner of a Dog shall ensure that the license is secured to the Dog by means of a collar or harness when the Dog is off the premises of the Owner.
- The fees associated with obtaining a Dog license tag shall be outlined in the Schedule of Fees.
- Notwithstanding section 3.1, an Owner of a Guide Dog or Service Dog, as well as, an Owner over the age of 65 or residing in a Lodge or Assisted Living Facility, is not required to pay a fee for a license under this bylaw. However, they are required to apply for a license for registration purposes.

Please make arrangements at the Grande Cache Public Service Building (located at 10002 Shand Avenue, Grande Cache, AB) to have your animal's license renewed for the 2026 year.

The following fees apply as per Schedule of Fees Bylaw:

Female dog \$30.00 | Male dog \$30.00 | Spayed or neutered dog \$20.00

For animal licenses renewed after February 1, 2026, a \$10.00 penalty will be added in addition to the fees prescribed above. Replacement cost for lost tags is \$5.00.



Winter Safety Reminder

Winter is in full swing, when ice and snow can make sidewalks, parking lots, and entrances to public buildings — including the Greenview Regional Multiplex - slippery. Please take extra care when walking outside and be aware of potentially icy spots.

A few simple precautions can help prevent slips and falls:

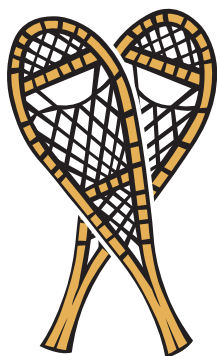

Construction & Engineering Q & A

Q: Can I construct a fence right on my property line?

A: Greenview Development Guidelines and Municipal Servicing Standards state that any fence installed on a property must be 1ft inside of the property line, whether it be in the rural or the hamlet areas.

Q: Where are tenders advertised for Greenview's construction projects?

A: If you are looking to bid on construction projects for Greenview, check out Bids & Tenders and Alberta Purchasing Connection. Sign up for free and see all the construction opportunities in the province. <https://mdgreenview.ab.ca/government/open-tenders/>

Q: Does Greenview have its own land surveyor?

A: Greenview has one internal surveyor who may be seen working on road rights-of-way, hamlet rights-of-way, and undeveloped road rights-of-way. This is to collect information for future consideration for construction or maintenance required.

Q: Does Greenview buy land from landowners?

A: Yes, Greenview does purchase land from landowners when necessary for municipal projects, such as expanding a ditch where additional space is required. All land acquisitions are conducted in accordance with the Approved Schedule of Fees Bylaw, as outlined on the Greenview website. Land sold along municipal roadways is incorporated into the official road plan and registered with Alberta Land Titles.

Q: How do I get an approach or another approach?

A: Applications for road access approaches must be submitted to the Planning & Development Department. Each application is evaluated for compliance with Municipal Policy 4001 for Road Access Approaches. Approval is contingent upon meeting all policy requirements. Upon approval, a construction fee is payable in accordance with the Approved Schedule of Fees Bylaw before construction may commence. If an application does not meet policy criteria, it is referred to Council for review and decision. In such cases, the construction fee is still required prior to the start of construction.

As repairing/restoring the existing signs was not recommended, a decision was made to move forward with investing in new Hamlet signs that match the style used throughout Greenview. This approach keeps our signage professional and consistent across all communities within the municipality.

The new signs not only enhance the visual appeal of Grande Cache but also reinforce a sense of unity across all Hamlets in Greenview. The upgrade reflects our ongoing commitment to maintaining welcoming and attractive community entrances that residents can take pride in.



KNOW THE RULES FOR OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLES (OHV'S)

✓ WHY THIS MATTERS:

Recent reports show unsafe OHV use in Greenview lakeside communities and Hamlets, including minors driving, lack of helmets, illegal parking, and disregard for traffic laws. These actions put everyone at risk and violate municipal bylaws and the Traffic Safety Act.

✓ LEGAL REQUIREMENTS FOR OHV USE:

- All OHVs must have a valid certificate of registration, valid insurance and display a license plate.
- The minimum age for operating off-highway vehicles on public land or highways is 14 years, where permitted. If you are younger than 14 years, you may operate on public land with supervision by someone 18 years of age or older who is either on the same off-highway vehicle or in close proximity. If operating on private property, no age restriction applies
- Helmets are mandatory for all riders
- Passengers must be seated safely—no standing or unsecured positions.
- Proper lighting is required from dusk to dawn.
- Obey all traffic laws, including speed limits and yielding to traffic.
- No towing boats, tubes, or sleighs with children on public roads.

✓ CONSEQUENCES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE:

- Fines and penalties
- Liability for accidents
- Possible impoundment of off-highway vehicles

✓ DID YOU KNOW?

- Most OHV accidents involve minors or a lack of safety gear.
- Illegal OHV use can block emergency access and endanger lives.
